"Focus:-

As a former pupil of Ysgol Abersoch (1949-53) I am extremely dismayed to learn that its closure is even being considered. I am also proud to be the granddaughter of a Founder Governor (Capt. John Williams) and an Aunt to the current Chairperson of the Board of Governors.

Apart from the educational and strategic importance of a local primary school, which will be covered by many others in this consultation, I wish to draw attention to its historic significance and why it is clearly imperative that it remains an ongoing Primary School for our Local Children.

We should, most especially at this time, be earnestly directing all involved in this consultation to include in their focus the values of a cultural heritage and thus also the *origins* of Ysgol Abersoch.

It is the foresight and the fine intentions of those people whose benevolent and selfless actions began, and then completed our Primary School, - and also the Village Hall among other benefits, - that deserve our close scrutiny.

Their good will, and indeed their financial and practical contributions, are those very foundations, - the likes of which give birth to real and lasting, truly established, Village Communities in Wales.

It was two philanthropic families who commenced the creation of Ysgol Abersoch, recognising the immense importance of having a Welsh Primary School situated in the heart and centre of a Welsh Village Community.

It was the (strictly non-drinking) Winterbottom family who first purchased the land, which they saw would become, in time, at the very centre of Abersoch Village.

They then built the Village Hall and, together with the Minoprio family, went on to build the School itself. It was one Minoprio brother who financed the building entirely, while his younger brother contributed to the designing of the building and also involved himself personally in the actual construction work. The same family, among other things, gave us the original breakwater in Pen y Cei and donated a stretch of Morfa Abersoch for community use.

The design and structure of the School building is unique to our Village and more than attractive, being fashioned from wood. The most pleasing shape of the facade was beautifully highlighted, this Christmas of 2020, by the decorative, festive lighting that had been thoughtfully added to the front elevation.


Gwynedd Council Members, above all citizens, should be very aware of the historical value and the preservation needs of an attractive, as well as a necessary, utilitarian construction that, having been established in 1924, is now approaching a hundred years old.

For all of the above reasons, as well as the imperative duty we have regarding the importance of Primary, formative Welsh Education to our present, and for their future generations of local, Village children, Ysgol Abersoch MUST FLOURISH, and not, for one second, be considered for closure to "save money".

The post office closed to be replaced as a small counter in Londis. The hair dressers went because the rent was so high. There's no bank just a cash machine. High street brand shops came and went. I feel that this community has suffered enough especially Linda Jones the head mistress that has sadly lost two members of her family in the past year. The threat of closure of Ysgol Abersoch to Linda Jones and the rest of the families must be so stressed out something they don't need especially in these uncertain times.

There's very little of the old Abersoch left the school is a focal point of the village it would be such a tragic mistake to take the heart of this village away.

I write to express my concern and distress at the plans to close Abersoch Village School. Firstly, on a personal level, my family through the generations from my father down to my grandchildren, have all benefited from attending the school and I will only believe that it has provided an excellent grounding for the children of the locality. I understand that the number of pupils has dwindled in recent years but now numbers are increasing and an attempt to shut down this well located school, with such excellent facilities, both within its well maintained building and close at hand, in this catchment area where such numerous children are coming up to entry age is difficult to comprehend. The opportunity to walk to school is clearly beneficial for many reasons, and to close this school would deny a number of children this. What about increasing costs of transporting children to schools further afield and the environmental impact? Not all families have cars available.

I believe the recently organised activity groups are proving successful, adding to the value of the school to the village and surrounding area. It has consistently succeeded to prepare children well as they go forward with an excellent knowledge of our Welsh language whether from Welsh or English families.

To lose this precious school, Ysgol Abersoch, in my view would be tragic, for the sake of the language and culture of our village apart from anything else, Pupil numbers are rising and once lost, how would we ever regain our historic school?

Dear Gwynedd Council,

I would like to reach out to you and ask you to seriously reconsider your current position on closing Ysgol Abersoch. I ask this not just as someone who has a number of business in the village but also because for the past 50 years I have visited Abersoch as a holiday maker and as part of my work.

I have seen friends, current residents and many of those who now work in Abersoch and have got their own children at the school develop and flourish. I am sure Sarn Bach school is also an excellent facility however I would like to reach out further to you and explain why I think Ysgol Abersoch should remain open.

- With two business in the village both past, current and future landlords require a junior school that is convenient for the life style those business have to lead. The ability for children to walk safely to school and back home at the end of the day is crucial to how we operate our business.
- The independence this gives every child as they get older is invaluable in their maturity for young children prior to the start of secondary school.
- As a previous governor of the Ryleys school in Alderley Edge, I also see the huge benefit such a small school has on nurturing young children. Not just the level of independence they get but more importantly the chance to have a voice and not be lost.
- The sense of community it brings to the locals and the loss to the community as a whole if it closes.
- I am fully aware of the additional cost to the council in keeping small schools open, not only across Wales but across the country. However, now more than ever our children's education should be paramount in the council strategic direction, regardless of the issues of budgets. We are already talking about a lost generation when it comes to education for what will be nearly a full academic year in some form of shut down.
- Looking after and supporting those in education under the age of 11 years surely has to now be a priority and one that despite current plans to close the school in August 2021 should surely be put on hold and for the residents of Abersoch and their children to be offered the education they deserve and an education that the teachers at Ysgol Abersoch have been delivering for generations.

As a business leader, I am aware of the financial burden we all face. I am also aware that we must look at all our business and look to make some tough decisions. Gwynedd Council, like a school is a business and it must run to budget. I am also acutely aware of the so called "low hanging fruit" that is easier to go after to save on budgets and bring costs down. However, like we have done, we have looked at the long term stability of our business and invested for the long term by making sure the business we have are supported for the long term benefit of the workers, residents and consumers. I see Ysgol Abersoch as something that is worth investing in long term rather than short term.

Abersoch as you will know is a village that is attracting more families and therefore children to move too as their primary home rather than a holiday destination. As business start to thrive again they see a year round opportunity and with that brings investment, permanent residents and therefore more children to educate. I would urge you to at the very least put all plans on hold until further notice and proven evidence that this school can thrive once again and continue the importance of the Welsh language. As a non-Welsh speaker and with 33 business across North

Wales I fully respect and appreciate the importance of the Welsh language for all who frequent them. It would be a great shame to lose that!

Closing the school now I think is sort term thinking with long term damage to children's education, freedom, and sense of purpose and in addition jobs for the area.

I would be delighted to help in any other way I can and more than anything I would like to see Ysgol Abersoch opening it's doors once again in September 2021 for the next generation of Abersoch residents to be educated in the manor that they have become accustomed.

Village schools need to be preserved and invested in, in order to offer education to all, and to save children from having to travel further from the centre of the village, than they need too. The school offers a nurturing environment, I've seen it first hand with my niece and nephew, they are taught to be independent thinkers. It seems the threat of shutting down shrouds the school and this is also against the communities will, and the community is who the council serves. This impending uncertainty will negatively effect the children's education and emotional well being, causing insecurity and the ability of the school, to recruit, I heard that Llanbedrog was able to accept 19 extra students over their capacity, when ordinarily they could have joined the Ysgol Abersoch if it wasn't for the uncertainty caused by the threat of closure, which is just not fair. Its not just shutting a school you are closing the door on potential learning. This is a time when we see that cuts to our infrastructure highlighted by Covid are causing problems all over the UK, within the health care systems, councils and education. Also it has been requested that the school goes up to year 4, so it can offer longer learning, but this question has not been answered, so can you please answer. Could the school be allowed to educate up to year 4? I am an educator in Hull teaching degree students and I see time and time again the difference in confidence of children educated within smaller class sizes compared to larger schools. This is a great opportunity to conserve history while embracing and investing in the future, which are the children and teaching that embraces learning on a personal level, rather than pupil's becoming lost in large class sizes, I think now is the time to be progressive, through also protecting the past within the teaching of Welsh language and heritage.

To whom it may concern. I'm contacting you again to further express my support and mention a few concerns regarding the excellent Ysgol Abersoch.

Firstly can I say that I'm once again stunned and surprised to hear that you are continuing in your frankly anti-democratic course of trying to close the school.

I want to draw your attention to my areas of concern which include

1. The social impact of closure of the school on the village.
2. The loss of a vital resource of village life.
3. The fact that closure flies in the face of the recent Gwynedd council survey re second/ holiday home ownership.
4. The over subscription of nearby schools which will have extra pressure placed on them when in fact they need Ysgol Abersoch's capacity.
5. Suggestions to even increase capacity.

To address each of my concerns as follows.

1. Social impact.

This is an area that I have personnel experience of. I have a friend who has children at the school. When we moved to live here we spoken to her re learning Welsh. This was important to us as we wanted to support the Welsh language and as we are expecting a first grandchild we felt that requirement to learn even greater. When we started the lessons in Abersoch village hall we would often hear the children in the main hall. We loved to hear their chatter in Welsh trying to recognise the occasional word. As our learning progressed on occasion we were even able to converse with the children. This was so rewarding to both sides. It increased our confidence and I felt the children gain something to.

1. The schools importance as a resource is also evident but perhaps not fully appreciated when they can be seen going around the village either singing carols at Christmas ,holding outdoor classes on the beach or indeed visiting elderly residents thru coffee mornings. In fact it's recently been recognised that interaction between young children and elderly persons is enormously beneficial. Indeed as the local elderly welsh residents often speak little English the children are a godsend. So the loss of the school would be felt throughout Abersoch village and beyond. We would really miss these mini Ambassadors of the Welsh language.
2. I have recently received a survey regarding second/holiday homes. The survey highlighted the impact of such on local resources including the school. This would suggest that the local council recognise that the school closure would be a tragedy and have a massive negative impact.I'm sure I recall one question being about the use of monies collected from such homes.can I ask where such money goes and Might I suggest that as well supporting affordable housing you could use it to support Ysgol Abersoch.
3. I'm also aware that llanbedrog school is oversubscribed by 19 pupils. I'm also aware that this year in Abersoch village we had at least 10 new babies born. The fact that llanbedrog is oversubscribed

- would suggest that it's already under extreme pressure and any closure would only adversely affect the school. Surely the above makes the strongest case to keep the school open.
4. Indeed the above would also support the argument that the school increase its age coverage from year 3 to include year 4. This has multiple benefits allowing for increased scope of teaching and allowing a more mature student to progress onwards to their next school.

Ysgol Abersoch forms in my opinion the centre of the wheel of village life. It allows parents who don't drive easy access as well as a vital meeting point for single parents. It's well documented the benefits of such with regard to family finances and mental health. If the school was to close how might I ask would these single parents who don't drive on low income get the children to a school miles away. Indeed if pupils age 3, who attend between 9am-11am, continue as such how would they get there, who would pay the extra travel costs(which if ascribed to the family increase financial burdens) and would they need chaperones.

Also at this time of global concerns re COVID should we be progressing this closure. Any concerned parties can't meet effectively to either discuss concerns or generate support, without risking breaching guidelines. In my opinion to continue this process at this time is oppressive against freedom of speech and effective representation. This would only lead to lengthy appeals and further delays and anguish.

On a personal note I would be devastated if the school closed. As I've said I'm expecting a grandchild and was hoping to enrol him for some preschool/nursery classes. So it's closure would directly impact me and my family.

Dear Sir/ Madam

The proposal to close Ysgol Abersoch on the 31st of August 2021 deeply concerns me as a parent, because my son, [REDACTED], who is only 2 and a half years old goes to Ysgol Abersoch to meet his friends and teachers.

[REDACTED] has been going to Ysgol Abersoch, since he was just over 18 months old where he first met his friends at the Ti a Fi Cylch, where I also attended and spent time with him and other parents too.

The opportunity for [REDACTED] and myself to use this service meant a great deal to both of us, as I am a single mother and do not get to interact as much with other adults. [REDACTED] is an only child too, and does not interact with other children at home.

The Ti a Fi Cylch meant that we could both establish relationships with other people and children, which I believe is essential for [REDACTED]'s wellbeing and normal development as a child. This enables him to learn how to interact with other children and handle difficult feelings, like shyness and also sharing and treating others with kindness. This is vital for early learning as it sets the foundation on which he will grow upon.

As [REDACTED] grew, he was able to join the Cylch Meithrin where his friends also attend. This has given [REDACTED] stability and has given him the reliability and assurance of a routine.

I believe stability and routine are vital to my child's wellbeing, especially during these times of the pandemic. Taking this away from my child allows room for disorientation and chaos, which will hinder his ongoing development.

At Ysgol Abersoch, [REDACTED] has learnt some of the most important skills needed, for example, how to speak, and how to count. The time spent at the Cylch Meithrin has given [REDACTED] the opportunity to further develop his Welsh speaking skills, identify colours, facial expressions in other children, and work on his fine motor skills.

Closing this school will have a big negative impact on my son's development.

Comments:

Ysgol Abersoch has been an important place for two generations of my family. It has provided education of a superbly high quality for one of my sons and up until last year, my grand-daughter attended and was very happy there. Both of them learnt Welsh from scratch there.

I was impressed with the gentle, yet thorough way that my son was taught Welsh. By the time he moved up to Sarn Bach he had an excellent foundation and the teachers at both schools were happy with his ability. He was very lucky to experience such a beneficial pupil-teacher ratio as he did at the school. I've often thought that the attention that the children are able to receive at Ysgol Abersoch is of a standard usually only available to pupils in private schools.

The school is essential to the village of Abersoch. The constant presence of parents and children converging there serves to give a reminder that there is a community of people who live here, in addition to the people that come and go on holiday throughout the year.

Without a school in Abersoch, there would be significantly less evidence that the Welsh language is being spoken in everyday circumstances. This is particularly pertinent to Abersoch as a primary holiday destination.

Re Abersoch School

I am writing to your good selves to raise my concern regarding the proposed closure of Abersoch School. I myself went to this school and I feel that I must write to you to plead that you do not close it. Even though you see it as a small community school, it plays a much bigger part in the heart of the community. Local younger children get the opportunity to go to school on a smaller scale before going to Sarn Bach School. They get to understand the concept of school without it being a chore and without making it look like a big step in their lives. When the time comes for them to move to Sarn Bach it is a much easier transition for them.

I feel that the pupils who attend this school are very privileged in that they are able to have more intense lessons if you like, as there is a smaller amount in each class, the teacher would be able to give each pupil their time and they may be able to pinpoint a problem much quicker than if the teacher had to concentrate on say 20 or more pupils at any one time. By having smaller classes, the teacher is able to see each child's progression and learning capacity on a much higher level. I think this is such an advantage for children and would think that it would be a key elementary fact to keeping a school like this open. You only have to look at their excellent teaching and academic record to prove this point.

We have tried as a community to sustain the future of the school by making it possible to hold a Cylch Meithrin and a Ti a Fi Group at the school; where the future pupils and their parents can see how the school is run and what excellent teaching they have there.

The school is located in the centre of the village. Parents are able to walk their children to school. The school, because of its location, are able to take the pupils out for walks and outings to see the various things that are on offer around the village. How many schools are able to do this? Not many. They are able to see the wild nature that we have around, learn so many things without being in a lesson format.

It is such a shame that you feel that Abersoch School does not give each and every local child an excellent opportunity for their first impression of school life. I hope that you will reconsider any motion that you have to close the school and maybe just take the time of calling in and see how this absolutely brilliant little school works for us as a community and how it would be shameful to close it.

Maybe you need to be reminded of these policies and goals, as extracted below:

Rural education action plan

If we ensure that learners and schools in rural Wales have the right support to succeed, then we can ensure that our rural communities and economy will go from strength to strength.

We are strengthening the School Organisation Code in respect of a presumption against the closure of rural schools.

This Government's commitment to raising education standards in rural areas remains unwavering. Every learner in Wales, wherever they live, has the right to benefit from high-quality education and the opportunity to reach their full potential.

Theme 1:

Strengthened organisation and support for rural schools

- How we are reforming and refreshing process and structures so that rural schools are better supported to thrive and innovate.

Theme 2:

Supporting equity and excellence in rural schools

- How we are providing targeted support for rural schools and learners, and prioritising leadership and professional learning opportunities for teachers.

Theme 3:

Supporting rural schools as community and educational spaces

- How we are delivering the best digital education resources and ensuring rural schools are modern educational and community hubs.

There are significant benefits – academic, cultural and social – to learners and communities through the delivery of high-quality education in small and rural schools¹. This can be critical in engaging learners and families from the most disadvantaged backgrounds in rural areas and raising learner aspirations, as well as making a significant contribution to the long-term sustainability of the local community.

We are:

- strengthening the School Organisation Code in respect of a presumption against the closure of rural schools
- improving the statutory process for planning Welsh-medium education by local authorities, following the recommendations of the Welsh in Education Strategic Plan (WESP) Advisory Board; in particular this will improve longer term planning and include early years provision
- providing match funding for 11 School Business Manager Pilots for 2017–19, including Powys, Anglesey, Conwy and Carmarthenshire; the pilot is already supporting 100 schools across the country, freeing up headteachers' time by working on areas such as procurement and finance
- investing in the Pembrokeshire pilot as part of our Community Focussed School Business Manager initiative
- developing an overarching Workforce Development Plan to include a focus on small and rural schools, developing Welsh language skills and improving the quality of the supply workforce.

As a government, we believe in the principle that places matter and we are ambitious in delivering better jobs closer to home, within prosperous, healthier and secure communities.

Just as we are committed to working with businesses, we will continue to work with schools, parents/carers and local authorities to give them the tools to shape successful and sustainable futures.

Case studies

Rural education action plan

Pembrokeshire College has been supporting learning in rural areas by offering two forms of ‘online’ learning – asynchronous learning where learners follow a programme at their own time and pace, and synchronous learning where learners follow timetabled sessions. Learners additionally receive support and tutorials with college staff.

Pembrokeshire College has also been offering A levels and IGCSEs online asynchronously for six years. A levels are delivered centring on learner focus rather than institutional focus, including maximising course offer while minimising duplication, establishing guidance for financial viability, and minimising learner transport requirements during the core day.

Ysgol Bro Teifi is a new 3 to 19 school in Ceredigion which utilises its school buildings for community needs. The school’s excellent sports resources help support various clubs, with cycling, running and football clubs in the local area using these facilities and making the school a vibrant community hub during the evenings.

Likewise, **Ysgol Dyffryn Cledlyn** provides the base for the weekly meetings of the local Young Farmers Club, with many concerts and drama practices held in the well-equipped hall.

Ysgol Mynach, Ysgol Syr John Rhys and Ysgol Gynradd Gymunedol Pontrhydfendigaid benefit from the Small and Rural Schools Grant and work closely in partnership to plan provision and share expertise within fields such as leadership in literacy, numeracy and additional learning needs (ALN).

Ysgol Penllwyn and Ysgol Penrhyn-coch have benefited from a strong informal collaboration and are now in consultation to extend this partnership to a formal federation.

Ffederasiwn Carno, Glantwymyn and Llanbrynmair was established in 2014 and has ensured continued provision of Welsh-medium education in these three rural, traditionally Welsh-speaking areas. Permanent leadership arrangements have been in place since the Federation was established, and all three schools have had successful Estyn inspections. Work has now commenced on a new building for Ysgol Carno which will further safeguard and strengthen the provision of education in the village.

Llangedwyn CW School and Llanfechain Church in Wales Primary School are two small schools located in North Powys. The schools have a shared headteacher, and received funding from the Small and Rural Schools Grant during 2017–18 to support collaboration between them. Having recognised the potential to further benefit the opportunities available for learners by strengthening the links between the two schools, the governing bodies decided to proceed with the federation process.

Conwy County Borough Council, using the Small and Rural Schools Grant, has financed three School Business Managers (SBMs) operating from the secondary school Ysgol Dyffryn Conwy to support 21 primary schools in the Dyffryn Conwy cluster. The aim is to release headteachers from administrative/organisational tasks so they can focus on leading, raising standards and improving learner performance contributing to the sustainability of the small and rural schools, in particular those where the headteacher has a significant teaching commitment. Furthermore, the initiative encourages and supports school-to-school working, enabling headteachers to share good practice and collaborate to maximise capacity and share expertise.

The Small and Rural Schools Grant has enabled **Pembrokeshire County Council** to support a group of four schools to develop leadership and improve provision. The group has been working on provision for additional learning needs (ALN) and, with support from the Inclusion Service, they have appointed an ALN coordinator (ALNCo) to work across the group. The work so far has evidenced the potential of collaboration and has enabled headteachers of the schools, many of who teach the majority of the week, to delegate the day-to-day management of ALN to the ALNCo which has already resulted in reduced costs across the group. This grant is also providing a greater range of support which is being accessed by the schools to support their learners.

Gwynedd Council is supporting its learners by promoting after-school homework clubs in its communities. Twenty-four schools have received funding to purchase equipment to establish clubs in homework and ICT, film, coding and multimedia, physical education, cycling, Welsh language development and community gardening.

The **Ysgol Calon Cymru Cluster** in Powys has used grant funding to appoint a Business Manager to manage the cluster. The school is now looking to establish a cluster-wide behaviour support project. The business manager was funded via the Business Manager Pilot, and the behaviour support project will be supported by the Small and Rural Schools Grant.

Why is Ysgol Abersoch not mentioned here?

Gwynedd Council should be making best effort to support and keep Ysgol Abersoch open!




- Proses.** Mae'r Cyngor yn dilyn y broses ymgynghori statudol yn iawn ac mae ymhell o fewn ei hawliau i gyflawni'r broses hon hyd yn oed yn ystod y pandemig. Fodd bynnag, rwy'n pryderu bod y cyfraniadau rhithwir y gall rhanddeiliaid eu gwneud yn yr ymgynghoriad yn cyfyngu. Mae'n amhosibl i rieni, llywodraethwyr ac eraill gyflwyno eu hachos yn llawn dros blaftrwm rhithwir. Clywais am y cynnydd gwirioneddol yr oedd yr ysgol yn ei wneud o ran cynyddu nifer y disgylion a bod yn arloesol trwy Cylch Meithrin, Ti a Fi yn ogystal â'r broses o sefydlu Ysgol Traeth, y cyntaf o'i bath yng Ngwynedd. Mae llawer o waith wedi'i wneud y tu ôl i'r llenni, er gwaethaf y pandemig, ac amharwyd ar addysg am bron i ddeuddeg mis. Roedd yr ysgol yn casglu momentwm go iawn cyn COVID19 ac mae wedi dechrau mynd yn groes i'r duedd ar i lawr ar nifer y disgylion er gwaethaf heriau ar nifer y preswylwyr yn Abersoch. Gyda'r rhaglen frechlyn yn cael ei chyflwyno ar gyflymder a'r gobaith o addysgu personol yn ailddechrau ar ôl hanner tymor mis Chwefror, rwy'n hyderus y byddai'r ysgol yn ailddarganfod y momentwm hwnnw bron yn syth.

- 3. Nodau.** Mae Ysgol Abersoch yn cwrdd â nodau Moderneiddio Addysg Cyngor Gwynedd. Mae'n cyflawni maint dosbarthiadau llai ac amser cyswilt disgyl-bl-athro. Wrth hyrwyddo'r Gymraeg, mae disgylion nad ydynt yn siarad Cymraeg yn dod yn siaradwyr Cymraeg hyderus yn gyflym. Defnyddir cyfrwng Cymraeg yn yr ystafell ddosbarth a'r tu allan iddi, gan ddangos bod y Gymraeg yn iaith fyw ddyddiol. Mae angen cynllun ar gyfer tai, swyddi a diwylliant arnom, ond bydd colli'r ysgol leol yn golygu bod yr holl ymdrechion hyn wedi darfod. RE: Proposed Closure of Ysgol Abersoch

I am writing with respect to Gwynedd Council's proposed closure of Ysgol Abersoch from 31 August 2021.

On Thursday 28th January, I met with governors and parents of Ysgol Abersoch virtually to discuss the proposal and I want to raise some serious concerns with it. Before I do this, I would like to note the enthusiasm and dedication of those involved with the school who are determined to see the school remain open. I heard first-hand their innovative ideas to increase pupil numbers and to engage with the local community which has seen the school help improve the use of the Welsh language in the village as well as engage with Abersoch's elderly population, helping combat social isolation.

I notify my concerns below:


- 1. Process.** The Council is following the statutory consultation process properly and is well within its rights to carryout this process even during the pandemic. However, I am concerned that the virtual contributions that stakeholders can make in the consultation are limiting. It is impossible for parents, governors and others to fully make their case over a virtual platform. School closures invoke strong feelings and I am concerned the strength of feeling of the local community becomes diluted using this platform. I also believe inter-school comparisons to be weighted against the school and I am concerned by the lack of due consideration to other options such as federalising. I believe a broader menu of options should be available for the school.
- 2. Timing.** I am concerned about the timing of the proposed closure. I heard of the real progress the school was making in increasing pupil numbers and being innovative through *Cylch Meithrin, Ti a Fi* as well as the process of establishing *Beach School*, the first of its kind in Gwynedd. Much work has been done behind the scenes, despite the pandemic, and education being disrupted for nearly twelve months. The school was gathering real momentum pre-COVID19 and has begun to buck the downward trend on pupil numbers despite challenges on the number of residents in Abersoch. With the vaccine program being rolled out at pace and the prospect of in-person teaching resuming after February half-term, I am confident the school would rediscover that momentum almost instantaneously.

- 3. Aims.** Ysgol Abersoch is meeting Gwynedd Council's Modernising Education aims. It delivers on smaller class sizes and pupil-teacher contact time. On promoting the Welsh language, non-Welsh speaking pupils quickly become confident Welsh speakers. Welsh-language medium is used in and out of classroom, demonstrating that Welsh is a daily, living language. On schools being integrated within the local community, Ysgol Abersoch has well supported Christmas and Gwyl Dewi Sant concerts and fundraisers and has well-established relationships with village shops and businesses. It is also a much-enjoyed contributor to *Bore Panad*, an over 50s coffee morning at village hall.

I am asking you as the Education Cabinet Member to provide an alternative to the permanent removal of education in Abersoch, which will fatally damage efforts to regenerate rural communities. We need a plan for housing, jobs and culture, but losing the local school will render all these efforts obsolete. I would like to see this proposal dropped to give the school a few more years to prove it can grow again (as it is doing now) in the post-pandemic world. Could you also please provide a number of school pupils that you think would make Ysgol Abersoch a viable school in the long-term.

I enclose the school's position paper on the proposed closure and I look forward to hearing from you.

Credwn foddy bynnag mai camgymriad ar ran yr Awdurdod, er i'r Gweinidog Addysg ddiwygio'r Côd ar frys ar 7.1.21 i ganiatau hyn, oedd dewis cynnal yr ymgynghoriad statudol holl-bwysig tra roedd yr ysgol ar gau am yr holl gyfnod, y rhieni a'r llywodraethwyr dan bwysau oherwydd y pandemig a'u gallu i drefnu gwirthwynebiad i'r cynnig yn gyfyngedig oherwydd rheol "aros adre". Credwn y dylai'r Awdurdod gymryd hyn i ystyriaeth wrth ddod i benderfyniad.

Credwn hefyd fod yr amserlen a roddir yn anffodus. Petai'r cynnig yn cael ei gadaernhau, ni byddai ond mis o amser ar ddiwedd tymor yr haf wedi hysbysu rhieni o'r penderfyniad terfynol iddynt ystyried yr opsiwn mwyaf priodol wedyn ar gyfer addysg eu plant – a'u penderfyniad nhw yw hwn yn gyfreithiol. Mae hyn yn groes i arfer gorau cydnabyddiedig o roi tymor cyfan o rybudd i rieni am unrhyw newid sylfaenol. Byddai gosod dyddiad mwy realistig o Fedi 2022 i gychwyn unrhyw drefn newydd yn caniatau digon o amser ar gyfer trafod yr opsiynau amgen y cyfeiriwyd atynt cyn cyhoeddi penderfyniad terfynol.

Y CYNNIG EI HUN

Nid ydym yn gwadu nad yw'r sefyllfa'n un heriol, na bod mwyafrif y ffeithiau yn yr adroddiad yn gywir, ond mae angen tynnu sylw at y ffaith fod penderfyniadau (neu ddiffyg penderfyniadau) mewn polisi cyhoeddus gan Lywodraeth Leol a Chanolog wedi cyfrannu at y problemau, a bod cyfrifoldeb arbennig felly i chwilio pob datrysiaid posibl. Yr ysgol erbyn hyn yw'r adnodd pwysicaf yn y pentref i yrru adfywiad, a byddai penderfyniad i gau'r ysgol gyfystyr â phenderfyniad i gefnu ar y gymuned o ran Cymreictod, ac i gefnu ar y criw gweithgar lleol a allent fod yn bartneriaid gwerthfawr mewn strategaeth adfywio.

Opsiwn 1 - Datblygu Canolfan Ddiwylliannol Gymraeg

Mae cyfrifoldeb felly i werthuso'n gadarnhaol pob opsiwn posibl. Deallwn awydd y gymuned leol i gynnal yr Ysgol fel Ysgol i Abersoch, yn cynnig rhan gyntaf addysg statudol Gymraeg, ac hefyd addysg feithrin ac yn ganolfan addysgol a diwylliannol Gymraeg i'r gymuned leol. Mae'r ddogfen ymgynghorol wedi cydnabod mai megis cychwyn y mae ychwanegu'r elfennau addysgol a

diwylliannol Cymraeg at yr addysg statudol, a bod posibiliadau denu incwm trwy ddefnyddwyr a thrwy geisio grantiau'n ymwneud â gweithgarwch diwylliannol. Mae'n bosibl y gellid denu cyllid ychwanegol trwy fod yr Ysgol yn manteisio are i safle yng nghanol y pentre e.e. Gwyliau Haf yr Ysgol yw'r 6 wythnos o dymor brig twristiaeth. A oes potensial i stafell yn yr ysgol, mewn cydweithrediad â Neuadd y pentre wrth ymyl, gael ei defnyddio i hybu profiad twristaidd llawer mwy Cymreig. Gallai'r gwasanaeth gynnwys gwybodaeth bersonol am yr ardal a'r gweithgareddau, rhaglen o adloniant Cymraeg yn y neuadd, gwybodaeth am yr arfordir a'r llwybrau gwledig (o bosib yn cysylltu ag Opsiwn 2 isod). Gall fod yn wasanaeth, ar ben y wybodaeth pamffledi safonol a baratoir ar hyn o bryd, o gynnig profiad Cymreiciach i ymwelwyr, ac yn gynllun peilot. Gallai hefyd fod yn ffynhonell incwm o bwys. Pwysleisiwn mai un syniad penodol sydd yma, a allai fod yn hyfyw neu beidio, ond yr hyn a gynigiwn yw cyfiawnhau'r gwariant ychwanegol ar ysgol – sydd fel arall yn llwyddo'n addysgol – trwy roi iddi swyddogaeth ychwanegol o ran ADFEDDIANNU ar gyfer y diwylliant Cymraeg. Gall hefyd gynhyrchu llif cyllid, a gellid gweithredu mewn partneriaeth gyda phwyllgor cyswllt lleol. Mae Abersoch, ac adeilad yr ysgol yn benodol, mewn sefyllfa unigryw i weithredu prosiect o'r fath.

Mae'r Asesiad Effaith yn cydnabod, er mor amharod, y gwirionedd hunan-amlwg y byddai cau'r ysgol yn cael effaith negyddol ar y gymuned, ac yn benodol ar yr iaith Gymraeg. Ni ellir mesur yr effaith ar yr iaith o gyfyngu'r ymarferiad i ddadansddiad ystadegol o gyfrwng yr addysg, iaith gartre'r plant, a nifer y gweithgareddau ffurfiol. Mae'r llywodraethwyr yn tystio'n hytrach i effaith lawer mwy sylfaenol o ran ffurfio agweddu yn y gymuned leol, yn cynnwys mewnfudwyr, tuag at y Gymraeg a theimlo perchnogaeth arni gan weld yr iaith yng nghyd-destun y gymuned ble maent yn byw.

Opsiwn 2 – Addysg Gyflawn ac Adnabod Bro

Yr ail swyddogaeth y gellid ei ychwanegu at Ysgol Abersoch, er mwyn cyfiawnhau'r buddsoddiad ychwanegol wrth gynnal yr ysgol, yw fel cynllun peilot ar gyfer addysg gyflawn. Unwaith eto, mae Ysgol Abersoch mewn sefyllfa unigryw i weithredu cynllun peilot fel "Ysgol Traeth" ac "Ysgol Llwybrau Gwledig". Nid yn unig fod yr ysgol yn agos iawn at y traeth ac, mewn perthynas ag Ysgol Sarn Bach, at lwybrau gwledig y penrhyn, ond mae hefyd ymhliith y llywodraethwyr uchelgais i gyflwyno llawer o'r profiadau addysgol trwy astudio'r traeth a llwybrau gwledig, ac yn ieithyddol o ran dod allan o adeilad yr ysgol i fywyd ganol y pentre fel grym Cymreigio. Trwy bartneriaeth gyda llywodraethwyr a phwyllgor cyswllt lleol, nid yn unig y gellid cyfoethogi profiad addysgol y disgyblion mewn modd unigryw, ond hefyd gweithredu fel cynllun peilot y gellid efelychu elfennau ohon wedyn mewn ysgolion eraill hefyd. Dyma ail ran agenda ADFEDDIANNU – sef adfer perthynas rhwng ysgol a'r gymuned o'i chwmpas fel y gall yr nysgol fod yn gyfrwng i hyrwyddo dealltwriaeth amgylcheddol yn ogystal â diwylliannol, ymhliith y disgyblion ac yn y gymuned.

Gellid cyflawni'r "gwerth ychwanegol" hwn (Opsiynau 1 & 2) nail ai yng nghyd-destun ysgol annibynnol yn Abersoch neu fel rhan o drefn gydweithredol rhwng ysgolion.

Opsiwn 3 – Modelau Cydweithio ag ysgolion Cyfagos

Mae'r ddogfen yn astudio rhai modelau o ffederasiwn, ac yn casglu na byddent yn ateb heriau sylfaenol fel nifer isel o ddisgyblion. Ond mae nifer o fodelau eraill yn bosibl na roddwyd sylw iddynt. Ar y cyd gydag opsiwn (1) a/neu (2) uchod, gallent fod yn ddatrysiaid o ran llawn ddefnyddio capaciti.

- (a) **Ysgol Aml-safle** - Nid ystyriwyd y model o ysgol aml-safle rhwng Llanbedrog ac Abersoch ac o bosibl Sarn Bach. O safbwyt ystadegol, byddai hyn yn gwneud synnwyd gan fod Ysgol Llanbedrog yn orlawn a chapasiti dros ben yn Abersoch dair milltir i ffwrdd – sef yr hyn a roddir gan y ddogfen ymgynghorol fel gwendid ffurio ffederasiwn. Potensial o ran Un ysgol integredig ar 2 safle fyddai'r model hwn, sy'n wahanol i ffederasiwn lle bydd gwahanol ysgolion yn cadw eu hunaniaeth dan un bwrdd llywodraethwyr cyfunol. Does dim sicrwydd mai dyma'r model a fyddai'n gweddu orau i'r amgylchiadau lleol, ond dylsid fod wedi ei ystyried cyn cynnig y datrysiaid difrifol o amddifadu Abersoch o unrhyw sefydliad addysgol o gwbl.
- (b) **Ffederasiwn o nifer o ysgolion** – Yn y ddogfen trafodir yn unig sefydlu ffederasiwn ag un ysgol arall tra bo'r Rheoliadau ar Ffedereiddio'n caniatau i nifer o ysgolion ffurio ffederasiwn. Gallai fod ffederasiwn rhwng Ysgolion Llanbedrog, Abersoch a Sarn Bach. Er na allai'r un Bwrdd Llywodraethwyr Ffederal hefyd reoli Ysgol Foel Gron (oherwydd ei statws gwirfoddol), gallai'r ffederasiwn ffurfiol gydweithio (mewn trefniant a elwir weithiau yn "ffederasiwn medal") gydag Ysgol Foel Gron at drefniadau a gweithgareddau arbennig. Byddai manteision (ac arbedion) potensial o ran gweinyddiaeth ac arweinyddiaeth integredig, potensial o ran defnyddio capasiti at ddibenion y ffederasiwn cyfan, a photensial ehangu profiad addysgol trwy fod gwahanol ysgolion yn canolbwytio ar wahanol weithgareddau. Mae Cronfa Ysgolion Bach a Gwledig y Llywodraeth yn golygu fel arfer fod swm ar gael i gwrdd ag unrhyw gostau ychwanegol (e.e. teithio at ysgol arall i ymuno mewn gweithgarwch) sy'n ehangu profiadau addysgol a chymdeithasol ffederasiwn.
- (c) **FFEDERASIWN "ENLLI"** – Gallai ffederasiwn fod ar ffurf mwy uchelgeisiol fyth e.e. gellid sefydlu ffurf blaengar newydd ar addysg yn yr ardal trwy fod yr holl ysgolion yn ffedereiddio – Llanbedrog, Abersoch, Sarn Bach, Pontygoed a Chrud y Wern (gan gydweithio'n anffurfiol gydag Ysgol Foel Gron). Mae'r Rheoliadau ar Ffedereiddio'n caniatau fod ffederasiwn yn cynnwys hefyd ysgol uwchradd. Byddai cynnwys Ysgol Botwnnog mewn federasiwn felly'n cryfhau datblygiad trwedd o lefel cynradd i uwchradd, ac yn cadarnhau addysg y fro mewn modd blaengar iawn a fyddai'n sicr o ddenu cefnogaeth gan Lywodraeth Cymru oherwydd y gwersi y gellid eu dysgu. Yn ogystal ag ehangu profiadau, byddai potensial amlwg hefyd ar gyfer rhesymoli costau gweinyddol a chreu strwythurau integredig.

Gallai unrhyw un o'r opsiynau cydweithio (nad ydynt hyd yma wedi derbyn sylw) hefyd cael eu cyfuno gydag opsiwn (1) neu/a (2) ar gyfer Ysgol Abersoch ei hun fel y byddai natur unigryw yr ysgol honno o fudd ehangach i ddisgyblion y fro.

Credwn fod y nodion hyn yn arwain at gasgliad anochel. The caring and sharing values of the school were solidly instilled in my son and shaped his character in a wholly positive way. Even though he is now 18, I can still see the influence of Ysgol Abersoch in the empathetic way he interacts with others.

Secondly, he was taught to speak grammatically perfect Welsh, which was positively commented on by several Welsh-first language members of the local community, so it is clear that Ysgol Abersoch is effective as an institution for developing Welsh speakers. This comment is made against the context of my son coming from an English-first language home.


Which brings me to my final point. Gwynedd Council seems very focussed at the moment on strengthening the local community and supporting homes for young people by doing everything it can to constrain second home ownership. There seems little point in strengthening the local community when the parents of tomorrow will not have their local school in their community to which to send their young children. The implications of sending the future children of Abersoch to other schools are greater than simply the extra miles driven and the CO₂ emitted. Those children will be fragmented between 3 other local primary schools, with the resultant loss of friendships made and nourished in the local Abersoch community between both children and parents. This therefore undermines and erodes the local community of Abersoch thus accelerating the trend towards it becoming nothing more than a holiday resort.

I recognise that the current enrolment at Ysgol Abersoch is very low, but closing the school is not necessarily the correct answer to that problem. Once the school is closed it will never come back. Instead I would encourage the council and the governors to restore the long term viability of Ysgol Abersoch by ensuring that local parents are aware of what a great choice it is when deciding where to send their children to primary school.

Response from Sustainable Abersoch Cynaliadwy (SAC) on the Statutory Consultation regarding Ysgol Abersoch,
15.2.21

The following comments are submitted by Sustainable Abersoch Cynaliadwy (SAC), a small local group concerned with protecting and improving the environment and community of Abersoch and making it a better place to live.

We understand the role and responsibilities of Gwynedd's education department to manage the county primary school budget efficiently. In this case we feel there is a failure to consider the wider context of the school in sustaining the local community in the longer term. Abersoch is remarkably successful as the pre-eminent hub of the visitor economy in Llŷn, but this has come at a high cost to the local village which has seen its services in health, housing and now schools steadily eroded. A vibrant economy is not being properly supported by its community development. Closure of the school would rip the heart out of the community. We consider the proposal is far too focussed on the narrow financial criteria of the education department. The costs and benefits of maintaining the school are much wider than a simple cost/pupil measure. The decision needs to take a more integrated account of the Council's policy for Gwynedd as a whole and in particular the extreme housing pressures inflicted on Abersoch which housing policy has so far failed to address.

The case for closure rests on the low present and predicted pupil numbers. From the figures for Abersoch and the 3 neighbouring primary schools given in the consultation document, it is clear that over the last 40 years the total number of pupils over the 4 schools has been relatively constant, but this conceals considerable volatility in individual schools, particularly Abersoch. Pupil numbers here fell as low as 13/14 in 1990 and 1995, yet were back up at 29 in 2000; they remained at 15-20 in subsequent years and have only fallen to around 10 in the last 3 years. Foel Gron numbers have varied between 20 and 52, Llanbedrog between 48 and 103, Sarn Bach between 48 and 74. Abersoch's numbers are generally lower only because the school provides for the younger age range (3-8 years), while the other 3 schools cover the full primary range (3-11 years), making direct comparison of numbers misleading. The volatility in numbers raises questions over how meaningful the prediction of future numbers can be. The prediction for Sarn Bach suggests numbers will more than halve over the next 5 years. What are the predictions based on? We would argue that the recent low numbers at Abersoch have been influenced by uncertainty over the stability of the school caused by persistent threats from the Council to close it. There is evidently considerable fluidity in numbers drawn by schools between each of their nominal catchment areas which appear to have arbitrary geographical boundaries. Thus the proposal to close the school rests on estimates of future pupil numbers that are subject to considerable uncertainty and instability and in which there can be little confidence. Quite small numbers are at issue and these could evidently change dramatically in a short space of time.

The low numbers at the school are also criticised for leading to too small a class size. Most people's experience would suggest that small classes favour a better quality of attention and teaching. Rather, overlarge classes, such as those at Llanbedrog, may lead to poorer outcomes. A higher educational performance through small class size would tend to outweigh any limitation on the benefits of greater social interaction between larger numbers of peers. Abersoch school is in fact regarded as offering a high quality bilingual education based on small classes and good leadership.

Abersoch is in the centre of a steadily growing housing crisis that is enveloping other parts of Dwyfor. It has exploded into greater political prominence in the last year as the insatiable demand for second homes has absorbed much of the

village housing stock and caused market prices for local houses to soar well beyond the reach of most residents, especially young families. The pandemic has accelerated this trend through the new options for working from home, rising interest in staycations and temporarily pent-up demand. The provision of genuinely affordable homes is one of the few practical ways of trying to address this issue, but present models are not working well and are failing Abersoch. This is a key reason why the numbers of local school age children are low. In an effort to address this crisis, Gwynedd Council Cabinet approved a new Action Plan for affordable housing on December 15th to spend £77mn on a substantial roll-out of new affordable homes with an emphasis on social rental, using the proceeds from the recently introduced Council Tax premium on second homes and empty houses. This should focus particularly on those areas, such as Abersoch, most exposed to market distortions caused by second homes. If successful this should soon lead to an influx of young families with school age children needing local primary education. This programme should be given a chance to work before any decision is made to close the local school. Closing the school would risk undermining the housing policy. Once the school is gone, it could not easily be brought back if circumstances changed.

The recent successful establishment of a Cylch Meithrin and Cylch Ti a Fi at the school is an important dynamic element that is given too little weight. It not only changes the outlook regarding possible future school numbers, but is also a further important step in integrating the school and the local community. The school, located in the heart of the village, acts as a bastion of permanence for local Welsh culture and language in a community that is increasingly dominated by the transient interests of the visitor economy and too often seems to be written off or ignored by Council policy. The consultation's community impact assessment report is a weak document which fails to capture the importance of the school to the local community. However, it admits that school closure would have some effect on elements of community events and some negative impact on the community.

The proposal is that pupils from Abersoch would move to the nearby school at Sarn Bach where there is surplus capacity that is predicted to rise. It is easy to understand the superficial financial and practical logic of such a solution. However, it fails to appreciate the assets in Abersoch that would be lost: the centrality of the school within the village, the direct connection with the community, the easy access on foot between the school and homes or services, the availability of the large village hall for indoor activities alongside the school, the playground field and garden, and the opportunities for natural learning afforded by the proximity of beaches, dunes and coastal activities. Sarn Bach school has a much more isolated and peripheral location. Sarn Bach itself is just a few scattered houses with no community or services to speak of. Practical access to Sarn Bach school is limited to the 1.4 mile road from Abersoch which in places is narrow, fast and dangerous, especially in the summer season. The absence of a safe walking route means that bus or private vehicle transport has to be used. In a society that has to learn to reduce its dependence on road transport this is an environmentally irresponsible way to go. The Consultation document includes a map showing the rights of way around Sarn Bach, but sadly several of these footpaths are closed or impassable, if they were thought to be relevant to school recreation or access. Both schools are rated as having a 'good' standard of teaching, but Sarn Bach would be a poor substitute for Abersoch.

Six options have been considered for the future of Abersoch school. The option of closure has been chosen, it seems, as superficially the easiest and neatest, but in our view adequate consideration has not been given to the alternatives. Federalisation with a nearby school, in particular, needs to be considered in more detail, perhaps focussing on Llanbedrog where numbers now exceed capacity. The appraisal of options found that this would be plausible and have several advantages and few downsides, but was rejected because 'there was no clear evidence that federalisation would lead to an increase in numbers'. This is too flimsy an argument to justify closure of Abersoch.

The net cost saving of closing Abersoch school is stated to be in the region of £100,000/year or about 0.1% of the total Council education budget of £108.8mn in 2020/21. At the same time, the Council is proposing to invest some £5.4mn in an entirely new primary school (Ysgol Treferthwyr) on the outskirts of Criccieth. The assessment of saving takes no account of the cost and disruption to the community in Abersoch nor considers the loss of a perfectly sound building if no alternative use for it could be found. It appears that financial considerations alone are driving a policy of concentration into larger schools at the cost of depriving communities of their own services and reducing the variety and choice of schools available to them.

We think it quite inappropriate to have conducted this consultation during the height of the covid epidemic when it has been impossible to follow normal democratic procedures. For that reason alone we feel this process should be abandoned or at least postponed to allow options to be reviewed and reconsidered properly before a final decision about the future of the school is reached.

Just as every child and their capacity to learn is unique, so are the environments in which our children acquire their education. The value of the education given to the children who attend a small local school at the beating heart of the community cannot be under estimated.

Going to school and the benefits derived are far more than learning to read and write. Ysgol Abersoch gave my son the most valuable foundation in life I could have hoped for. The caring, nurturing teachers taught him life lessons of kindness, compassion and respect. The small classes meant that each child was individually known and understood...and were taught as individuals. The value of this is enormous.

So please step away from your spreadsheet and understand that whilst every child has to go to school, some schools give the most valuable education of all. Please do not close Ysgol Abersoch and give the next generation of young children coming up through the Cylch and into Primary the opportunity to flourish and become the future of Abersoch village.

I am e-mailing to state my objection to the proposed closure of Ysgol Abersoch. I have spent the last 59 years coming to Abersoch and one of my fondest memories is staying at Teg Fan and observing how vibrant the village school was and indeed still is. I am now in the process of moving to the area and will be learning Welsh. One of the great things about Ysgol Abersoch is that Welsh is promoted and the cultural heritage of the area is preserved.

There are currently 12 children under 3 who would benefit from attending the school and, having taught for 35 years, I truly believe that small class sizes are the best. I have taught in schools where 30 was the average class size and in other schools where 4 was the average. Teachers are multi-talented but even the most diligent, committed teachers cannot give the same attention to 30 children as they can to 4!

Please note that due to Coronavirus more people have realised that they can work from home and they can move to Abersoch, so the numbers of children needing a quality education may well grow.

I feel that it would be detrimental to the village to allow this closure to go ahead and I ask you to reconsider



Cludiant

Dear Sir, Madam,

I am writing to you urgently on behalf of **Cylch Meithrin a Ti a Fi Abersoch (CMA)**, set within Ysgol Abersoch, with grave concerns about your proposal to close Ysgol Abersoch and the threat this brings to the CMA and, ergo, nursery provision in Abersoch and surrounding villages.

Alongside our worries about being forced to close CMA, there have been serious omissions of due process in the consultation which I bring to your attention and would like a response to.

CMA Background

CMA was formed as a response to reduced numbers of children attending Ysgol Abersoch to create a natural feed and to create much needed local childcare provision in Abersoch and surrounding villages: “[to allow families to take] advantage of the opportunity to begin their children's journey to Welsh medium education” (Mudiad Meithrin 22/01/2021).

The Mudiad Meithrin has fully committed to creating a Cylch Meithrin in the area through a generous *Sefydlu a Symud/Startup and Succeed (SAS)* grant as part of its aim to open 40 new Cylchoedd by 2021 under the **Cymraeg 2050** programme. The Welsh Government through Cyngor Gwynedd has also backed the CMA through its Covid Welsh Government Start Up Grant.

As part of our strategy to move towards providing a full time Cylch Meithrin a Ti a Fi, the CMA has registered with:

- The Charities Commission as a charitable incorporated organisation (CIO)
- The Care Inspectorate Wales (CIW)
- The 30 hour Cynnig Gofal Plant/Childcare scheme
- HMRC as a (much needed) local employer

As we approach better times, the CMA is set to resume providing nurturing care and early stage education in a Welsh medium and will again provide an extremely valuable social resource for families in both the Cylch and the Ti a Fi. The CMA will be re-opening its doors as soon as possible after the half term and, due to the efforts of our fantastic Cylch leader, within an hour of this decision being reached we have children signed up to attend.

Omissions in your Process

The CMA committee and staff have not been informed of the intention to close the school or consulted despite it being a statutory requirement under the **Schools Organisation Code (SOC)**. We have not been invited to stakeholder meetings so our input has been completely ignored. The feed from CMA to Ysgol Abersoch numbers has not been taken into account despite the evidence from other Cylchoedd that this does lead to an increase in numbers; as a case in point, despite Covid, two CMA children registered with Ysgol Abersoch in September 2020 and at least one of our CMA children has now registered for the September 2021 intake to Ysgol Abersoch.

The **SOC** states any impact on nursery provision needs to be considered but this has not happened and we have lodged a query with the Charities Commission as we believe that the requirement that “*Proposals which affect charities must be consistent with charity law or the stated purpose of the charitable trust*” has been breached.

SOC 3.2 states:

“*The following must receive either a hard copy of the consultation document or ...*

- *in the case of proposals affecting nursery provision, any independent*

providers who may be affected

- *in the case of proposals affecting nursery provision, the Children and Young People's Partnership and/or the Early Years Development and Childcare Partnerships where present"*

The CMA has not received the consultation document in any format and it is far too late now for us to have any meaningful input to a process so far advanced unless a delay is introduced into this process!

Local Impact

As you will be aware, Abersoch is renowned locally and nationally as an area under extreme duress from house prices and second home ownership, house affordability, intense tourism and the pressures these bring on the Welsh language and culture. Rather less well-known outside the area is that Abersoch lies fully within a rural heartland of Welsh speaking communities and the threat to **Ysgol Abersoch and Cylch Meithrin a Ti a Fi Abersoch** represents a direct challenge to the survival of the Welsh speaking culture within Penrhyn Llŷn; indeed, many believe that by closing the school and threatening the CMA you will be removing the beating heart of the village and forcing yet more families to move out of Abersoch which has already seen its village medical centre, banks and independent post office all closed.

Looking at local nursery provision, the dosbarth meithrin at Ysgol Sarn Bach does not allow children below the age of 5 to travel on its bus so families would need to have their own transport in order to send their young children which is not possible for many families as this often implies a 2+ car family. On the evidence we have heard, some other local Cylch Meithrin are viewed as being *too English* resulting in children being transported far and wide to find more suitable childcare.

In summary, the CMA is under direct threat of closure if Ysgol Abersoch is closed. Families are being dissuaded from sending their children to both Ysgol Abersoch and the CMA as they are concerned these will be closing. The council has manifestly failed to consult or consider the CMA in this whole process which, particularly in the middle of a pandemic, is very hard to justify.

With the school and Cylch Meithrin closed, no doctor's and very few local shops, the village will become just a summer resort and shopping street for visitors, empty in the Winter months not the thriving village it could and should be showcasing all the best that the Welsh language and culture have to offer.

Comments:

I think the proposal to close Ysgol Abersoch rests too much on a short-sighted focus on financial measures and fails to consider the wider context of council policies and the need to support the local community.

Clearly, the Education Department has a responsibility to manage its school budget efficiently which it seeks to do through closure of high cost schools and consolidation of smaller schools into larger ones. At the same time, the Council has a duty to support the wider community through the provision and maintenance of local affordable housing, jobs, services and cultural assets. In this case there is too much focus on financial logic and not enough account of community impact.

Abersoch is an unusual village. It has become remarkably successful as the foremost centre of tourism in Llŷn, driving the sectors on which the visitor economy depends - accommodation, hospitality, leisure facilities, construction and maintenance - to the benefit of the wider population of the peninsula. Yet, this has come at a high cost to the resident village community, especially through distortions in the housing market leading to a lack of genuinely affordable housing within the village. The increasing demand for second homes has raised house prices at all levels, driving out the local community. Young families, in particular, have little chance of being able to secure local housing. This in turn has distorted the catchment areas for local schools. The duty of the Council is to try and redress this, not by closing schools, but by providing effective local affordable housing, including social housing. The recently approved Crisis Action Plan for Affordable Housing, using proceeds from the Council Tax premium on second homes, is a step in the right direction. It should be given a chance to work, ensuring there is still a local school to go to if it succeeds in settling more young families in the village.

There is a failure to consider the value of the school in sustaining the village community. It is a good building located in the centre of the village, alongside the village hall, and with easy access to shops, services and beach amenities. It is an important anchor for sustaining Welsh language and culture in this embattled community, increasingly dominated by the interests of short-term visitors. The school is closely integrated with the village community. The recent establishment of pre-school nursery capacity has further strengthened this integration as well as promising to increase future numbers in the foundation stage. Closure of the school would have a negative impact on the community.

There is too much emphasis on pupil numbers driving this proposal. It is clear that numbers in all the local primary schools have fluctuated widely over the years. The numbers at Abersoch are of course lower partly because the school concentrates on the foundation 3-8 year stage. The threat of closure itself has also probably led to lower numbers. The defined school catchment areas appear arbitrary. There can be little confidence in predictions of future numbers on which the proposal for closure depends. Abersoch school is regarded as offering a high quality bilingual education based on small classes and good leadership, at least the equal of neighbouring schools.

The alternative options to closing the school have not been adequately considered. In particular, federalisation, perhaps with Llanbedrog which is oversubscribed, deserves further consideration. The proposal for Abersoch pupils to move to Sarn Bach school nearby is not a satisfactory solution. The financial and practical advantages which may be seen as attractive are outweighed by the loss of centrality and amenities, the loss of direct connection to the community, the peripheral location of Sarn Bach school, the need for additional road transport to reach it, and the lack of any local community or services to speak of.

I think the proposal to close Ysgol Abersoch is premature and mistaken. It appears that financial considerations alone are driving a policy of consolidation into larger schools at the cost of depriving communities of their local services and reducing the variety and choice of schools available to them. Think again! Don't penalise the school for the lack of housing in Abersoch. Try to solve the family housing problem first and then there will still be a school to go to. Don't give up on the resident community of Abersoch.

Statutory Consultation regarding Ysgol Abersoch

Concerning the draft proposal to close Ysgol Abersoch on the 31st August and transfer the existing pupils to Ysgol Sarn Bach.

This proposal was approved at meetings held at Gwynedd Council Cabinet on the 15th September and 3rd November 2020

The costs to finance the continuation of funding Ysgol Abersoch as stated appear high and are not transparent enough to comment upon. The numbers of pupils projected for future years, are at best, a guess based on past recent trends but the historically pupil numbers have fluctuated with around 20 being a reasonable benchmark. If there is no village school then the numbers will not have a chance to increase.

There is now a new on-site Cylch Meithrin recently installed and the governors have urged the Cabinet to allow the program "time to flourish", which may influence new pupils to join.

One of the possible reasons that numbers of pupils has not risen over the past few years is the lack of affordable housing for people working in the village on low basic wages this has forced young families to move out to cheaper housing in surrounding area.

Gwynedd Council research has shown that the holiday homes emergency within the county has reached a critical point and that many people in Gwynedd find it near impossible to get a foot on the housing market, both to buy and to rent. The reality is that high house prices due to the demand for holiday units and second homes are pushing prices far beyond the reach of local people in an increasing number of the regions towns and villages.

To close the local village school would severely damage the fabric of Abersoch village retaining its status as a thriving local village community with an integrated school of many years standing to continue and preserve the ability to provide local education of children from aged 3 to 8 into the Welsh language, history and culture.

The Gwynedd Council Plan 2018-23 sets as one of its well-being objectives the aims to ensure that all residents can live in a community where the Welsh language is a natural part of life.

No other village in the area under consideration has such an intergrated village ~~with~~ Abersoch having local businesses, shops, pubs, cafes, beaches, a harbour, tourist office, garages, golf course etc. and now a school under threat of closure.

To close the school would ' Rip the heart out of the village ', no longer would residents, second home owners, tourists and visitors see and hear the voices of young pupils going to and from school or hear them enjoying playing in the yard during school breaks.

It is understand there is a cost to continue keeping the school open but surely the benefits would outweigh the costs of maintaining the existing status quo.

Now that Gwynedd Council are planning to double the council tax on second homes to 100 per cent it is possible to consider using some of this extra cash to fund local infrastructure such as local schools.

In the current situation of Covid 19 and all its restrictions, to not to be able to discuss this matter further face to face, is very unfortunate and in its self may be a good enough reason to postpone the decision until we know the outcome of ' Lockdown ' is clearer.

It is possible that the number of people who have now experienced working from home in towns and cities will continue to grow and will realise they can live and work anywhere may give a boost to more families moving to live in a village with integrated good education etc. in say Abersoch, another reason to defer any school closure.

In my own case we lived and worked in large cities and loved holidaying in Abersoch with a young family, once we found how integrated the village was we bought a second home here. On retirement we became permanent residents, thinking our grown up children would visit. They all moved to Abersoch at about the same time and have lived, worked and grown families in the 25 years we have all lived here. Grandchildren have arrived and some have been educated at Ysgol Abersoch learning the local language, the history and culture of the area and living in a village in Wales.

If the school is closed and pupils move to Sarn Bach their good Welsh education will be continued but Abersoch will lose a vital facility of a local school to bind the village together, there will be less Welsh spoken and the community will suffer.

As a consequence of this loss of local culture and integration, Abersoch will become ever more a second home area and in danger of becoming a ' Satelite of Cheshire '

Please reconsider your proposal or at least defer the decision for at least another 2 years to see what effect post Covid 19 has on our local community.

Therefore we are opposed to the Gwynedd Council Cabinet current proposal to close Ysgol Abersoch from August 2021

Response to the Ysgol Abersoch Statutory Consultation

Dear Education Department and Cabinet Members,

This letter is being written in response to the Statutory Consultation to consider the future of Ysgol Abersoch.

On review of the proposal I have the following serious concerns that I believe warrant a considered response by the Council prior to a decision being made.

Loss to the community and the engagement in the community of the pupils.

Our business is located on Abersoch beach and is visited by the school children on their school outings. The school children walk from Ysgol Abersoch and take part in many activities on the beach. It is a delight to see the children so well engaged with their local environment.

Prior to Covid, the children were frequently out and about engaging with local businesses and exploring their local surroundings in the heart of the village. Each year the children host a wonderful Christmas show at the village hall as well participating in many other local concerts and events, which are always well attended and much enjoyed by many members of the local community, young and old.

If the school were to close, then these connections and engagement with the local community will be lost. I am not aware that other schools in the area offer such wide-ranging experiences. In the consultation document it is clear that there are many more local amenities available to Ysgol Abersoch when compared to other schools in the local area.

This aspect is inadequately addressed in the proposal as there is clearly a difference with the location of Ysgol Sarn Bach, which is largely separate from any community amenities.

Pupil numbers at Ysgol Abersoch and surrounding schools

I am very concerned that the Council is basing its decision on deeply flawed pupil estimates that are out of line with Gwynedd Council estimates which indicate that the number of school age children will increase over the next 20 years as well as recent data showing that pupil numbers at Ysgol Abersoch and surrounding schools have been growing over the last 5 years. This is in stark contrast to the Education Department's forecasts which show a steep decline in numbers. The source of these estimates needs to be substantiated and differences from common population trends justified.

In addition Ysgol Llanbedrog has continued to accept children in excess of its capacity limits and is educating children in class sizes of more than 20 for a mixed-age class. Both these factors contravene Gwynedd Council's "Excellent Primary Education for Children in Gwynedd" position. It seems that the Education Department and Ysgol Llanbedrog has allowed this over-subscription to occur to the potential detriment of the education of the Ysgol Llanbedrog pupils whilst threatening the continuation of other schools in the catchment area. This situation needs to be corrected.

If pupil numbers were better managed across the four schools in the catchment area, then class sizes of 12-20 would be more common at all the schools to the benefit of all pupils in the catchment. The continuation of classes at Ysgol Abersoch is required to meet this aim at all the schools in the catchment. In addition it is

likely that the average cost per pupil in the catchment area would then be more in line with educational norms.

The Council has not provided an impact assessment on class sizes if the pupils of Ysgol Abersoch are transferred to Ysgol Sarn Bach as proposed. If this were to occur, then the class sizes at Ysgol Sarn Bach will be 21 and 37 respectively. This is clearly in excess of the started 20 as a maximum mixed class size. In addition to my own concerns, I believe that the governors and parents of Ysgol Sarn Bach would also be concerned and their views need to be taken into account in the consultation.

Further I do not accept the argument that smaller classes are detrimental to the education of pupils. It makes intuitive sense that more individual attention will lead to better outcomes.

When my son attended the school I felt that the attention to his individual education needs enabled through a smaller class size at Ysgol Abersoch meant that he was able to quickly progress and has moved into the next steps of his education with a strong academic record. If asked, I am sure that other parents and pupils would feel the same. It is notable that their opinions are not recorded in the consultation document

Consideration of Federation with a neighboring school.

I can appreciate that the Council has financial constraints and that costs and benefits need to be carefully considered.

The consultation document indicates that there will be a net annual saving of approximately £96k. This is about 0.01% of the overall Gwynedd Education Department budget. How the saving has been calculated is unclear, with no breakdown of costs provided e.g. are the costs of educating the children at another school and the ongoing maintenance of the school, which is a responsibility of the Council, included? It is highly concerning that decisions are being put forward to the Cabinet with an argument based on a cost per pupil rather than an absolute cost of running the school. Taking all four schools together, as a catchment the cost per pupil is approximately £5k per pupil. This is in step with other rural schools in the area.

Closing Ysgol Abersoch will make an immaterial impact on the budget, but would seriously erode education standards for the 200 pupils in Abersoch and the surrounding schools.

An option to federalize with a neighboring school is outlined as an option in the consultation document. This option has not been given equal consideration from a cost perspective with no figures available to understand what cost savings could be made if Ysgol Abersoch were federalized.

Conclusion

I believe that in order to make a more balanced decision the Council must:

1. Identify the impact on the Abersoch community as being clearly negative if Ysgol Abersoch were to close.
2. Substantiate the Education Department's pupil projections with reference to more reliable population growth statistics such as its own Gwynedd Council Auditor General statistics.
3. Once more realistic pupil estimates are confirmed, illustrate how the mixed class sizes of Ysgol Abersoch and surrounding schools will be in the range of 12-20 for now and the future. This is essential to providing educational excellence to all 200 pupils in the catchment.
4. Formally consult with and share the views of neighbouring schools on the alternatives under consideration.
5. Consider a catchment area review and federalisation as real options that can be pursued.

Yn Hydref 2017, arolygwyd Ysgol Sarn Bach gan farnu pob maes arolygu yn dda. Mae'r cynigiwr yn asesu effaith tebygol y cynnig ar feisydd y fframwaith arolygu. Dangosa hyn y gall effaith positif fod yn bosibl ar les a

Mae Ysgol Abersoch ar hyn o bryd yn gweithredu dan arweiniad penneth mewn gofal tra bod penneth parhaol yn Ysgol Sarn Bach. Mae'r ddwy ysgol wedi eu nodi fel bod yn y categori melyn o ran cefnogaeth a gallu i wella gan Lywodraeth Cymru

Estyn's response to the proposal by Gwynedd Council to close Ysgol Abersoch on 31st August 2021, and provide education for learners at Ysgol Sarn Bach from 1st September 2021

Introduction

This report has been prepared by Her Majesty's Inspectors of Education and Training in Wales.

Under the terms of the School Standards and Organisation (Wales) Act 2013 and its associated Code, proposers are required to send consultation documents to Estyn. However Estyn is not a body which is required to act in accordance with the Code and the Act places no statutory requirements on Estyn in respect of school organisation matters. Therefore as a body being consulted, Estyn will provide their opinion only on the overall merits of school organisation proposals.

Estyn has considered the educational aspects of the proposal and has produced the following response to the information provided by the proposer and other additional information such as data from Welsh Government and the views of the Regional Consortia which deliver school improvement services to the schools within the proposal.

The proposal that is subject to this consultation is by Gwynedd Council. The proposal is to:

- Close Ysgol Abersoch on 31st August 2021, and to offer pupils a place at Ysgol Sarn Bach from 1st September 2021.

Summary/Conclusion

Estyn is of the opinion that this proposal is likely to at least maintain the current standards of primary education in the area.

Description and benefits

The proposal presents a comprehensive case for change that considers the current challenges at Ysgol Abersoch. These include low pupil numbers, a high percentage of surplus places, a broad age range within classes and additional financial resources. Full consideration is given to these challenges.

The proposal considers an appropriate range of possible options:

- Option 1 – No change and continue with the status quo.
- Option 2 – Change the age range of Ysgol Abersoch from 3-8 years to either 3-9 years or 3-11 years.
- Option 3 – Federate with a nearby school.
- Option 4 – Federate with a nearby school, locating the foundation phase on the Ysgol Abersoch site, and KS2 on the site of a nearby school.
- Option 5 – Federate with nearby schools, locating the foundation phase, Years 3 + 4 and Years 5 + 6 on the sites of three different schools.
- Option 6 – Close Ysgol Abersoch and offer a place for the pupils at an alternative school.

- Option 7 – Locate a language centre at the Ysgol Abersoch site.
- Option 8 – Establish a Cylch Meithrin at Ysgol Abersoch.
- Option 9 – Change the age range of Ysgol Abersoch from 3-8 to 3-9 and establish a Cylch Meithrin at Ysgol Abersoch.

The proposal evaluates the options in full before identifying the three most viable options, namely Option 2 (change the age range to 3-11 years), Option 3 and Option 6.

The effect of the three options above on education, transport arrangements and the community is assessed. Following the assessment, the local authority has selected and proposed Option 6, to close Ysgol Abersoch and educate pupils at Ysgol Sarn Bach from 1st September 2021.

The proposal's advantages over maintaining the status quo or another option are as follows:

- Reduce the number of surplus places
- Provide experiences for pupils to socialise and co-operate with peers
- Teach in more suitably-sized classes
- Reduce the cost per head range for all of the county's pupils
- Ensure that pupils transfer once during their primary and secondary education.

The council has given careful consideration to what effect this will have on pupil numbers at the school in September 2021 and two subsequent years. By maintaining the status quo, surplus places at the school would be around 76% and all pupils would be taught in one mixed-age class. This would mean that there would be an age range of 5 years within the class. At the alternative school, Ysgol Sarn Bach, there is sufficient capacity to admit pupils from Ysgol Abersoch in addition to its own pupils. By transferring pupils to the alternative school, a reduction in surplus places to 29% is projected, in addition to a smaller age range within the same class.

In considering transport arrangements, the proposal states that it is not anticipated that any pupil will need to travel an unreasonable distance to school. The current transport arrangements at Ysgol Sarn Bach may need to be adapted should all pupils from the Ysgol Abersoch catchment area transfer there. This would be at an additional cost to the authority.

It appears that the proposer has given appropriate consideration to the effect of the proposal on the Welsh language. It is not anticipated that the proposal will affect the pupils' Welsh education, as the council's Welsh language policy is equally relevant to the alternative school and that there would be continuity in terms of Welsh-medium education.

Educational aspects of the proposal

Standards in both of the affected schools are very similar and, in the most recent inspections, both schools were judged to be good in relation to all key questions or inspection areas.

The proposal considers the outcomes of the most recent Estyn inspections of both schools. Ysgol Abersoch was inspected in June 2017, and all three key questions were judged to be good. Ysgol Sarn Bach was inspected in October 2017, and was judged to be good in all inspection areas. The proposer assesses the proposal's likely effect on the areas of the inspection framework. This shows that there could be a positive effect on wellbeing and learning experiences by closing Ysgol Abersoch and transferring the pupils to Ysgol Sarn Bach. This is as a result of what the local authority has identified about pupils benefitting from experiences to socialise and co-operate with peers.

Although the proposal does not compare the performance of both schools, it is confident that the quality of provision at Ysgol Sarn Bach is as good as the foundation phase provision at Ysgol Abersoch. It is evident that the proposer has given appropriate consideration to the continuity of curricular provision, by suggesting that schools with higher pupil numbers are able to provide a more robust structure when planning and delivering the curriculum.

In its assessment of leadership and management, the proposal quotes from recent inspections, which note that the quality of leadership is good. Ysgol Abersoch is currently operating under the guidance of a teacher in charge, while Ysgol Sarn Bach has a permanent headteacher. Both schools have been identified as being in the yellow category in terms of support and ability to improve by Welsh Government.

It is stated clearly what the proposer expects in terms of the effect on governance and staffing issues. It outlines the support that will be available to staff members at Ysgol Abersoch in particular, who are most affected by the proposal.

The proposer has given due attention to the effect on vulnerable groups of pupils, including those with special educational needs. The proposer gives an assurance that Ysgol Sarn Bach has the facilities to provide equal provision for pupils with special educational needs.

The proposer has planned suitably to consult with pupils. The local authority has prepared suitable documentation to explain the consultation to pupils and seek their views through a simple questionnaire. It is not clear to what extent the local authority will consider the effect on current pupils at Ysgol Sarn Bach.

These are some of the reasons why I think the school should be kept open:

- 1) Nearly all of the bigger villages on Pen Llyn have their own local primary school, but Sarn Bach is the closest option for the children of Abersoch and is not at a convenient walking distance. Ysgol Abersoch is perfect for the kids who live in the village, whose parents aren't able to drive them to school, until they're old enough to catch the bus to Sarn Bach.
- 2) The location of the school is also convenient for learning as it allows for the possibility for more practical, outdoor lessons with the beach and the harbour down the road and the village hall next door.
- 3) Starting in a small school like Ysgol Abersoch is perfect for the kids to form close bonds with each other that will last for the rest of their lives, before moving up to the bigger schools of Sarn Bach and Botwnnog.
- 4) The low teacher to student ratio allows for more one-on-one time, which I'm sure is much more manageable for the teachers, as well as more encouraging for the kids.

dw i'n ysgrifennu i chi yn cofrestu fy siom fi wrth glywed eich bwriad chi i gau Ysgol Abersoch yn ddiweddarach eleni.
Dw i'n dysgwr Gymraeg ond, yn anffodus, dw i'n well siarad Saesneg felly ...

I live in Llanengan and so am very conscious of the hurt that closing Ysgol Abersoch will have on the local community and the Welsh culture particularly the language. Many of my friends attended Ysgol Abersoch as do, or did, their children and they will feel this very keenly as will their extended families and neighbours. In 2018 the village and Canolfan Gymdeithasol Llanengan lost its Cylch Meithrin which this was a severe loss affecting many local families but towards the end of 2019/early 2020 this was replaced by Cylch Methrin Abersoch housed in Ysgol Abersoch and the threat to close the school would almost certainly mean the closure of this new and thriving Cylch Meithrin and the 2 jobs it provides for local people.

I am a volunteer with Gwylwyr y Gglannau and, though I do not speak for them, I am very conscious of the need by the coastguard and other local council and charitable emergency services for young, energetic and, essentially, *local* women and men to provide the very large number of people who make up these teams. We are currently 3 members short of a full crew and have great difficulty recruiting and retaining team members who live and work close enough to be able to don tools and be at the station in time to attend the many emergency calls we receive each year. These services – the Coastguard, the RNLI, retained Firefighters and first responders to name a few - rely on being within a living village and a huge part of the draw for the families who provide these crew members, now and in the future, is their being a good village school – Ysgol Abersoch isn't good, it's great as I'm sure you've heard in other testimonies. Long term, and perhaps sooner, the loss of Ysgol Abersoch will lead to fewer and fewer families living close enough to Abersoch to provide enough crew to keep these essential emergency services viable which would push back provision of cover and the costs implied onto Gwynedd council. Having a local school isn't just about being able to walk or cycle there, it goes much deeper than that and short term savings can and will have much longer term costs both material and cultural.

Finally, please give due consideration to this and the many other testimonies that you will receive before coming to a decision that, depending on the outcome, could do irrevocable damage to the village of Abersoch.

Concerning the draft proposal to close Ysgol Abersoch on the 31st August and transfer the existing pupils to Ysgol Sarn Bach.

This proposal was drafted at meetings held at Gwynedd Council Cabinet on the 15th September and 3rd November 2020

The costs to finance the continuation of funding Ysgol Abersoch as stated appear high and are not transparent enough to comment upon.

The numbers of pupils projected for future years are at best a guess based on past trends. If there is no village school then the numbers will not have a chance to increase.

There is now a new on-site Cylch Meithrin recently installed and the governors have urged the Cabinet to allow the program "time to flourish", which may influence new pupils to join. The school is also registering to become a 'Beach School'

Outdoor learning is proven to provide positive outcomes to help children learn, particularly those who find it hard to engage with classroom-based education.

Where better to learn maths, english, science, nature, conservation and teamwork than in an inspirational marine environment. The Beach School would be a unique learning opportunity for current and future pupils. At a time when the government is actively encouraging learning outside the classroom, beach schools offer a wonderful opportunity in an outstanding environment to all schools and children.

One of the possible reasons that numbers of pupils has not risen over the past few years is the lack of affordable housing for people working in the village on low basic wages this has forced young families to move out to cheaper housing in the surrounding area.

To close the local village school would severely damage the fabric of Abersoch village retaining its status as a thriving local village community with an integrated school of many years standing to continue and preserve the ability to provide local education of children from aged 3 to 8 into the Welsh language, history and culture.

The Gwynedd Council Plan 2018-23 sets as one of its well-being objectives the aims to ensure that all residents can live in a community where the Welsh language is a natural part of life.

No other village in the area under consideration has such an integrated village with Abersoch having local businesses, shops, pubs, cafes, beaches, a harbour, tourist office, garages, golf course etc. and now a school under threat of closure.

To close the school would take the heart out of the village, no longer would residents, second home owners, tourists and visitors see and hear the voices of young pupils going to and from school or hear them enjoying playing in the yard during school breaks.

It is understood there is a cost to continue keeping the school open but surely the benefits would outweigh the costs of its future prospects.

Now that Gwynedd Council are planning to double the council tax on second homes to 100 per cent it is possible to consider using some of this extra money to fund local infrastructure such as local schools.

In the current situation of Covid 19 and all its restrictions, to not to be able to discuss this matter further face to face, is very unfortunate and so it is a good enough reason to postpone the decision.

In my own case I live in Llanengan and work in Abersoch. My family and friends all went to Ysgol Abersoch.

My Niece and Nephew went there and now my friends children have been and are educated there.

If the school is closed and pupils move to Sarn Bach their Welsh education will be continued but Abersoch will lose a vital facility of a local school to bind the village together, there will be less Welsh spoken and the community will suffer. As a consequence of this loss of local culture and integration, Abersoch will become ever more a second home area and not a local community.

Please reconsider your proposal or at least defer the decision for at least another 2 years to see what effect the new Cylch Meithrin and Beach School have on the number of pupils attending.

Therefore I am opposed to the Gwynedd Council Cabinet current proposal to close Ysgol Abersoch from August 2021

Mae Ysgol Abersoch yn rhoi dechrau rhagorol mewn bywyd i'r plant sydd wedi derbyn y faint i'w fynychu, ysgol sydd yn cynnig ymdeimlad o berthyn ac yn deulu, lle mae'r iau, a'r hŷn, yn naturiol yn dysgu o bob un gyda'i gilydd. Nid yw'n bosibl rhoi pris ar yr hyn y mae Ysgol Abersoch yn ei roi i'n plant.

Mae'r ysgol yn rhan annatod o'r gymuned. O dan arweiniad gofalus ein penneth, Linda Jones, mae'r disgyblion yn chwarae rhan allweddol yn y gwaith o hyrwyddo'r iaith Gymraeg a diwylliant Cymru, drwy fentrau llwyddiannus fel annog siopau lleol i gyflwyno arwyddion dwyieithog a chymryd rhan mewn digwyddiadau lleol. Mae'r rhain yn gyfleoedd gwerthfawr i gyfalafu ar ein cynnig unigryw a hyrwyddo ein treftadaeth i gynulleidfa ehangach.

Mae'r gefnogaeth y mae'r ysgol yn ei dderbyn o'r gymuned yn amlwg a chadarn, ond efallai yn fwy o syndod yw'r gefnogaeth a gynigir gan y di-Gymraeg. Mae hyn yn arwydd clir, er gwaethaf y seisnigeiddio ymddangosiadol o Abersoch, fod yr iaith a'r diwylliant Cymraeg yn uchel eu gwerth, ac yn ddiofyn yn cynrychioli'r angen i ddiogelu, cynnal a chryfhau'r asedau hyn.

Mae cymunedau ledled y byd yn llais pwysig i'w glywed. Yn ymgyrchu dros ein hysgolion, neu gyfleusterau cyhoeddus eraill, mae democratiaeth yn disgwl chwarae teg ac ystyriaeth briodol. Mae gan aelodau etholedig y Cabinet, er nad ydynt yn lleol i Abersoch, ddyletswydd o gyfrifoldeb ar bob cymuned ledled Gwynedd. Disgwylir iddynt fod yn wrthrychol yn eu penderfyniadau, gan weithredu er budd y cyhoedd a chydag uniondeb. Rwyf yn cwestiynu, yn achos Ysgol Abersoch, a fydd gwrandawiad teg yn cael ei gynnal o ystyried lefel siomedig y drafodaeth a welwyd yng nghyfarfodydd cynharach y Cabinet, ac ar ôl cais y

Pwyllgor Craffu i ailymweld â'r penderfyniad i fwrw ymlaen â'r ymgynghoriad. Mae ymdeimlad o 'fait accompli' yn eistedd yn anesmwyth iawn ochr yn ochr â'r sylwadau goddrychol a rhagfarnllyd a gyflwynir yn y dogfennau ymgynghori, wedi'u fframio i gyflawni nod yr Adran Addysg i gau Ysgol Abersoch.

Ni fyddai'n afresymol, o ystyried y goblygiadau difrifol sydd yn y fantol yma, ddisgwyl iaelodau etholedig – a gyda thal - herio uniondeb y dogfennau hyn yn hytrach na chymeradwyo'n unfrydol gynigion a gyflwynwyd gan swyddogion y Cyngor, heb gymryd unrhyw gyfrifoldeb personol dros ddwyr y Cyngor i gyfrif.

Mae hefyd angen tynnu sylw'r Cabinet at y gwahaniaeth rhwng yr amcanestyniadau disgylion ardal leol a gyflwynir yn y dogfennau ymgynghori sy'n ymddangos i awgrymu gostyngiad mawr mewn niferoedd disgylion, ac amcangyfrifon Llywodraeth Cymru¹ a Cyngor Gwynedd² sy'n niferoedd sefydlog a chynyddol ledled Cymru a Gwynedd. Gellir cynnig bod hyn yn ganlyniad i amcanestyniadau a wnaed gan benaethiaid sydd ddim yn preswyllo yn y dalgylch, gan seilio eu rhagamcanion ar dueddiadau diweddar yn hytrach na thystiolaeth sy'n cynnig amcangyfrifon mwy dibynadwy. Er enghraifft, gwyddom am o leiaf 11 o blant yn nalgylch Ysgol Abersoch a fyddai'n gymwys i ddechrau yn ystod y 3 blynedd nesaf o gymharu â rhagamcaniad yr Adran Addysg o 7. Oni ddylai'r Cyngor ystyried newidiadau amlwg yn y boblogaeth leol a rhagamcanion ffurfiol, cyhoeddedig yn hytrach na rhagamcanion a allai fod yn ddi-sail ac yn gamarweiniol?

Yr hyn sydd wedi ein harwain fwyaf i'r sefyllfa bresennol hon yw methiant Cyngor Gwynedd i gynnal ei bolisiau cyhoeddedig ei hun o ran capasiti a dewis rhieni. Mae'r ffaith fod yr Adran Addysg wedi caniatáu i Ysgol Llanbedrog derbyn mwy nag 20% o blant dros ei gapasiti, gyda 43% o'i disgylion o'r tu allan i'r dalgylch pan fo capasiti ar gael mewn ysgolion cyfagos yn enghraifft o hyn. Mae'r Adran Addysg, er mwyn gwasanaethu ei hangen ei hun, yn amlwg yn ddewisol ym mha un o'i pholisiau y mae'n dewis ei gweithredu ac felly mae'n uniongyrchol atebol am y sefyllfa yr ydym yn ei chael ein hunain ynddynt. Byddwn yn disgwyl, o ran budd y cyhoedd, y bydd y Cabinet yn dwyn yr Adran Addysg i gyfrif am ei methiant i ddilyn ei pholisiau ysgrifenedig ei hun.

Y fater sy'n gyrru'r ymgynghoriad yw'r gost fesul disgyl. Ac eto, mae'r ymgynghoriad yn defnyddio dadleuon ategol megis pwysigrwydd 'lles' a 'addysgu'r plant mewn dosbarthiadau o faint mwy addas' i gyflawni'r angen hwn. Maint presennol y dosbarth yn Ysgol Abersoch yw 10 o blant, ac yn Ysgol Sarn Bach maint cyfartalog y dosbarth yw 24, sydd eisoes yn fwy na datganiad Cyngor Gwynedd yn 'Strategaeth Addysg Gynradd o'r Ansawdd Gorau'. Mae'n peri penbleth y gall Cyngor Gwynedd gyfiawnhau gwthio drwy benderfyniad a fydd yn cynyddu maint dosbarthiadau uwchlau ei arfer gorau ei hun ar sail 'lles'. O ystyried cyd-destun y dogfennau ymgynghori, mae'n ymddangos nad yw'r Adran Addysg yn ystyried y ddarpariaeth addysg bresennol yn Ysgol Abersoch i gynhyrchu 'dinasyyddion dwyieithog, llwyddiannus a chyflawn' mewn 'cymdeithas naturiol Gymraeg'.

Serch hynny, mae cyfle yma i gael 'stori newydd da'. Mae gan Abersoch, er gwell neu'n waeth, broffil uchel yng Ngwynedd. Rydym yn gymuned nad yw heb ein heriau, yn ymdrechu i gadw ein 'Cymreictod' yn fyw, mae anawsterau gyda thai a chyfleoedd cyflogaeth drwy gydol y flwyddyn. Ac eto, fel pentref, mae'n dyrnu uwchlau ei bwysau; mae dros 50 o siopau llewyrchus, sy'n darparu cyflogaeth ac incwm i'r Cyngor. Mae'r dyfodol yn ddisglair, gyda chynlluniau ar gyfer gwesty mawr ar y gweill â chyflogaeth bellach; mae ynni o

Dear Education Department and Cabinet Members,

I write to express my strong objections to the proposed closure of Ysgol Abersoch on 31 August 2021. The past few years have not been the easiest for our school, especially recently being without our headteacher, and I would like to thank the Education Department for its commitment and efforts in putting together arrangements to ensure we have had temporary headteachers in place.

As a past-pupil, past-parent and present governor, Ysgol Abersoch is important to me. Gwynedd Council's proposal to close this special school fills me with sadness and a sense of loss. Ysgol Abersoch provides an excellent start in life to those children blessed to attend, offers a sense of belonging and is a family, where the younger, and older, naturally learn from each together. It is not possible to put a price on what Ysgol Abersoch gives to our children.

The school is integral to the community. Under the careful leadership of our headteacher, Linda Jones, the pupils form a key role in promoting the Welsh language and culture, through initiatives such as successfully encouraging local shops to introduce bilingual signage and taking part in local events. These are perfect opportunities to capitalize on our unique offering and promote our heritage to a wider audience.

The support the school receives from the community goes without saying, but what may be more surprising is the support offered by non-Welsh speakers. This is a clear signal that despite the apparent anglicization of Abersoch, the Welsh language and culture is highly prized, and by default represents a need to protect, sustain and strengthen these assets.

Communities worldwide are an important voice to be heard. Be it campaigning for our schools, or other public facilities, democracy expects fair play and due consideration. Elected Cabinet members, whilst not local to Abersoch, have a duty of responsibility to all communities across Gwynedd. They are expected to be objective in their decision-making, acting in the public interest and with integrity. I question whether, in the case of Ysgol Abersoch, a fair hearing will take place given the disappointing level of discussion observed in earlier Cabinet meetings, and in light of the Scrutiny Committee's request to re-visit the decision to go ahead with the consultation. A sense of 'fait accompli' sits very uneasily alongside the subjective, biased representations presented in the consultation documents, framed to meet the Education Department's goal

to shut Ysgol Abersoch. It would not be unreasonable, given the serious implications at stake here, to expect that the elected - and paid - Cabinet members challenge the integrity of these documents rather than unanimously endorse proposals put forward by Council officials without taking any personal responsibility for holding the Council to account.

It would also not be amiss to bring to the Cabinet's attention the disparity between the local area pupil projections presented in the consultation documents which appear to suggest a nosediving of pupil numbers, and those of Welsh Government¹ and Gwynedd Council² estimates that show stable and increasing numbers across Wales and Gwynedd. It could be surmised that this is a result of projections made by headteachers who are not resident with the catchment area, basing their projections on recent trends rather than substantiated evidence offering more reliable estimates. For example, we know of at least 11 potential children in Ysgol Abersoch catchment area who would be eligible to start in the next 3 years compared to the Education Department's projected 7. Should the Council not take into account evident local population changes and formal, published projections rather than potentially unsubstantiated and misleading projections?

What has most led us into this present position though is Gwynedd Council's failure to uphold its own published policies in terms of capacity and parental preference. That the Education Department has allowed Ysgol Llanbedrog to become more than 20% oversubscribed with 43% of its pupils from out of catchment when there is capacity in neighbouring schools exemplifies this. The Education Department, to serve its own need, is clearly selective in which of its policies it chooses to implement and is thus directly accountable for the situation we find ourselves in. I would expect, in terms of public interest, that the Cabinet will hold the Education Department to account for its failure to follow its own written policies.

The elephant in the room that is driving the consultation is the cost per pupil. Yet the consultation uses supporting arguments such as the importance of 'well-being' and 'ensuring that children are educated in more suitably-sized class' to fulfill this need. The current class size at Ysgol Abersoch is 10 children, whilst at Ysgol Sarn Bach the average class size is 24, already in excess of Gwynedd Council's Excellent Primary Education for Children in Gwynedd position statement. It is puzzling that Gwynedd Council can justify pushing through a decision that will increase class sizes above its own best practice on the basis of 'well-being'. Given the context of the consultation documents it would appear that the Education Department does not consider the present education provision at Ysgol Abersoch to produce 'bilingual, successful and well-rounded citizens' in a 'naturally Welsh speaking society'.

Nonetheless, there is opportunity here for a 'good news story'. Abersoch, for better or worse, has a high profile within Gwynedd. We are a community not without our challenges, striving to keep our 'Cymreictod' alive, there are difficulties with housing and year-round employment opportunities. Yet as a village it punches well above its weight; there are in excess of 50 flourishing shop floor businesses, providing employment and income to the council. The future is bright, with plans for a large hotel complex bringing further employment; there is an energy within our village to push boundaries, improve our offerings and to do this in a way that showcases Welsh culture.

By thinking innovatively, the small cost to keep Ysgol Abersoch open give the Welsh language and culture the visibility it deserves, rather than giving it to the wave of anglicization and second-home owners. Keeping the school open is an essential part of this.

I am confident that the Cylch Meithrin and Beach School initiatives will, given time, support a thriving school in our local community. In doing so, there is potential for enormous gain as we champion our Welshness.

There is scope to try something different here. Let's not waste this opportunity to do something more imaginative, rather than follow the easy, but irreversible option with long-lasting consequences, in closing the school.

The past year has been a challenge for us all and is continuing to be for the foreseeable future. Most of us have never experienced the detriment of the Coronavirus pandemic in our lifetime and probably won't again.

The virus lockdowns we have all had to manage, has meant village/ community life has become more than ever important, looking out for one and other, being kind, helping when help has been needed, keeping peoples spirits up in dark times. You cannot put a cost on Life, Well-Being, A Village Community, Strong Spirit and A Close & Supportive Bond and all this starts with our children and Their School - Ysgol Abersoch- which is so vital for our generation and future generations.

This school is the lifeline for so many including the teaching jobs and needs to continue to be so.

I accept the vast responsibilities the council has and the legal duties to promote high educational standards locally.



Mae'r modd diystyriol y mae potensial y Cylch Ti a Fi a Cylch Meithrin newydd wedi eu trin yn destun pryder mawr. Mae hyn yn fy arwain i gwestiynu didwylledd bwriad y Cyngor, a fynegwyd yng nghyfarfod rhanddeiliaid cyntaf yr adolygiad anffurfiol, i gefnogi a helpu'r ysgol i ddod o hyd i ffyrdd o gynyddu nifer y disgryblion i lefel fwy cynaliadwy. Mae'r tablau yn yr asesiadau hyn yn parhau i gynnwys gwybodaeth ffug, er enghraifft nid oes eglwys na chapel yn Sarn Bach. Fel cyn-ddisgybl Ysgol Sarn Bach, cefais fy synnu o ddarganfod bod yr ysgol, yn ôl map yn yr adroddiad, wedi symud i gaeau Fferm Ty Newydd. Mae gwallau mewn ffeithiau a gwybodaeth mor sylfaenol yn parhau i danseilio fy hyder ym meysydd mwy cymhleth yr adroddiad.

Mae'r adroddiad yn tynnu sylw at sefyllfa bryderus iawn yn Ysgol Llanbedrog, lle gwelwn niferoedd y disgryblion ymhell dros gapasiti'r ysgol, gan arwain at sefyllfa lle nad yw plant o'r pentref hwnnw'n gallu mynchu eu hysgol bentref eu hunain. Mae hyn hefyd yn effeithio ar ysgolion cyfagos fel Ysgol Abersoch lle mae capasiti, ac mae'n ymddangos yn eithaf rhyfeddol i mi fod y sefyllfa hon wedi cael parhau i gael ei gwirio. Mae'r Adran Addysg yn rhoi pwyslais mawr ar ddata lleoedd dros ben a chapasiti ysgol, yr wyf yn deall sy'n cael ei gyfrifo gan ddefnyddio fformiwla. Ymddengys bod hyn wedi cael ei ddiystyr u'n llwyr yn achos Ysgol Llanbedrog, a byddwn yn awgrymu y gallai hyn arwain at effaith ar ganlyniadau dysgu disgryblion, heb sôn am faterion iechyd a diogelwch posib gorlenwi? Os nad yw data gallu yn cael ei ystyried yn arbennig o bwysig mewn gwirionedd, yna pam y dylid ei ddefnyddio fel ffactor wrth adeiladu'r achos i gau'r ysgol?

Derbynir bod ysgolion gwledig yn ôl eu natur bron bob amser yn ysgolion bach, ond nid yw eu maint yn arwydd o'u pwysigrwydd i'w cymuned. Yn ei 'Study of Economics as if People Mattered', ysgrifennodd E F Schumacher 'Small is Beautiful', ac mae'n ymddangos yn amser priodol i ychwanegu 'and Safer' nawr, ar ôl y gwersi a ddysgwyt o'r pandemig. Nid oes

unrhyw adran ar fantolen i roi gwerthoedd lles cymuned neu ddiwylliant, oherwydd yn syml, nid yw'n bosibl cloriannu pwysigrwydd ehangach ysgol mewn termau ariannol yn unig. Nid oes unman yn fwy amlwg nag yn achos Abersoch, cymuned sy'n drech nag ail gartrefi, lle mai'r ysgol fwy neu lai yw'r unig symbol sy'n weddill o iaith, diwylliant a threftadaeth Gymraeg yn y pentref.

Mae Ysgol Abersoch mewn sefyllfa dda yng nghanol y pentref, gan alluogi mynediad hawdd i gynifer o adnoddau naturiol heb faich costau cludo gwaharddol, ac mae'r disgylion hyd yn oed yn defnyddio opsiwn economaidd ac amgylcheddol gyfeillgar y gwasanaeth bws cyhoeddus i fynychu gwersi nofio wythnosol yn Pwllheli. Mae cynaliadwyedd cymunedau gwledig ym mhobman yn cael eu bygwth gan gostau cynnal adnoddau pwysig fel capeli, llyfrgelloedd a neuaddau pentref. Mae ein pentref yn hynod ffodus bod Neuadd Abersoch yn cael ei ariannu'n dda iawn gan refeniw o'i faes parcio, ac mae'n faint i'r ysgol gyfagos fwynhau'r defnydd am ddim o gyfleusterau rhagorol y neuadd. Mae gan y neuadd ddigon o le ar gyfer gweithgareddau dan do, gan gynnwys llwyfan gwych, sy'n cynnig cyfle gwych i'r disgylion arddangos eu sgiliau perfformio mewn dathliadau amrywiol trwy gydol y flwyddyn, ond yn enwedig yn y Cyngerdd Nadolig, lle gwahoddir y gymuned gyfan iddo. Mae caeau chwarae'r pentref, dim ond taith gerdded fer i ffwrdd hefyd ar gael am ddim i'r ysgol, lle cynhaliwyd diwrnodau chwaraeon yno yn y gorffennol.

However, on watching the recording of the initial Cabinet meeting, in which permission was sought to hold a Statutory Consultation on the proposal to close Ysgol Abersoch, I was shocked to see almost no engagement from Cabinet members on this important issue, prior to the votes being cast. I had naively expected to see some discussion or debate take place. Unfortunately, witnessing this lack of interest confirmed my suspicions that the decision to go forward with the Consultation had already been made, well before the Cabinet members entered the meeting, and furthermore, that the whole process has been a tick box exercise from the beginning, with the council just going through the motions to give the impression of meaningful consultation.

I remain to be convinced of a good reason why not a single option suggested by the stakeholders merited inclusion in the final three options. Therefore, I hope you understand why it is hard to shake the feeling that, despite the informal review process, the proposal to close Ysgol Abersoch has actually been the only item on the agenda from the start. The determination and urgency to achieve this aim has been prepared to ignore the unprecedented restrictions on society of a pandemic, forging ahead with a process which, although legally allowed, is considered by many to be morally wrong.

I am hard pressed to find anything in the documents that shines a light on the success or achievements of the school, nor is there any reference to the extraordinary circumstances and impact of Covid 19, let alone the long-term implications of Coronavirus which should surely be reflected in strategy and planning of resources from now on?

The dismissive manner in which the potential of the newly established Cylch Ti a Fi and Cylch Meithrin has been treated, is a cause of great concern. This leads me to question the sincerity of the Council's intention, expressed in the first stakeholder meeting of the informal review, to support and help the school to find ways to increase pupil numbers to a more sustainable level. Our positive actions and suggestions in response to this, including the Mudiad Meithrin supported initiatives, along with the Beach School concept, and the addition of an extra school year, are all options that have a real chance of positively impacting the long term sustainability of Ysgol Abersoch, and I, along with many others, believe they should be given a fair chance to flourish.

I consider much of the content of the consultation documents to be presented in a misleading and unfair manner. For example, the age range at Ysgol Abersoch is three years less than the age range of the neighbouring schools, with whom it is constantly compared across a range of data, meaning a lot of the information presented is not comparing like with like, rendering it at best very confusing, and at worst almost meaningless. I notice that some of the data on the use of the Welsh language presented in the draft documents, has been disregarded in favour of a different set of data that more favourably suits the anti Ysgol Abersoch narrative, thereby adding strength to the argument which tries to justify the proposal to close the school.

I have been very disappointed to see the superficial nature of the Community and Language Impact Assessments in particular, which appear to be prepared without any actual community input. I simply do not accept the finding that there will be no impact on the Welsh language in Abersoch if the school were to close. The tables in these assessments continue to contain false information, for example there is no church or chapel in Sarn Bach. As a former pupil of Ysgol Sarn Bach, I was very surprised to discover that, according to a map in the report, the school has moved into the fields of Fferm Ty Newydd. Inaccuracies in such basic facts and information continue to undermine my confidence in the more complex areas of the report.

The report highlights a very worrying situation in Ysgol Llanbedrog, where we see pupil numbers well over school capacity, leading to a situation where children from that village are not able to attend their own village school. This also impacts neighbouring schools such as Ysgol Abersoch where there is capacity, and it seems quite extraordinary to me that this situation has been allowed to continue unchecked. The Education Department places great emphasis on data of surplus places and a school's capacity, which I understand is calculated using a formula. This appears to have been completely disregarded in the case of Ysgol Llanbedrog, and I would suggest this could lead to an impact upon pupil learning outcomes, not to mention possible health and safety issues of over-crowding? If in fact capacity data is not considered particularly important, then why should it be used as a factor in building the case to close a school?

It is accepted that rural schools by their nature are almost always small schools, but their size is not an indication of their importance to their community. In his 'Study of Economics as if People Mattered', E F Schumacher wrote 'Small is Beautiful', and it seems an appropriate

time to now add '*and Safer*', after the lessons learned from the pandemic. There is no section in a balance sheet in which to put the values of wellbeing of a community or culture, because it is simply not possible to quantify the wider importance of a school in purely financial terms. Nowhere is this more apparent than in the case of Abersoch, a community which is overrun with second homes, where the school is virtually the only remaining symbol of Welsh language, culture and heritage in the village.

Ysgol Abersoch is well placed in the centre of the village, enabling easy access to so many natural resources without the burden of prohibitive transport costs, and the pupils even use the economic and environmentally friendly option of the public service bus to attend weekly swimming lessons in Pwllheli. The sustainability of rural communities everywhere is threatened by the costs of maintaining important resources such as chapels, libraries and village halls. Our village is extremely fortunate that Neuadd Abersoch is very well funded by revenue from its car park, and the adjacent school is privileged to enjoy the free use of the hall's excellent facilities. The hall has plenty of room for indoor activities, including a marvelous stage, which offers the pupils a wonderful opportunity to showcase their performance skills in various celebrations throughout the year, but especially at the Christmas Concert, to which the whole community is invited. The village playing fields, just a short walk away are also freely available to the school, which has hosted sports days there in the past.

Ysgol Abersoch also acts as a valuable bridge, welcoming and integrating newly arrived families into the heart of our diverse community, encouraging and promoting the benefits of bilingualism and celebrating Welsh culture.

The closure of Ysgol Abersoch would sever the continuity of community and connections of generations of families educated at this village school, some of whose descendants are honoured to serve on the present board of governors. We are bound by a shared sense of heritage and belonging to this special place, and our strongly held conviction that Abersoch deserves a school, along with a determination not to lose Welsh as a living language in the centre of the village.

Closing a school is a serious matter and I would expect serious questions, and challenging debate over the detail of the consultation documents, along with fair consideration of the matters raised by stakeholders received during the consultation period, before any decision is made.

I fervently hope that those in positions of power will seize the opportunity to show their wholehearted support for the Welsh language and the value of community by finding a way to keep Ysgol Abersoch open for the benefit of the generations of children to come.

Rwyf yn rhiant i ddu o fechgyn (8 oed a 6 oed) sydd wedi symud ym Medi 2020 i Ysgol Sarn Bach o Ysgol Foel Gron, lle'r roeddwn hefyd yn Llywodraethwr ar ran y Cyngor Cymuned.

Mae fy mab hynaf yn blentyn gydag anghenion arbennig; yn Foel Gron fo oedd yr unig fachgen yn ei flwyddyn, a'i frawd oedd ei ffrind pennaf o'r herwydd. Fe benderfynom symud y plant i ysgol gyda gwell trawsdoriad o ran rhyw - penderfyniad anodd gan fod amharu ar yrfa ysgol yn enwedig i blentyn sydd yn cael addysg yn anodd, yn peri pryder.

Roedd fy mhlant hefyd yn mynychu Ysgol Abersoch i fynd i glwb yr Urdd a'r Clwb Crefft, lle roeddent yn mwynhau yn fawr. Oni bai mai dim ond blwyddyn fyddai gan yr hynaf cyn symud i fyny i Sarn Bach - a phoeni am symud plentyn ddwywaith mewn dwy flynedd - yna symud i Ysgol Abersoch yn bendant fyddai ein dewis cyntaf wedi bod. Petai 'opsiwn 9' - a gynigwyd yn y cyfarfod lleol - ar gael, yn Ysgol Abersoch fyddai fy mhlant heddiw.

Fel person lleol sydd wedi byw'r rhan fwyaf o'm bywyd ym mhlwyf Llanengan ac yn gyn-gynghorydd cymunedol ar ward Abersoch, rwyf yn teimlo yn gryf na ddylid cau'r ysgol.

Yn wir fy nghred yw mai gwir fwriad y cyngor yw cau cymaint o ysgolion bach â phosib, i gael rheoli llai o ysgolion mwy. Mae'r polisi wedi bod yn cropian ers degawd a mwy. Canlyniad y bwriad hwn yw'r bwriad i gau Ysgol Abersoch. Torri ar ariannu yw'r nod. Y drafferth efo torri yw'r difrod o dorri gormod. A'r dioddefwyr fydd triglion cymuned Abersoch.

Mae'r gymuned Gymreig yn Abersoch er yn fach erbyn heddiw, yn un gref. Mae'r Ysgol yn rhan bwysig o hyn, a brofir gyda gwobr aur y Siarter Iaith. Mae polisiau Gwynedd wedi caniatáu i Abersoch fod yn bentref gwyliau (ail gartrefi) mwyaf proffidiol y Sir o ran trethi, a bwriedir cynnydd pellach. Yn ôl ystadegau'r cyngor mae Plwyf Llanengan yn cyfrannu dros 4% o'r dreth a gesglir yng Ngwynedd, dros £3,000,000. Ar ôl tynnau 'presept' y Cyngor Cymuned a chyfraniad yr Heddlu, mae hyn yn gadael dros £2.3 miliwn. Oni ddylai canran cyfrannol o'r dreth hon fynd i gefnogi cnewylllyn Cymreig y pentref ac adnodd pwysig i drigolion llai breintiedig y ward?

Gwneir defnydd llawn o gyfleostrau gwych y Neuadd Bentref gyfagos, a darperir gwersi nofio trwy'r flwyddyn. Ymgysyllta'r disgyblion â'r gymuned trwy gyflwyniad arloesol o'r cwricwlwm a wêl y plant allan yn y pentref yn rheolaidd. Trefnir amrywiol glybiau ar-ôl-ysgol, gan gynnwys Cangen Tudwal o'r Urdd, sy'n cynnig gweithgareddau a chyfleoedd cymdeithasol trwy gyfrwng y Gymraeg. Tra bod meintiau dosbarthiadau yn llai

Rhoddir pwyslais arbennig ar ddatblygiad iaith, personol, cymdeithasol ac emosiynol plant. Dyfarnwyd arian nawdd o £12,500 gan y Mudiad fel rhan o raglen i gefnogi ac annog profiadau'r iaith Gymraeg yn y blynnyddoedd cynnar i gydfynd â Strategaeth Miliwn o Siaradwyr Cymraeg erbyn 2050 Llywodraeth Cymru. Enwebwyd y Cylch am wobr yng Ngwobrau Blynnyddol y Mudiad Meithrin, sy'n adlewyrchiad gwych o'r gofal plant o'r safon uchaf a gynigir. Cynigia'r Cylch gyflwyniad a throsglwyddiad didrafferth i Ysgol Abersoch. Yn wir, ymunodd dau o gyn-blant y Cylch Meithrin â'r pum disgyl newydd a ddaeth i'r ysgol ym mis Medi 2020.

Chwaraea'r mentrau pwysig hyn rôl hanfodol yn y gymuned, gan ddarparu profiadau a gwasanaethau gofal plant blynnyddoedd cynnar ond, y tebygrwydd yw y collir hwy pe caeid yr ysgol.

Mae'r ffaith bod yr Adran Addysg wedi diystyru effaith y Cylch Meithrin ar nifer y disgylion yn hepgoriad difrifol.

Cam positif proactif arall yw hyfforddiant a chofrestru fel Ysgol Draeth (Atodiad A) i gywiro tyfiant a chynaladwyedd. Mae lleoliad Ysgol Abersoch yn ddelfryadol ar gyfer datblygu'r cysyniad gwych hwn, drwy gyflenwi ethos a gweledigaeth i'n hysgol. Heb amheuaeth, mae profiad Covid yn cyflymu'r symbyliad o fanteisio ar y cyfle i fabwysiadu'r awyr agored fel adnodd dysgu. Mae gan y cynllun unigryw hwn y potensial i gynnig cyfleoedd cynhyrfus i'w rhannu ag ysgolion eraill y dalgylch, gan fod yn llwyfan i brosiect blaenllaw gosodiad addysg prif ffrwd yng Ngwynedd. Saif Ysgol Abersoch mewn man delfryadol ac unigryw i gerdded i'r traethau, twyni, harbwr ac afon i wneud yn fawr o'r adnoddau naturiol sydd o'i hamgylch er budd pob grŵp oedran. Dysga a datblyga disgyblion yn yr amgylchedd naturiol, gan gynnau eu cymhellion cynhenid i chwiliota, creu a chwilfrydedd am y byd o'u hamgylch, gan ysbrydoli meddwlgarwch a dychymyg plant. Darpara'r ysgol gyfoeth o gyfleoedd dysgu o redeg yn ffri ar hyd y traeth, cynnau Tân a thostio malws melys, ysgrifennu yn y tywod â phriciau, gwyliau adar, dilyn ôl troed anifeiliaid, neidio dros y tonnau, chwiliota cynefinoedd crancod, i wyliau'r melinau gwynt lleol yn gweithio. Cofrestrwyd ein Pennaeth i fynychu hyfforddiant Ysgol Awyr Agored/Traeth y llynedd ond, yn anffodus, oherwydd profedigaeth deuluo ni allai fynychu ac, yn dilyn hynny, rhoddodd Covid ddiwedd yn syth ar unrhyw gwrs hyfforddiant uniongyrchol yn y tymor byr.

A all Cyngor Gwynedd fanteisio ar y cyfle i archwilio cam i gyfeiriad gwahanol trwy mabwysiadu agwedd arloesol i addysg yng Ngwynedd, gan fanteisio ar ein hadnoddau naturiol

[Amcanestyniadau Disgyblion](#)

Awgryma darogau yr Adran Addysg yr hanera niferoedd disgyblion Ysgol Sarn Bach o fewn y bum mlynedd nesaf. Ymddengys y sylfeinir y rhain ar asesiadau penaethiaid ond, eto, rhagamcana Crynodeb Archwiliad Blynnyddol Cyngor Gwynedd 20201 gynnydd mewn poblogaeth o 5.3% rhwng 2020 a 2040 gan gynnwys cynnydd o 0.4% yn nifer y plant. Ymddengys y ffafria'r Adran Addysg ddibynnu ar asesiadau anffurfiol penaethiaid sydd ddim yn byw yn y gymuned i gefnogi ei dadleuon dros gau, yn hytrach na daroganiadau ffurfiol a gyhoeddwyd gan y Cyngor. Dengys rhagolygon Adran Addysg y Cyngor dueddiad cryn dipyn gwahanol i'r boblogaeth Gymreig ehangach a'r Archwilydd Cyffredinol. O ganlyniad, dylid talu sylw gofalus iawn i ystod realistig o senarios wrth ystyried darpariaeth addysg gynradd yn yr ardal. Pan weithredir rhagamcanion yr Archwilydd Cyffredinol am niferoedd plant, deil niferoedd disgyblion yn ddiwyro wrth gydfynd â blynnyddoedd diweddar ac nid ydynt yn gostwng: pe caeir Ysgol Abersoch, dynoda ein dadansoddiad yr addysgir 100% o blant mewn dosbarthiadau goraint cymysg (uchafswm maint dosbarth 20) yn y dalgylch lleol. Derbyniwyd ceisiadau oddi wrth rieni a disgyblion am gynnwys blwyddyn ychwanegol yn Ysgol Abersoch, a chredwn yn gryf y buasai cynnwys addysg Blwyddyn 4 o fudd enfawr mewn sawl ffordd. Rydym yn hapus 'meddwl tu allan i'r blwch' ac ni ddeallwn pam, dim ond oherwydd bod y model hwn yn wahanol i fwyafri ysgolion, o ganlyniad na allai fod yn bosibl. Cynyddid niferoedd y disgyblion heb effeithio ar ysgolion cyfagos gan mai ond oedi trosglwyddiad y plant i'w hysgol nesaf a wneid. Mae yna grwpio naturiol mewn dosbarthiadau o Flynyddoedd 3 a 4 a Blynnyddoedd 5 a 6 mewn ysgolion cyfagos felly, mae'r syniad hwn yn ffitio'n daclus. Ar y cyd â Thi a Fi, gallai addysg i gynnwys Blwyddyn 4 gynnig pecyn hirdymor o ymrwymiad, parhad a sefydlogrwydd i blentyn a'i rieni hyd at wyth neu naw mlynedd. Mae gan hyn botensial mawr i adeiladu cysylltiadau ar bob lefel o fewn yr ysgol a'r gymuned ehangach a, hefyd, buasai'n annog mwy o rieni

Eto, nid yw natur yr ymarfer 'ticio'r blwch' hwn yn cynnwys mewnbwn gan y gymuned ac felly ni all ystyried y gwir effaith ar yr iaith a'r gymuned. Mae disgyblion Ysgol Abersoch yn llysgenhadon i ddyfodol yr iaith a'r diwylliant Cymraeg â'r capaciti i effeithio ar wir newid, fel y tystiolaetha eu llwyddiannau yn cynyddu arwyddion dwyieithog yn siopau'r pentref.

Y Cyd-destun Ehangach

Hoffem weld tystiolaeth sy'n dangos y meddyliodd yr Adran Addysg yn arloesol am y materion hyn, yn hytrach na mynd i'r afael ag o â'r un hen ddatrysiaid 'go-to' o gau. Tra bod gan yr Adran Addysg gyfrifoldeb rheoli ei chyllideb ysgol yn briodol, teimlwn ei bod yn hynod bwysig i gydbwys o anghenion tymor byr â'r angen i ddiogelu'r gallu hefyd o wynebu anghenion hir dymor gan ystyried cyd-destun y gymuned ehangach. Adnabyddir Abersoch fel gwir hwb economaidd i dwristiaeth, yn ogystal â chefnogi'r economi ehangach tu allan i ffiniau'r pentref a gellid dadlau bod economi Pen Llŷn yn elwa o Iwyddiant Abersoch.

Wynebir yr argyfwng tai parhaus a llym yn Abersoch â chynlluniau am dai fforddiadwy a Chynllun y Cyngor newydd i brynu eiddo i'w rhyddhau ar rent ar gyfraddau fforddiadwy. Anelir Cynllun Gweithredu Tai Cyngor Gwynedd at gywi problemau stoc dai fforddiadwy, problem sy'n arbennig o endemig yn Abersoch. Ariannir y cynllun hwn yn rhannol gan gynnydd yn Nhreth y Cyngor ar dai haf a gwag ac mae Abersoch mewn safle da i elwa ohono. Yn economaidd, mae Abersoch yn mynd o nerth i nerth â chyfleoedd cyflogaeth megis cynllun y gwesty newydd sy'n darogan 150 o swyddi newydd. Gallwn hefyd, yn rhesymol, ddisgwyl weld cynnydd posibl mewn disgyblion o ganlyniad i'r posibilrwydd o berchnogion ailgartrefi symud yn barhaol i'r ardal o ganlyniad i

Covid. Yn ôl Comisiynydd Cenedlaethau'r Dyfodol, dylem edrych 25 i 50 mlynedd i'r dyfodol a dengys y dangosyddion presennol y dylai Abersoch ffynnu yn y blynnyddoedd i ddod.

Buasai gweledigaeth ehangach ac integredig tu hwnt i arbedion ariannol cau'r ysgol yn cydnabod pwysigrwydd Abersoch i economi Pen Llŷn; yn ddigwestiwn ar gyfer hyn, mae'r pwysigrwydd o gynnal gwasanaethau sylfaenol o dai, cyflogaeth ac addysg.

Diweddglo

Rhoddodd fframwaith ac amserlen yr holl broses gryn bwysau arnom fel grŵp o unigolion gwirfoddol sydd â chyfrifoldebau megis gwaith a theulu. Roedd rhaid i ni ddarparu arweiniad a gweledigaeth oherwydd absenoldeb ein Pennaeth, delio ag effaith Covid ac ymateb i alwadau'r broses ymgynghori, yn ogystal â'u heffaith cyfatebol ar redeg yr ysgol o ddydd-i-ddydd. Er hynny, fel Llywodraethwyr Ysgol Abersoch, gwnaethom ein gorau glas i ymgysylltu'n bositif â'r adolygiad anffurfiol dechreulol a'r Ymgynghoriad Statudol dilynol a, hyd eithaf ein gallu, annog yn weithredol ryngddeiliaid wneud yr un peth.

Cydabyddwn, o edrych yn ôl, y buasai gweithredu pendant buan i gyflwyno mentrau positif megis Ti a Fi, Cylch Meithrin a'r Ysgol Draeth wedi osgoi'r argyfwng presennol a wyneba'r ysgol. Dear Education Department and Cabinet Members,

We would like to take this opportunity to express our appreciation for the sensitivity shown towards us as a school community at the time of our headteacher's tragic family bereavements last year, and for the support in maintaining staffing arrangements to ensure the continuity of education for our pupils. We owe a debt of gratitude to the excellent team of dedicated teaching and support staff at Ysgol Abersoch, who have shown such unified resilience, care and sensitivity throughout very testing times over the last extremely difficult year.

We were also grateful for the postponement of the consultation until after the Christmas period. However, we remain disappointed that it was felt appropriate to continue with the Statutory Consultation, despite the ongoing pandemic and associated extreme restrictions, which have prevented us from holding any staff, parent or community meetings or any natural, effective discussion on this serious matter. Perhaps more importantly, the decision to continue has caused great distress to the children, who have had to cope not only with the absence of their headteacher and the frightening conditions of Covid but also with the upsetting idea of their school being closed. We feel this decision was clearly not made with the best interests of the children in mind.

We have taken a great deal of time to study the detail of the Statutory Consultation document along with the Background Pack prepared by the Education Department. The sheer volume of this information made it impossible to respond in any shape or form during the first weekend of the consultation, as requested by the Education Department, particularly when the hard copies that we asked for on the 6th January were not delivered in full until the 19th January.

We support the Cyfeillion Ysgol Abersoch response which deals with the Statutory Consultation documents in detail, so for the avoidance of repetition we have decided to focus this response on the existing strengths of the school and ideas and initiatives to ensure a sustainable way forward.

[Ysgol Abersoch](#)

A community school in the true sense of the word, where children are taught in small classes and every voice is heard. Full use is made of the excellent facilities in the adjacent village hall, and swimming lessons are provided all year round. Pupils actively engage with the community through an innovative delivery of the curriculum, which sees the children out and about the village on a regular basis. A variety of after-school clubs are arranged including Urdd Tudwal, offering Welsh medium social activities and opportunities. Whilst class sizes are lower than those in neighbouring schools, most people would attest this can only be to the advantage of the children

in terms of better educational outcomes. In comparison, overlarge classes as observed in neighbouring schools, which incidentally exceed Gwynedd Council's own stated class sizes, can only lead to poorer outcomes. It is surprising that the Education Department puts greater emphasis on social interaction than educational attainment. Pupils leave the school equipped with essential skills and confidence as bilingual individuals, culturally and environmentally aware, with a sense of heritage and lifelong connection to the village and community of Abersoch.

At the beginning of the informal review, in September 2019, we accepted that low pupil numbers signalled the need for change, and thanks to the stimulus of the initial meetings, several innovations to improve the sustainability of the school were found. We have also now ensured that the staffing structure is in line with the budget.

In challenging times, Ysgol Abersoch has seized the opportunity and demonstrably introduced sustainable measures to address low pupil numbers

[**Cylch Meithrin and Cylch Ti a Fi**](#)

The Governing Body is delighted and excited to support the hosting of a Cylch Ti a Fi and Cylch Meithrin in a dedicated classroom within the school building, since these groups have been proven to increase pupil numbers in other schools in the area. After research and with the full support of the Mudiad Meithrin, an independent committee was formed, and both of these initiatives were established in record time, opening in February 2020. Yet the Education Department has selectively disregarded any potential impact of these efforts on pupil numbers.

[**Cylch Ti a Fi**](#)

A weekly group providing activities promoting the development of children from birth to school age, allowing parents/carers to meet to socialise and share experiences in an informal Welsh atmosphere, which also offers a great introduction to the Cylch Meithrin and Ysgol Abersoch. This is an opportunity for Welsh learners to use their Welsh whilst encouraging non-Welsh speaking families to use Welsh for the first time with their children. An average of 15 parents and toddlers attended the sessions, but unfortunately, due to Covid restrictions, this group has not been able to meet since March 2020.

[**Cylch Meithrin Abersoch**](#)

Children are able to learn through play and socialise under the guidance of professional, qualified and dedicated staff. There is a special emphasis on language development and the personal, social and emotional development of children. The Cylch was awarded grant funding of £12,500 from the Mudiad, as part of a program to support and encourage early years Welsh Language experiences in line with the Welsh Government's Strategy of a Million Welsh speakers by 2050. Registered as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation as well as with the Care Inspectorate Wales, the Cylch is also part of the 30 hours free childcare scheme and employs two members of qualified staff. The Cylch was nominated for a prize at the Mudiad Meithrin's national awards, which is a great reflection of the high standard of childcare offered. The Cylch offers children a seamless introduction and transition into Ysgol Abersoch. Indeed, two former Cylch Meithrin children were among the five new pupils who joined the school in September 2020.

These important initiatives play a vital role in the community, providing early years experiences and childcare services, but they are likely to be lost if the school were to close.

That the Education Department has disregarded the impact of the Cylch Meithrin on pupil numbers is a serious omission.

Beach School

Training and registration as a Beach School (Appendix A) is another proactive positive step in addressing growth and sustainability. Ysgol Abersoch is ideally placed to develop this great concept, complementing the ethos and vision for our school. There is no doubt that the experience of Covid is accelerating the drive to embrace the outdoors as a learning resource. This unique scheme has the potential to offer exciting opportunities to share with other schools in the area, acting as a flagship project in mainstream education settings in Gwynedd. A short walk from beaches, sand dunes, harbours and river, Ysgol Abersoch is ideally and uniquely positioned to make the most of its surrounding natural resources for the benefit of all age groups. Pupils learn and develop in a natural environment, sparking their intrinsic motivations to explore, create and be curious about the world around them, inspiring young children's thinking and ideas. From running free along the beach, making fires and toasting marshmallows, writing in the sand with sticks, bird watching, tracking animal footprints, jumping over the waves, exploring crab habitats, to watching the local wind turbines work, the school provides a wealth of learning opportunities. Our headteacher was registered to attend Outdoor/Beach School training last year, but sadly due to bereavement she was unable to attend, and subsequently Covid has of course put paid to any immediate training courses.

Can Gwynedd Council seize this opportunity for an innovative approach to education in Gwynedd, capitalising on our natural resources and exploring a step in a different direction?

Pupil projections

The Education Department's predictions suggest that pupil numbers at Sarn Bach will more than halve within the next five years. These predictions appear to be based on headteacher assessments yet the Auditor General's Gwynedd Council Annual Audit Summary 2020¹ projects an increase in population by 5.3% between 2020 and 2040 including a 0.4% increase in the number of children. The Education Department appears to prefer to rely on informal assessments by headteachers, not resident in the community, to support its arguments for closure, rather than formal, published Council projections. The Education Department forecast shows a significantly different trend to the wider Welsh population and the Auditor General. As a result careful attention needs to be given to a realistic range of scenarios when considering the provision of primary education in the area. When the Auditor General projections for children numbers are applied, pupil numbers remain steady in line with recent years and do not fall: if Ysgol Abersoch closes our analysis indicates that within the local catchment area, 100% of children will be educated in oversized mixed classes (maximum class size of 20). The closure of Ysgol Abersoch results in the Council not meeting its objectives and compromises education provision to the pupils.

How sound is the analysis of the trends in pupil numbers identified in the report?

[Additional Year 4](#)

We have received requests from parents and pupils for an additional year to be included at Ysgol Abersoch, and we firmly believe that offering education to include Year 4 would be of great benefit in several ways. We are happy to think outside of the box, and do not understand why, just because this model is different to most schools, it should not therefore be possible. This would increase pupil numbers, without impacting on neighbouring schools, since the children would only delay the move to their next school. There is a natural grouping in classes of Years 3/4 and Years 5/6 in neighbouring schools, so this idea is a neat fit. In conjunction with the Ti a Fi, education to include Year 4 could offer a long-term package of engagement, continuity and stability for a child and its parents of up to eight or nine years. This has great potential to build connections on many levels within the school and the wider community, and would also encourage more parents to make Ysgol Abersoch their first choice. It is unclear to us why the Education Department does not agree to this additional Year, nor why the wishes of children and parents are disregarded.

Adding an additional Year 4 makes intuitive sense and is the wish of parents and pupils

[Federalisation](#)

We believe that federalisation has been insufficiently explored. The Schools Organisation Code states that “the case for closure must be strong and all viable alternatives to closure must have been conscientiously considered by the proposer, including federation”. We do not feel this has been the case, particularly with regards to Ysgol Llanbedrog where pupil numbers exceed capacity. The argument for not pursuing this further is insufficiently justified as ‘there was no clear evidence that federalisation would lead to an increase in numbers’. We therefore propose that this is revisited in-line with a Catchment Area Review, the criteria for which, according to Gwynedd Council’s ‘Excellent Primary Education for Children in Gwynedd’ have been met.

Federalisation is a realistic option that warrants proper consideration

The Consultation documents suggest that the language and community will not be adversely affected by the closure of Ysgol Abersoch. Yet the nature of this tick-box exercise does not include input from the community and therefore cannot take into account the true impact on the community and language. The pupils of Ysgol Abersoch are ambassadors for the future of the Welsh language and culture, with the capacity to affect real change, as evidenced by their successes in increasing bilingual signage in the village shops.

The continuity of community is evident throughout the school family; former pupils include the Headteacher, the Chair and Vice Chair of the Governors as well as parent governors and parents. This demonstrates the importance of the lifelong connection a small school village education brings, with individuals willing to step up into leading roles in the community contributing to and strengthening the social threads that form the fabric of society.

The school is a beacon for the Welsh language and culture, showcasing our heritage today, and ensuring its relevance in the future.

The wider context

We would like to see evidence that shows the Education Department has really thought innovatively about the issues rather than tackling it with the same old go-to solution of closure. Whilst the Education Department has a responsibility to manage its school budget appropriately, we feel it is extremely important to balance short-term needs with the need to safeguard the ability to also meet long-term needs taking into context the wider community. Abersoch is well recognised as an economic hub for tourism, also supporting the wider local economy outside of the village boundaries, and it can be argued that the economy of Pen Llŷn piggy-backs on the success of Abersoch.

The chronic and acute housing crisis in Abersoch is being addressed with plans for affordable housing and the new Council Scheme to buy properties to release for rent at affordable rates. The Gwynedd Council Housing Action Plan is aimed at addressing the problems of affordable housing stock, a problem particularly endemic within Abersoch. This plan will be partially funded by Council Tax hikes on second homes and empty houses and Abersoch is well-placed to benefit. Economically, Abersoch goes from strength to strength, with employment opportunities such as the new planned hotel which foresees 150 new jobs. We might also reasonably expect a potential increase in pupils due to the possibility of second home-owners making a permanent move to the area after the experience of Covid. According to the Commissioner for Future Generations, we should be looking 25 to 50 years into the future and the present indicators show Abersoch is well placed to flourish in coming years.

These new jobs and plans for housing are key indicators for change in local demographics; they emphasise the need to maintain an educational provision within the village and a decision to close the school would undermine these initiatives.

A wider, integrated vision beyond the financial savings of school closure, would recognise the importance of Abersoch to the Pen Llŷn economy; implicit in sustaining this is the importance of maintaining basic services of housing, employment and education.

In closing

The framework and timetable of the whole process so far have put a great deal of pressure on us as a voluntary group of individuals with commitments such as work and family. We have had to provide leadership and vision in the absence of our headteacher, deal with the impact of Covid and respond to the demands of the consultation process as well as their corresponding impacts on the day-to-day running of the school. Nevertheless, as Governors of Ysgol Abersoch we have tried our best to positively engage with the initial informal review and subsequent Statutory Consultation, and have, to the best of our ability, actively encouraged other stakeholders to do the same.

We acknowledge that with hindsight, earlier decisive action to put in place positive initiatives such as the Ti a Fi, Cylch Meithrin and Beach School, would have avoided the current crisis facing the school. As governors, we are doing all we can to keep the school open, but we feel the responsibilities bestowed upon us are of too great a magnitude relative to our role as unqualified volunteers, and thus seem inappropriate and unfair. We suggest that the current school governance arrangements are inappropriately structured and this is a strong failure of the system that requires addressing. Timely support and intervention by the Education Department to address problems, and proactively working in collaboration with a School community, is surely a more constructive approach, as opposed to sweeping in at a late stage with an obvious agenda to close a school.

Of the options put forward for the future of Ysgol Abersoch, the Education Department has focused on three: change the age range to 3 -11, federalise, or close the school. School closure appears to be the favoured outcome based on financial savings, and the Education Department's consultation documents appear to have been a paper exercise to justify this position without due consideration of the alternatives.

The support we have received during this consultation period is heartfelt and clear; there is a strength of feeling in our community that Ysgol Abersoch should be afforded the time to continue what has been started under the shadow of Covid, so that our innovations associated with the Cylch Ti a Fi, Cylch Meithrin and Beach School can take root and flourish. If this pandemic has taught us anything, it is the realisation that there is nothing more important than community, and that small-scale educational settings are safer.

We appeal to the Cabinet to consider the proposal before them with extreme care. We respectfully suggest that there is further work to be done here to fully explore federalisation and other innovative models of school organisation before proposing the drastic measure of the closure of a school. The consequences of a decision to close Ysgol Abersoch will impact upon the community of Abersoch and the Welsh Language for generations to come. We urge you to take a step back from the precipice and seize the opportunity to affect a positive change for the long-term future of education in the village.

Ysgrifennaf ar ran Cyfeillion Ysgol Abersoch mewn ymateb i'r Ymgynghoriad Statudol i gau Ysgol Abersoch ar Awst 31ain, 2021. Gwrthwynebwn yn gryf y cynnig hwn a gofynnwn i'r Cabinet gymryd y cyfle hwn i ddatblygu agwedd gydweithredol ac arloesol i sicrhau parhad darpariaeth addysg ym mhentref Abersoch.

1. Rydym yn amlygu ein pryderon ynglŷn a chyfreithlondeb y broses ymgynghori.
 - 1.1. Roedd yr ymgynghoriad gyda'r disgylion yn anheg o ystyried ei h'oedran a'i deallusrwydd.
 - 1.2. Mae'r ffurflen ymateb yn annigonol. Nid oes manylion o sut all pobol ofyn cwestiynau pellach ynglyn a'r cynnig neu cynnig dewisiadau amgen. Nid yw'r ymgygoreion wedi cael gwybod o'r cyfleoedd i wneud sylwadau am ddewisiadau amgen i gau yr Ysgol sydd wedi ei adnabod gan Cyngor Gwynedd ynghyd a'u prif ddewis. Nid yw'r ymgygoreion wedi cael gwybod am y cyfle i gynnig syniadau amgen i gau fyddai hefyd yn ymateb i rhesymau dros gloi (h.y y brif sialens mae'r Ysgol yn ei wynebu).
 - 1.3. Mae diffyg eglurhad/rhesymeg dros y tafluniad 5 mlynedd o niferoedd disgylion yr ysgol. Mae penderfyniad Cyngor Gwynedd i beidio â ystyried ardrawiad Ti a Fi a'r Cylch Meithrin ar niferoedd amcan yr Ysgol yn anheg.
 - 1.4. Mae diffyg tryloywder ynglyn a sut wnaeth Cyngor Gwynedd ymgynghori gyda'r ysgolion cyfagos ac yn benodol nid yw barn yr ysgolion ac ei cyrff llywodraethu ynglyn a ffederaliaddio yn hysbys. Mae'r diffyg gwybodaeth yma wedi cael ardrawiad ar allu yr ymgygoreion i ymateb yn ystyrlon i'r cynigion.

Teimlwn hefyd bod gennym nifer o bwyntiau o werth sy'n haeddu ystyriaeth deg fel rhan o'r broses benderfynu. I gefnogi hyn, mae Atodiad A yn dabl manwl o'n sylwadau ar y dogfennau ymgynghori a ddarparwyd gan Foderneiddio Addysg a gofynnwn i'r sylwadau hyn, yn ogystal â'r pwytiau a godwyd yn y llythyr hwn, gael eu hadolygu a rhoi sylw iddynt.

2. Maint Dosbarthiadau a Chapasiti

2.1. Maint Dosbarthiadau

Ymrwymodd Cyngor Gwynedd i strategaeth o ‘Addysg Gynradd o’r Ansawdd Gorau i Blant yng Ngwynedd¹. Yn y strategaeth hon, dynodir meintiau dosbarth fel elfen bwysig er mwyn i blant feithrin y profiadau a’r cyfleoedd gorau posibl. Mae gan y pedair ysgol yn y dalgylch (Ysgolion Abersoch, Sarn Bach, Llanbedrog a Foel Gron) ddosbarthiadau oed cymysg fel yr arferol. Ymrwymodd Cyngor Gwynedd sicrhau bod yna, ar gyfartaledd, dim mwy nag 20 neu lai na 12 disgybl mewn unrhyw ddosbarth oed cymysg ond, eto, mae meintiau dosbarth 2020 – 2021 yn uwch nag 20 mewn chwe dosbarth allan o naw (Atodiad B – Adolygiad o Feintiau Dosbarth, Capasiti a Rhagolygon y Boblogaeth – Adroddiad gan Gyfeillion Ysgol Abersoch Chwefror 2021 /Appendix B – Review of Class Sizes, Capacity and Population Forecasts – A report by Cyfeillion Ysgol Abersoch Friends, February 2021).

2.2. Capasiti

Datgana Cod Trefniadaeth Ysgolion, “Fel arfer, ni ddylid bod angen darparu lleoedd ychwanegol mewn ysgolion os oes gan ysgolion eraill o’r un fath leoedd gwag o fewn pellter rhesymol”. Ymhellach, datgana ‘Gwybodaeth i Rieni Cyngor Gwynedd 2021 – 2022² “Bydd yr Awdurdod yn cydymffurfio â dewis rhieni nes cyrraedd rhif mynediad yr ysgol” a “Gall yr Awdurdod mewn amgylchiadau eithriadol roi mynediad i blant nes bod y nifer sy’n cael mynediad uwchben y rhif mynediad cyhyd nad yw derbyn yn effeithio’r ysgol yn y tymor byr a’r tymor hir a ddim yn cael effaith anfanteisiol ar ysgolion cyfagos”. Eto, mae niferoedd Ysgol Llanbedrog wedi gordansgrifio o fwy nag 20%, gyda 102 o blant yn mynychu o gymharu â’i chapasiti o 83, gyda 43% o’r disgyblion sy’n ei mynychu yn all-ddal-gylch. Ni chredwn fod Cyngor Gwynedd yn dilyn y Cod Trefniadaeth Ysgolion na’i bolisiau ei hun o ran mynediad, uchafswm meintiau dosbarthiadau o 20 disgybl i blant mewn dosbarthiadau oed cymysg nac, ychwaith, mewn rhai achosion lefel cyfreithiol y Cyngor ei hun o 30 mewn dosbarth.

2.3. Niferoedd Amcanestyniad

Mae rhagolygon poblogaeth disgyblion yn bwysig i ddeall os oes digon o gapasiti yn y pedair ysgol i gynnig maint dosbarth o rhwng 12 ac 20 nawr ac yn y dyfodol. Paratôdd yr Adran Addysg amcanestyniadau pum mlynedd o niferoedd disgyblion yn yr ardal. Dangosir hwn isod (Ffigur 1) ochr yn ochr ag amcanestyniadau nifer plant Crynodeb Archwiliad Blynnyddol Cyngor Gwynedd 2020³ gan y Archwilydd Cyffredinol ynghyd ag amcangyfrif newidiadau Llywodraeth Cymru⁴ ym mhoblogaeth y rhai 0 – 9 oed yng Nghymru. Canfuwyd y dengys amcangyfrif yr Adran Addysg duedd tipyn gwahanol i ragolygon Yr Archwilydd Cyffredinol a gyhoeddodd ar Gyngor Gwynedd a’r boblogaeth Gymreig ehangach ac, o ganlyniad, mae angen ystyriaeth ofalus i sicrhau amrediad realistig o senarios i’w



hystyried. Nid yw'r amcangyfrif hwn yn cydfynd â thuiddiad rhagolygon y boblogaeth yng Nghymru na'r Archwilydd Cyffredinol.

Mae gennym hefyd dystiolaeth gan sawl teulu â phlant nad yw'n cael ei adlewyrchu yn y niferoedd hyn. Er enghraifft, mae o leiaf 11 o blant y gwyddom amdanynt a fyddai'n gymwys o bosib i ddechrau yn Ysgol Abersoch yn y 3 mlynedd nesaf o gymharu â rhagamcan 7 yr Adran Addysg. Awgryma Comisiynydd Cenedlaethau'r Dyfodol y dylid edrych 25 – 50 o flynyddoedd i'r dyfodol, gan bwysleisio'r pwysigrwydd o anghenion tymor byr â'r angen i ddiogelu'r gallu i fedru wynebu anghenion hirdymor.

I gynorthwyo dod i benderfyniad, mae'n rhesymol ystyried tri senario o niferoedd disgyblion y dyfodol a sut gallasai hwnnw ddylanwadau ar gapasiti dosbarth cymysg petai Ysgol Abersoch yn aros ar agor neu gau a'r plant fynd i Ysgol Sarn Bach (Atodiad B – Adolygiad o Feintiau Dosbarth, Capasiti a Rhagolygon y Boblogaeth – Adroddiad gan Gyfeillion Ysgol Abersoch Chwefror 2021 /Appendix B – Review of Class Sizes, Capacity and Population Forecasts – A report by Cyfellion Ysgol Abersoch Friends, February 2021). I grynhoi, dros y pedair ysgol:

- **Achos Uwch o 25 disgybl ym mhob flwyddyn ysgol** / cyfanswm o 200 disgybl sy'n cydfynd â chyfartaledd blynyddoedd diweddar a barn yr Archwilydd Cyffredinol.
- **Achos Canolig o 22 disgybl ym mhob flwyddyn ysgol** / cyfanswm o 176 disgybl sy'n cydfynd â nifer mwyaf cyffredin disgyblion yn y blynyddoedd diweddar.
- **Achos Isel o 18 disgybl ym mhob flwyddyn ysgol** / cyfanswm o 144 disgybl sy'n cydfynd â rhagamcan y Cyngor.

O ddefnyddio'r amcanestyniadau uchod, pe gwreddid yr Achos Isel ac y caeid Ysgol Abersoch, byddai'r tair ysgol ar ôl yn gweithredu bron yn llawn capasiti, gan ddarparu bron ddim amrediad amrywiadau arferol yn y niferoedd ysgol blynyddol neu ddarparu llwybr at ddatblygiad economaidd a thai yn yr ardal. Yn y senarios Canolig ac Uwch, addysgir nifer cynyddol o ddisgyblion mewn dosbarthiadau oed cymysg o fwy nag 20. O gymryd y senario Uwch, sy'n cydfynd ag amcanestyniadau'r Archwilydd Cyffredinol i Wynedd, pe caeid Ysgol Abersoch addysgir 100% o blant mewn dosbarthiadau cymysg maint mwy na'r arfer.

Ar gyfartaledd, rhaid ystyried pe caeid Ysgol Abersoch y dysgid holl ddisgyblion y tair ysgol sy'n weddill mewn dosbarthiadau mwy na'r arfer er eu hanfantais addysgol ac yn erbyn strategaeth ddatganedig Cyngor Gwynedd o addysg o'r ansawdd gorau mewn Ysgolion Cynradd.

3. Ffederalieddio a Adolygu Dalgylch

Nid yr ydym yn credu bod ffederaliaeth wedi'i archwilio'n ddigonol. Ochr yn ochr â hyn noda 'Addysg Gynradd o'r Ansawdd Gorau i Blant yng Ngwynedd' Cyngor Gwynedd yr amodau sy'n briodol i Adolygu Dalgylch. Cynhwysa'r rhain "...pe byddai ysgolion y dalgylch yn ennill neu golli dros 20% o'i disgyblion oherwydd yr effaith ar y gymdeithas gyfagos a'r dalgylch', 'llefudd gweigion ar draws y dalgylch', ac 'amrediad gwariant y pen pan fo'n fwy na 10% yn uwch neu'n is na'r cyfartaledd sirol'. Diwalla'r sefyllfa bresennol o fewn dalgylch y pedair ysgol leol yr holl grriteria hyn ac, felly, gofynnwn am weithredu Adolygu'r Dalgylch.

4. Materion Proses

4.1. Holiadur y Plant

Cynhwysa dogfen Ymgynghoriad Statudol i Blant gwestiynau arweiniol, mae'n gamarweiniol a rhagfarnllyd yn erbyn Ysgol Abersoch. Datgana'r ddogfen bod 'gwell defnydd o adnoddau, e.e. offer TG', 'cyfle i gyfarfod a chwarae â ffrindiau newydd', 'mwy o athrawon' yn Ysgol Sarn Bach. Cynlluniwyd y geiriad hwn i ddenu plant ac awgryma bod TG gwell a mwy o athrawon yn Ysgol Sarn Bach; ni chredwn fod hyn yn wir. Ymhellach, dim ond buddion ymddangosiadol (os yn gywir) a nodir, heb gyfeirio dim at yr hyn y gellid ei golli.

4.2. Cymariaethau anaddas ac anghywir.

Wrth gydnabod y myncha canran o ddisgyblion Abersoch ysgolion tu allan i'w dalgylch, rydym yn anghydweld y gall y ffigur hwn fod cyn uched ag 81% gan y trosglwyddodd nifer o'r plant yn gyfreithlon i Ysgol Sarn Bach ar ôl Blwyddyn 3. Ymdebyga hyn i sefyllfa ddu a gwyn ac mae'n gamarweiniol ac anghywir.

4.3. Asesiadau Effaith

Ymddengys bod cynnwys a natur cwblhau'r asesiadau effaith yn ymarfer ticio'r blwch cyfyngedig a gwblhawyd gan staff y Cyngor, yn hytrach nag ymgais gydnabyddedig i ganfod gwir gynrychiolaeth o'r effaith o fewn y gymuned a effeithir.

4.4. Newid yr ystod oed o 3 – 8 i 3 – 9

Rydym yn gadarn ein barn bod ymestyn yr ystod oed i gynnwys Blwyddyn 4 yn ddatrysiaid posibl ac ymarferol ond, eto, fe'i hanwybyddir gan y Cyngor heb eglurhad digonol. Nid yw'r awgrym hwn yn afresymol o feddwl y dysgir Blynnyddoedd 3 a 4 ar y cyd yn gyffredinol mewn dosbarthiadau oed cymysg yn ysgolion Gwynedd.

5. Materion Trafnidiaeth

5.1. Costau

Amcangyfrifwyd cost ychwanegol o £14,000 y flwyddyn i gludo plant Ysgol Abersoch yn ôl a blaen i Ysgol Sarn Bach gan yr Adran Addysg. Eto, cydnabydda'r Cyngor y gallai hwn fod yn dan amcangyfrifiad, o ystyried y myncha nifer o blant tair i wyth oed Abersoch Ysgol Sarn Bach eisoes ac y dylid cynnwys y gost o gludo'r plant hyn hefyd yn y swm terfynol.

5.2. Diogelwch a'r Amgylchedd

Dosbarthwyd y daith o Abersoch i Ysgol Sarn Bach yn 'beryglus' a olyga bod rhaid cael cludiant. Datgana Atodiad C 'Ardrawiad Cymunedol' y Cod Trefniadaeth Ysgolion, "gallai cynigwyr gynnwys y canlynol: yr effaith ar iechyd a llesiant, e.e. pe bai disgyblion yn llai abl i gerdded neu feicio i'r ysgol". Eto, ni chredwn y deliwyd â hyn na'r angen o gludiant ar yr ardrawiad amgylcheddol, sy'n meithrin ymhellach o oed cynnar, nad yw materion amgylcheddol o bwys.

Mae'n werth tynnu sylw bod lleoliad Ysgol Sarn Bach, fel y dynodir ar dudalen 35 y Ddogfen Ymgynghoriad Statudol, yn anghywir. Efallai y cydiodd yr Adran Addysg yn ein syniad o Ysgol Draeth (Atodiad C) ac y dymuna ddatblygu Ysgol Sarn Bach yn Ysgol Fferm? Arweinia hyn at achos pryder yn anad dim yngylch cywirdeb rhannau mwy cymhleth yr adroddiad.

5.3. Mynediad i Blant "Blwyddyn Meithrin"

Golyga cyfyngiad amserlen trafnidiaeth gyhoeddus ei bod bron yn amhosibl i blant Meithrin, sy'n dod i'r ysgol rhwng naw ac 11 o'r gloch y bore, fedru mynchu heb drafnidiaeth bersonol.

6. Cylch Meithrin a Ti a Fi

6.1. Y Broses Ymgynghori

Mynna'r Cod Trefniadaeth Ysgolion bod "Ffactorau penodol i'w hystyried ar gyfer cynigion i ychwanegu neu ddileu dosbarthiadau meithrin". Yn gyntaf, nis ymgynghorwyd â'r Cylch Meithrin a'r Cylch Ti a Fi sydd ar y safle ynglŷn â'r Ymgynghoriad Statudol er gwaethaf bod yn rhanddeiliad cydnabyddedig ac ni chynhalwyd trafodaeth parthed goblygiadau cau'r ysgol ar y ddarpariaeth o addysg blynyddoedd cynnar yn Abersoch. Mae'r hepgoriad hwn yn tanseilio ymddiriedaeth dull cynnal yr ymgynghoriad.

7. Yr Iaith a'r Gymuned

7.1. Strategaeth yr Iaith Gymraeg

Mae Miliwn o Siaradwyr Cymraeg 2050 yn strategaeth amlwg gan Lywodraeth Cymru ond, eto, mae cau ysgol yng nghanol pentref sy'n symbol pwysig i'r iaith Gymraeg yn groes i'r graen a gwrt hwynebus i'r amcan hwn. Mae Ysgol Abersoch yn falch o'i diwylliant a'i threftadaeth Gymreig, gan gymryd mantais o bob cyfle codi ymwybyddiaeth o'r Gymraeg mewn ffyrdd tu hwnt i allu cymunedau eraill. Gellid ystyried effaith y cau hwn ar y strategaeth hon fel hepgoriad detholedig. Targedwyd y strategaeth dysgu blynyddoedd cynnar trwy gyfrwng y Gymraeg, a llwyddo'n rhannol trwy fentrau'r Mudiad Meithrin megis Cylch Meithrin Abersoch a'r Cylch Ti a Fi, ac mae'n dystiolaeth o weithgareddau ar y gweill i gyflawni'r nod hwn.

7.2. Mentrau ac Effaith ar yr iaith Gymraeg

Gwesteia Ysgol Abersoch nifer o fentrau sy'n hyrwyddo a dathlu'r Gymraeg, gan gynnwys Yr Urdd, gweithgareddau Hunaniaith, yn ogystal â bod yn rhan o'r cynllun 'Shwmae S'mae'. O fynd â'r iaith i'n cymuned leol ac at fusnesion cymaint fu'r llwyddiant hwn fel y dangosa nifer o'r siopau arwyddion dwyieithog erbyn hyn. Datgana Adran 7.9 y ddogfen ymgynghori, "Deuir i gasgliad...na ragwelir effaith negyddol ar yr iaith Gymraeg pe byddai'r cynnig yn cael ei weithredu." Fodd bynnag, mae colli'r hyrwyddiad a defnydd o'r iaith trwy berthynas â'r gymuned a busnes yn sylweddol.

7.3. Cysylltiad â'r Gymuned

Mae'r cyfleusterau cymunedol a gynigir ym mhentref Abersoch yn drech na'r rhai a gynigir yn Sarn Bach (CIAR 4.4, dogfen gefndir) ond, eto'n ddiddorol, ni chyflwynir yr wybodaeth bwysig hon yn y prif adroddiad, a ymddengys yn rhagfarnllyd yn erbyn Ysgol Abersoch. Dylid nodi hefyd nad yw Ysgol Sarn Bach yn ymwneud ag unrhyw Gylch Meithrin na Ti a Fi. Caeodd Cylch Meithrin, a gynhelid yng Nghanolfan Gymdeithasol Llanengan, o ganlyniad i ddiffyg pwyllogor. Mae'r tabl yn parhau i fod yn ffeithiol anghywir, er enghraift nid oes capel nac eglwys yn Sarn Bach ac mae gan Llanbedrog a Foel Gron neuaddau pentref. Mae'r camgymeriadau syml hyn yn tanseilio'r hyder mewn meysydd gwybodaeth mwy cymhleth sydd wedi'u cynnwys yn yr adroddiad.

7.4. Effaith ar y Gymuned

Mae cryn bryder am effaith colli'r ysgol o gymuned pentref Abersoch. Datgana'r Adran Addysg "y deuir i'r casgliad fod cysylltiad rhwng yr ysgol â'r ardal ehangach yn bodoli eisoes" ar y sail y mynycha plant Abersoch Ysgol Sarn Bach eisoes ond, eto nid oes gan Ysgol Sarn Bach broffil yn Abersoch ac, o wybod am heriau'r lleoliad a thrafnidiaeth, mae'n anodd gweld sut y newidia hynny. Byddai dod â phlant Ysgol Sarn Bach i'r pentref yn gofyn am logi bws yn ogystal â chostau eraill fel taliadau parcio a'r angen am staff ychwanegol; ar hyn o bryd mae hyn yn cael ei wneud am ddim yn Ysgol Abersoch. Ni all ysgol nad yw yn y pentref gynhyrchu nac atgynhyrchu'r un lefel o ddiddordeb, cefnogaeth neu ymwneud cymunedol o fewn y gymuned leol a busnesion.

8. Ariannol

8.1. Arbedion Amcangyfrifedig

Mae'r arbedion o £110,000 yn gyfartaledd bychan (0.1%) o gyllideb gyfan Cyngor Gwynedd o £90.4 miliwn. Ond, eto, yn nhermau tryloywder, nid yw'n glir pa gostau a gynhwyswyd ac na chynhwyswyd yn yr amcangyfrifon hyn. O ystyried y dibynna mwyafrif dadl Cyngor Gwynedd ar gost, mae'n syndod nad yw'n dweud llawer am hyn o gymharu â'r manylder a geir yng ngweddill y ddogfennaeth.

8.2. Cyllideb

Ymrwymodd Ysgol Abersoch i falanshio ei chyllideb yn nhermau dyraniad ariannol a strwythur staffio. Datryswyd unrhyw ddiffygion cyllidebol ar gyfer 2021 – 2022 erbyn hyn hefyd.

9. Darpariaeth Addysg

9.1. Cymarebau Staff i Ddisgyblion

Credwn y cynhwysa lefelau staffio Ysgol Sarn Bach bennaeth llawn amser, athrawes rhan amser ac athrawon achlysurol, yn ogystal â chymorthyddion dysgu. Rhennir y plant i ddau ddosbarth ffurfiol mewn tair ystafell ddosbarth. Dysga'r penneth Meithrin – Blwyddyn 2 mewn dosbarth sengl a'r athrawes ran-amser Flynyddoedd 3, 4, 5 a 6 mewn dwy ystafell ddosbarth wedi'u cefnogi gan gymhorthyyd dysgu. Credwn y dysgir y plant ym Mlynnyddoedd 5 a 6 gan gymhorthyyd dosbarth ddeuddydd yr wythnos. Mae'n rhesymol gofyn pam fod cynyddu maint dosbarthiadau, trwy gynnwys disgyblion Ysgol Abersoch, yn "Cynnig addysg o'r ansawdd uchaf posibl" a "byddai addysgu'r plant yn Ysgol Sarn Bach yn cael effaith positif". O gymharu, dysgir plant Ysgol Abersoch bob amser gan athrawes, fel y disgwylir mewn ysgol.

9.2. Trosglwyddo ar Ddiwedd Blwyddyn 3

Awgryma'r cynnig trwy gael eu dysgu'n unig yn Ysgol Sarn Bach, ac nad oes angen trosglwyddo disgyblion yn ystod eu haddysg gynradd, yn fudd diriaethol ond, eto, ni ddarparir tystiolaeth i gefnogi'r pwyt hwn. Nid ydym yn ymwybodol o unrhyw effaith negyddol yn gysylltiedig â'r trosglwyddiad hwn. Nid oes sylfaen i'r datganiad ac mae'n hynod oddrychol.

9.3. Ansawdd yr Addysg

Ymddengys bod adroddiad yr Ymgynghoriad yn ddethol yn ei ddewis o gynnwys a geiriad, gan amlygu buddion Ysgol Sarn Bach ond, eto'n eithrio rhai Ysgol Abersoch. Er enghraift, penodwyd penneth Ysgol Abersoch, Linda Jones yn Gydlynnydd Clwstwr Siarter Iaith i gefnogi'r Sector Uwchradd ond eto ni chydubyddir dim o hyn. Awgryma hyn bod mwy i'w ennill nac o'i golli o gau Ysgol Abersoch. Buasai'r mwyafrif o bobl yn ystyried meintiau dosbarthiadau llai yn gyfle atyniadol â chanlyniadau addysgol gwell. Mae'n syndod y rhodda'r Adran Addysg fwy o bwyslais ar agweddu cymdeithasol dosbarthiadau mwy dros ganlyniadau addysgol gwell. Ni theimlwn yr ysgrifennwyd yr adroddiad mewn modd a rodd a chwarae teg cyfartal i Ysgol Abersoch.

10. Y Dyfodol

Gwyddom y mynegodd rieni ddymuniad o gadw'u plant yn Ysgol Abersoch am flwyddyn ychwanegol pe bai dewis a buasai'n clymu'n daclus â'r drefn o addysgu plant Blynnyddoedd 3 a 4 â'i gilydd. Teimlir ei bod yn groes i'r graen adel iadu mwy o ofod yn Ysgol Llanbedrog, fel yr awgrymodd aelod o'r Adran Addysg mewn cyfarfod anffurfiol, pan fo ysgol addas â chapasiti yn Abersoch. Arweiniodd polisi dewis rhieni Llywodraeth Cymru, a methiant Cyngor Gwynedd o lynu at ei bolisiau ei hun, i'r sefyllfa o un ysgol fod dros-gapasiti ac, eto, un arall sy'n brwydro aros ar agor yn dangos yr atebwyd y criteria am Adolygu Dalgylch.

Brwydra cymunedau ar draws Gwynedd ag ystod o heriau cyffredinol. Nid cymuned Abersoch yw'r unig un sy'n ymladd achub ei hysgol, Ilyfrgell, addoldai ac adnoddau cyhoeddus eraill. Cafodd y sefyllfa bresennol o ran tai a chyflogaeth effaith niweidiol unman yn fwy amlwg na Abersoch. Amlygodd cyhoeddiad diweddar Cyngor Gwynedd o 'Gynllun Gweithredu Tai' i gefnogi tai fforddiadwy y pwysigrwydd o fframwaith cydlynol at ddyfodol cynaliadwy. Profa hyn, ar y cyd â'r cyhoeddiad am gynlluniau datblygu i greu 150 o swyddi yn y pentref, y saif

Abersoch mewn lle da i arwain y ffordd. Credwn y gall hyn ddechrau wrth i Gyngor Gwynedd ymdrin ag addysg arloesol.

Cynigwn bod Ysgol Abersoch mewn sefyllfa ddelfrydol i ddarparu model amgen llwyddiannus, trwy ddatblygu ei ddarpariaeth addysgol trwy'r Cylch Ti a Fi, Cylch Meithrin ac arwain ar y syniad o Ysgol Draeth arloesol a allasai gynnwys bod yn rhan o ffederalleiddio neu ysgol aml-safle. Trwy ymrwymo cadw Ysgol Abersoch ar agar fel darpariaeth addysg hirdymor yng nghanol Abersoch, a'i chefnogi â strategaeth tai a chyflogaeth, mae yna gyfle unigryw i gyhoeddi stori economaidd llwyddiannus i Wynedd. Ni all hyn ond bod o fudd i'r gymuned gyfan a gwasanaethu'n flaenllaw i gryfhau a chynnal yr iaith Gymraeg a diwylliant yn yr ardal hynod weladwy hon o Wynedd.

Dear Education Department and Cabinet Members

On behalf of Cyfeillion Ysgol Abersoch Friends and in response to the Statutory Consultation to close Ysgol Abersoch on 31 August 2021, we strongly oppose this proposal and request that the Cabinet take this opportunity to develop a cooperative and innovative approach to ensure that education provision continues in the village of Abersoch.

1. We highlight to you our concerns in relation to the lawfulness of the consultation process
 - 1.1. The consultation with the learners was unfair in light of their young ages and understanding.
 - 1.2. The Response Form is inadequate. There is no detail as to how people can ask further questions about the proposal or suggest alternatives to the proposal. Consultees have not been informed of their opportunity to make representations regarding the alternatives to closure that have been identified by Gwynedd Council as well as the main proposal. The consultees have not been informed of their opportunity to suggest other alternatives to closure which would address the reasons for the closure (i.e. the key challenge that the school faces).
 - 1.3. There is a lack of explanation/reasoning in relation to the 5-year projection of pupil numbers for the school. Gwynedd Council's decision not to consider the impact of Ti a Fi and Cylch Meithrin on the projected numbers is unfair.
 - 1.4. There is a lack of transparency in relation to how Gwynedd Council consulted with the other schools and in particular the views of those schools and their governing body in relation to federalisation is unknown. This lack of information has impacted on the consultees ability to respond meaningfully to the proposals

We also have several points that we feel deserve due consideration as part of the decision-making process. To support this, Appendix A is a detailed table of our observations to the consultation documents provided by Moderneiddio Addysg and we request these comments, in addition to the points raised in this letter, are reviewed and addressed.

2. Class sizes and capacity

2.1. Class sizes

Gwynedd Council is committed to a strategy of 'Excellent Primary Education for Children in Gwynedd'¹. In this strategy class sizes are identified as an important factor so that children acquire the best possible experience and opportunities. All of the four schools in the area (Ysgol Abersoch, Ysgol Sarn Bach, Ysgol Llanbedrog, Ysgol Foel Gron) have mixed age classes as the norm. Gwynedd Council has committed to ensuring that there is on average no more than 20 pupils or fewer than 12 pupils in any mixed age class yet the class sizes for 2020-21 are above 20 in 6 classes out of 9 (Appendix B- Review of Class Sizes, Capacity and Population Forecasts - A report by Cyfeillion Ysgol Abersoch Friends, February 2021)

2.2. Capacity

The Schools Organisation Code states that "It should not normally be necessary to provide additional places at schools when there are others of the same type with surplus places within a reasonable distance. Furthermore, Gwynedd Council 'Information For Parents 2021 / 2022'² states that "The Authority will comply with parental preference until the school's admission number has been attained" and "The Authority may in exceptional circumstances admit children in excess of the admission number if such acceptance will not adversely affect the school both in the short and longer term and will not have a detrimental effect on neighbouring schools". Yet Ysgol Llanbedrog is oversubscribed by more than 20%, with 102 children attending compared to its capacity of 83, with 43% of attending pupils coming from out of catchment. We do not believe Gwynedd Council to be following the Schools Organisation Code, nor its own policies when it comes to admissions, maximum class sizes of 20 pupils for children in mixed-age classes, nor in certain cases the Council's own legal limit of 30 in a class.

2.3. Projection numbers

Pupil population forecasts are important in understanding whether there is sufficient capacity at the four schools to offer class sizes of between 12 and 20 now and in the future. The Education Department has prepared a 5-year projection of pupil numbers in the four schools. This is shown below (Figure 1) alongside the Auditor General 'Gwynedd Council Annual Audit Summary 2020'³ projections and the Welsh Government⁴ estimate of population changes of those aged 0 – 9 years in Wales. Our finding is that the Education Department estimate shows a significantly different trend that out of step with Gwynedd Council's Auditor General published forecasts and that of the wider



Welsh population and as a result needs careful consideration to ensure a realistic range of scenarios is considered.

Figure 1: Actual and Expected Total Pupils in Catchment 2005 to 2030



We also have evidence from several families with children which is not reflected in these numbers. For example, there are least 11 potential children that we know of who would be eligible to start at Ysgol Abersoch in the next 3 years compared to the Education Department's projected 7. The Commissioner for Future Generations also suggests that we should be looking 25 to 50 years into the future, stressing the importance of balancing short-term needs with the need to safeguard the ability to also meet long-term needs.

To assist with decision making it is reasonable to consider three scenarios of future pupil numbers and how this might impact mixed class capacity if Ysgol Abersoch remains open or closes and the pupils go to Ysgol Sarn Bach (Appendix B- Review of Class Sizes, Capacity and Population Forecasts - A report by Cyfeillion Ysgol Abersoch Friends, February 2021). In summary, across the four schools:

- **High case of 25 pupils per year group per year / 200 pupils in total** in line with the average of recent years and the opinion of the Auditor General.
- **Mid case of 22 pupils per year group per year / 176 pupils in total** in line with the most frequent number of pupils in recent years.
- **Low case of 18 pupils per year group per year / 144 pupils in total** in line with the Council's forecast by 2025.

Using the projections from above, if the Low case is realised, as per the Council's forecasts and if Ysgol Abersoch is closed, the remaining three schools will operate at close to full capacity, providing little scope for normal fluctuations in annual school numbers or provide a pathway for economic and housing development in the area. In both the Mid and High scenarios an increasing number of pupils will be educated in mixed age classes greater than 20. Taking the High scenario, which broadly reflects the Auditor General projections for Gwynedd, if Ysgol Abersoch closes 100% of children will be educated in oversized, mixed age classes.

On average, it must be considered that the closure of Ysgol Abersoch will mean that all pupils in the three remaining schools will be educated in oversized classrooms to their educational detriment and against Gwynedd Council's stated strategy of educational excellence in primary schools.

3. Federalisation and Catchment Area Review

We do not believe that federalisation has been sufficiently explored. Alongside this Gwynedd Council's 'Excellent Primary Education for Children in Gwynedd' specifies the conditions under which Catchment Area Review is appropriate. These include "if schools within the catchment area gain or lose more than 20% of its pupils due to the impact on the neighbouring community and the catchment-area", "surplus places across the catchment-area", and "per capita expenditure per school greater than 10% above or below the county average". The present situation within the area of the four local schools meets all of these criteria and we therefore request that a Catchment Area Review be implemented.

4. Process issues

4.1. Children's questionnaire

The Statutory Consultation for Children document includes leading questions, is misleading and biased against Ysgol Abersoch. The document states that at Ysgol Sarn Bach there is 'better use of resources e.g. IT Equipment', 'an opportunity to meet and play with new friends', 'more teachers'. This wording is designed to entice children implying there is better IT and more teaching staff at Ysgol Sarn Bach, which we do not believe to be the case. Furthermore, only perceived (if not incorrect) benefits are noted, with no reference to what may be lost.

4.2. Inappropriate and inaccurate comparisons.

Whilst acknowledging that a percentage of Abersoch pupils attend school outside of their catchment area, we dispute that this figure can be as high as 81% since a number of children have transferred legitimately to Ysgol Sarn Bach after Year 3. This is akin to an apples and pears comparison, is misleading and incorrect.

4.3. Impact assessments

The content and nature of the completion of the impact assessments appear to be a limited, tick box exercise completed by Council staff, rather than a concerted effort to ascertain a true representation of the impact within the affected community.

4.4. Changing age range from 3 - 8 years to 3 - 9 years

We are firmly of the opinion that extending the age range to include Year 4 is a feasible and practical solution yet is disregarded by the Council with insufficient explanation. This suggestion is not unreasonable given that Years 3 and 4 are commonly taught together in mixed-age classes in many Gwynedd schools.

5. Transport issues

5.1. Costs

An additional cost of £14,000 pa for transport of Ysgol Abersoch children to and from Ysgol Sarn Bach has been estimated by the Education Department. Yet, the council has acknowledged that this may be an underestimation, seeing as a number of Abersoch children aged 3 - 8 already attend Ysgol Sarn Bach, and the cost of transport for these children would also need to be factored in.

5.2. Safety and environment

The route from Abersoch to Ysgol Sarn Bach is classified as ‘dangerous’ necessitating vehicular transport. The Schools Organisation Code, Annex C ‘Community Impact’ states ‘proposers might include the following: impact on health and wellbeing e.g. if pupils would be less able to walk or cycle to school’ yet we do not believe that this has been addressed, nor the environmental impact of the need for transport, which further instills a belief from an early age that environmental issues are of no importance.

It is worth pointing out that the location of Ysgol Sarn Bach, as indicated on page 35 of the Statutory Consultation Document, is incorrect. Perhaps the Education Department has taken hold of our Beach School concept (Appendix C) and wishes to develop Ysgol Sarn Bach into a Farm School? This leads to cause for concern not least over the accuracy of other more complex areas of the report.

5.3. Access for children in the ‘Nursery Year’

The limitations of the public bus service timetable mean that it would be near impossible for Nursery children, who come to school between 9am and 11am to attend without personal transport.

6. Cylch Meithrin and Ti a Fi

6.1. Consultation process

The Schools Organisation Code stipulates there are “specific factors to be taken into account for proposals to add or remove nursery classes”. Firstly, the on-site Cylch Meithrin and Cylch Ti a Fi has not been formally informed nor consulted with regards to the Statutory Consultation despite being a recognised stakeholder, and no discussion has been held regarding the implications of school closure on the provision of early years education in Abersoch. This omission undermines confidence in the conduct of the consultation.

7. Language and community

7.1. Welsh Language strategy

The Cymraeg 2050 Million Welsh Speakers is a key Welsh Government strategy yet closing a school in the heart of a village that is an important symbol of the Welsh language is both counterintuitive and contrary to this aim. Ysgol Abersoch proudly celebrates its Welsh culture and heritage, taking advantage of every opportunity to raise the profile of the Welsh language in ways that are beyond the ability of other communities. Not considering the impact of this closure on this strategy could be considered a selective omission. The strategy has targeted early years learning through the medium

of Welsh, achieved in part by Mudiad Meithrin initiatives such as the Cylch Meithrin Abersoch and Cylch Ti a Fi and is evidence of the activities underway to achieve this goal.

7.2. Welsh language initiatives and impact

Ysgol Abersoch is host to several initiatives designed to promote and celebrate the Welsh language including Yr Urdd, Hunaniaith activities as well as participation in the 'Shwmae S'mae' program. The pupils take the language out into our local community and businesses and such is the success of these initiatives that a number of shops have introduced bilingual signage. Section 7.9 of the consultation document states that "It is concluded ... that no negative impact on the Welsh language is anticipated, should the proposal be realised." However the loss of the promotion and use of the language through community and business relationships is tangible.

7.3. Involvement in community

The community facilities offered in Abersoch village far outweigh those offered in Sarn Bach (CIAR 4.4, background document) yet interestingly this important information is not presented in the main report, which seems rather biased against Ysgol Abersoch. It should also be noted that Ysgol Sarn Bach is not involved with any Cylch Meithrin or Ti a Fi. The Cylch Meithrin at Llanengan Community Centre closed due to a lack of committee. The table continues to be factually incorrect, for example there is no chapel or church in Sarn Bach and both Llanbedrog and Ffwrnais have village halls. These simple mistakes undermine confidence in more complex areas of information contained in the report.

7.4. Impact on community

There is significant concern on the impact of the loss of the school on the Abersoch village community. The Education Department state that a "link already exists between the school and the broader area" on the basis that Abersoch children already attend Ysgol Sarn Bach, yet Ysgol Sarn Bach does not have a profile in Abersoch, and given the location and transport challenges it is difficult to see how this would change. Bringing Ysgol Sarn Bach children into the village would require the hire of a bus as well as other costs such as parking charges and the need for additional staff yet this is presently done for free at Ysgol Abersoch. A school that is not in the village cannot generate or replicate the same level of community interest, support or involvement within the local community and businesses.

8. Financials

8.1. Estimated savings

The savings of £110,000 are a small proportion (0.1%) of the overall Gwynedd Council expenditure on education of £108.8m⁵ million yet, in terms of transparency, it is unclear what costs have been

included or excluded in these calculations. Given that much of Gwynedd Council's argument hinges on cost, it is surprising that the same level of detail afforded to the rest of the documentation is not forthcoming.

8.2. Budget

Ysgol Abersoch is committed to balancing its budget in terms of financial allocation and staffing structure, and any budget deficits for 2021/22 have now been resolved.

9. Education provision

9.1. Staff to pupil ratios

We believe staffing levels at Ysgol Sarn Bach to consist of 1 full-time headteacher, 1 part-time teacher, and occasional teachers, as well as teaching assistants. The children are split into 2 formal classes, across 3 classrooms. The headteacher teaches Meithrin - Year 2 in a single classroom, and the part-time teacher Years 3,4,5 and 6 across 2 physical classrooms supported by a teaching assistant. We believe that for 2 days per week the children in Years 5 and 6 are taught by a teaching assistant only. It is reasonable to question how increasing class sizes, by including Ysgol Abersoch pupils, will "Provide education of the best possible quality" and how "there would be a positive impact on educating the children at Ysgol Sarn Bach". In contrast, Ysgol Abersoch children are always taught by a teacher, as would be expected in a school.

9.2. Transferring after Year 3

The proposal implies that there is a tangible benefit for pupils in avoiding the need to transfer schools during their primary education, yet no evidence is provided to support this point and we are unaware of any negative impact associated with this transfer. There is no basis for the statement and it is highly subjective.

9.3. Quality of Education

The Consultation report appears to be selective in its choice of content and wording, highlighting the benefits of Ysgol Sarn Bach yet excluding the benefits of Ysgol Abersoch. For example, Ysgol Abersoch's headteacher, Linda Jones has been appointed Language Charter Cluster Coordinator to support the Secondary Sector yet none of this is recognised within the documentation. This implies there is more to be gained than will be lost by the closure of Ysgol Abersoch. Most people would consider smaller class sizes to be an attractive opportunity with improved educational outcomes. It is surprising that the Education Department places greater emphasis on social aspects of larger classes over improved educational outcomes. We do not feel that the report is written in a manner that gives equal fair play to Ysgol Abersoch.

10. Future

We know that parents have expressed a wish to keep their children at Ysgol Abersoch for an extra year if this were an option and would neatly tie in with the usual order of teaching children in years 3 and 4 together. It feels counter-intuitive to build additional space at Ysgol Llanbedrog, as was proposed by a member of the Education Department in an informal meeting, when there is a fit for

purpose school at Abersoch with capacity. Welsh Government policy of parental choice, and Gwynedd Council's failure to adhere to its own policies has led to the situation of one school being over capacity, yet another struggling to stay open and indicates that the criteria for Catchment Area Review have been met.

Communities across Gwynedd are struggling to deal with a range of challenges along a common theme. The Abersoch community is not alone in its efforts as we strive to save our schools, libraries, places of worship and other public facilities. The present situation with regards to housing and employment has had a detrimental effect nowhere more obvious than in Abersoch. Gwynedd Council's recently announced 'Housing Action Plan' to support affordable housing serves to highlight the importance of a cohesive framework towards a sustainable future. This combined with recently announced development plans which will result in 150 jobs in the village, demonstrates that Abersoch is well-placed to lead the way. We believe this can start with Gwynedd Council taking an innovative approach to schooling.

We propose that Ysgol Abersoch is ideally placed to provide a successful alternative model, by strengthening foundations through the inclusion of Cylch Ti a Fi, Cylch Meithrin and leading on the innovative Beach School concept, which could involve being part of a federalisation or multi-site school. A commitment to keeping Ysgol Abersoch open in the center of Abersoch, supported by a dynamic housing and employment strategy, presents a unique opportunity to herald a social, educational, and economic success story for the Council. This can only serve to benefit the entire community and serve as a flagship to strengthen and sustain the Welsh language and culture in this highly visible area of Gwynedd.

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Well-being and attitude to learning

The nature of this statement inappropriately biases against Ysgol Abersoch. The layout of the report changed between the two inspections in 2017, with Ysgol Abersoch reporting only "wellbeing" and Ysgol Sarn Bach being assessed on "wellbeing and attitudes to learning". The text for both schools is very similar. The difference may possibly be down to attendance rates; by nature, a small school is more sensitive to attendance rates where every child counts. Attendance rates in recent years are consistently high, even more so impressive given the school is in a seasonal location where parents are required to work during school holidays (2018-2019 = 96.3%, 2017-2018 = 94.2%).

"Ysgol Abersoch: " Nearly all pupils feel safe and happy at school and know who to approach if anything is worrying them. They treat each other with care and respect and offer support to their fellow pupils spontaneously in lessons or in more informal situations. In general, most pupils are enthusiastic and show an interest in their work and stay on task for specific periods. By being aware of their targets, many know how well they are achieving and what they need to do to improve.

"In general, nearly all pupils are aware of the importance of eating and drinking healthily and staying healthy. They participate enthusiastically in physical activities within the curriculum and through extra-curricular activities. Pupils play an important part in school life, and many enjoy shouldering responsibilities, for example when telephoning a nearby school to order lunch each day. The school council, the 'Sgwad Syniadau' (Ideas Squad), is beginning to develop an awareness of its responsibilities. It has begun to take action in the school and organises fundraising activities for those in need. Members understand their responsibility to support others when raising money for charities, such as the Mike Peters Walk and Children in Need. As a result, pupils develop a good sense of social responsibility. Over the last four years, attendance levels have placed the school in the bottom 25% in comparison with similar schools. "The school's oldest pupils are very caring towards the youngest pupils; for example, the 'faithful friends' (ffrindiau ffyddlon) ensure that the youngest pupils are safe and happy on the swimming bus. Most pupils are confident that the school responds promptly to any concerns they may have and deal well with any cases of bullying. Pupils take regular advantage of valuable opportunities to express an opinion on what they learn by choosing the term's theme. Report on Class Sizes, Capacity & Population Forecasts by Cyfeillion Ysgol Abersoch, February 2021

1. Class Sizes are typically above 20

Gwynedd Council is committed to a strategy of Excellent Primary Education for Children in Gwynedd.

In this strategy class sizes are identified as an important factor so that children acquire the best possible experience and opportunities. All of four schools in the area (Ysgol Abersoch, Ysgol Sarn Bach, Ysgol Llanbedrog and Ysgol Foel Gron) have mixed age classes as the norm. Gwynedd Council has a stated objective to ensure that there is on average no more than 20 pupils or fewer than 12 pupils in any mixed age class.

The analysis below shows that in the four schools, the class sizes for 2020-21 are above 20 in 6 classes out of 9.

In addition, over 80% of pupils are being educated in oversized mixed classes.

Conclusion: Class size needs to be carefully considered in the decision-making so that Gwynedd Council can achieve its strategy from this current situation.


2. Pupil Population Forecasts

Pupil population forecasts are important in understanding whether there is sufficient capacity at the four schools to offer mixed class sizes of between 12 and 20 now and in the future.

Gwynedd Council Education Department has prepared a 5-year projection of pupil numbers in the region. This is shown below alongside the Auditor General Gwynedd Council projected population estimate in children¹ and the Welsh Government² estimate of population changes of those aged 0 to 9 years in Wales (Figure 1)

The Gwynedd Council Audit Summary 2020 issued 12 February 2021 states “Gwynedd’s population is projected to increase by 5.3% between 2020 and 2040 from 124,670 to 131,314, including a 0.4% increase in the number of children, a 0.9% increase in the number of the working-age population and a 20.8% increase in the number of people aged 65 and over.”

Conclusion: Gwynedd Council Education Department forecast shows a significantly different trend to that of the wider Welsh population and the Auditor General. As a result, careful attention needs to be given to a realistic range of scenarios when considering the provision of primary education in the area.

3. Observations on current pupil numbers

The table below summarises the current class sizes for all four schools. It can be observed that there are a number of 'big years', however the typical range of annual pupil numbers per year group ranges from 18 to 33, with an overall average of 25 pupils per year group and a most common number of 22.

Conclusions: Currently 80% of the children in the area are being educated in oversized mixed age classes.

4. Pupil population scenarios

Gwynedd Council Education Department has used a lower end of the range of 18 pupils in each year group across the four schools in total to forecast future pupil numbers. This estimate is out of step with forecasted population trends in Wales and the Auditor General projection for Gwynedd.

To assist with decision making it is reasonable to consider three scenarios of future pupil numbers and how this might impact mixed class capacity if Ysgol Abersoch remains open or closes and the pupils go to Ysgol Sarn Bach. The detail of these scenarios can be found in Appendix A.

- **High case of 25 pupils per year group per year/ 200 pupils in total** in line with the average of recent years and the opinion of the Auditor General.
- **Mid case of 22 pupils per year group per year/ 176 pupils in total** in line with the most frequent number of pupils in recent years.
- **Low case of 18 pupils per year group per year / 144 pupils in total** which approximates Gwynedd Council's 2025 forecast.

Conclusions:

Review of the three scenarios shows that:

- Relatively small changes in annual pupil numbers can have a significant impact on mixed class size in the four schools under consideration.
- If the Low case is realised and if Ysgol Abersoch is closed, the remaining three schools will operate at close to full capacity, providing little scope for normal fluctuations in annual school numbers or provide a pathway for economic development in the area.
- In both the Mid and High scenarios, an increasing number of pupils will be educated in mixed classes greater than 20.
- In the High scenario, which reflects the Auditor General projections, 100% of children are educated in oversized mixed-age classes, with as many as 26 per mixed-age class. The closure of Ysgol Abersoch results in Gwynedd Council not meeting its objectives and compromises education provision to the pupils.
- On average, it must be considered that the closure of Ysgol Abersoch will mean that all schools pupils in the three remaining schools will be educated in oversized mixed classes to their educational detriment and against Gwynedd Council's stated strategy of educational excellence in primary schools.
- In addition, the closure of Ysgol Abersoch will be to the detriment of the Abersoch community and the lack of capacity in the remaining schools will result in pupils not being able to choose their local school from an early primary age.

- 1. High case of 25 pupils per year group per year/ 200 pupils in total in line with the average of recent years and the Auditor General estimate.**

Re: Proposed Closure of Ysgol Abersoch

Dear Gwynedd Council

It is with a heavy heart that I write to you to express my objections and disappointment that you are considering the closure of Ysgol Abersoch. I am a past pupil and have two children, one who attended the school from 2015 to 2019 and the other who currently attends the school.

Ysgol Abersoch holds a special place in my heart and in my mind as it provided me with an excellent start to my educational career, and I don't think I have ever felt so comfortable and included in an educational facility since. The same can be said for my Children, they have both loved and relished their time at this school and it has enabled them to have, in my opinion, the best start to their education outside of private education.

Due to several factors I moved away from my home of Abersoch after university, however it was always my heart's desire to move back to Abersoch or the immediate area as soon as possible and this desire was accelerated when we had children. Both myself and my partner wanted our children to be educated in Wales to enable them to be bi-lingual but more importantly to be educated at Ysgol Abersoch. It was a difficult journey, and I will not enter in to it here, the difficulties for Local People to be able to purchase or build a property, as they are well publicised, especially in a tourist orientated village like Abersoch. In a nutshell it involved us living in a Caravan for almost three years on the Section 106 building plot we purchased and I worked away in England coming home at weekends for the same period of time. It was a massive sacrifice only seeing my children on Weekends, especially during their formative years. However, it was a sacrifice we as parents deemed to be worthwhile so that our children could be educated in the Welsh Language in an idyllic location and at the inspirational and special Ysgol Abersoch.

I understand that a school should not be kept open due to sentimental reasons, or because I thought it was special place or because my children have attended this or because I am a past pupil. This is not about what has gone before, but rather what will happen in the future. I worry for the future of Abersoch and its local inhabitants, increasingly the village is becoming a place which is unfamiliar to me. We have seen token gesture attempts at affordable housing, some nearby being put on the market for upwards of £180,000, which is highly unaffordable for local people. We have seen a three-bedroom social house being let to a single person and not a family. We have seen nearby schools over-subscribed at the detriment of Ysgol Abersoch.

Ysgol Abersoch isn't just a school it is a bastion of the welsh language located in the heart of Abersoch and provides local inhabitants and visitors alike that the welsh language is alive and well. It is one of the only schools in the area which is located centrally and allows such easy interaction with the community, without the need for transport. In fact, the children and pupils have encouraged shops with a national presence such as White Stuff, Crew, Mountain Warehouse, Joules, to name but a few to increase their Welsh signage and advertising. The Welsh language is constantly being attacked by those who do not understand our culture, often citing what is the need for this archaic and unnecessary language expressing such ignorant opinions such as ' they can all speak English so what's the point. Recently high-profile public figures such as Max Hastings the writer and historian, mocked and criticised the welsh language, the Director of Iceland Foods found it necessary to publicly deride and put down the Welsh. Therefore, more than ever we should be maintaining our Welsh presence not trying to close down a facility like Ysgol Abersoch who champions and readily advocates the welsh language in a village which is close to losing its identity. If the school were to close then that identity would surely be lost and an educational facility par excellence would never be seen again.

It is readily known that since the pandemic people have been encouraged to work from home and with the onset of ever increasingly innovative IT solutions it is no longer necessary for people to be in the office 5 days a week. Nowhere more has this been realised than in rural communities such as ours. House sales have gone through the roof thus potentially bringing families and young couples in to the area. Where will their children be educated if Ysgol Abersoch should close - by your own evidence nearby schools are already over-subscribed and other schools could be oversubscribed if Ysgol Abersoch was to close. The problem can't be solved like it was in Criccieth where a new larger school was built. Families are scattered over larger geographical areas and therefore there would be transport issues especially for the younger children who cannot be taken to school unsupervised.

During one of the meetings held between Cyngor Gwynedd and Ysgol Abersoch Staff, Governors and Parents a question was asked 'what will happen when nearby schools become over-subscribed due to the closure of Ysgol Abersoch?' - a flippant comment was made by a member of Gwynedd Council; 'we'll just build an extension'. However, I question at what cost? In what location? At what timescales? Surely it is better to maintain a school that is already established and one who already provides excellent education. Whilst you discuss the possible location of this extension or new school, whilst you procure the land, whilst you employ the architects, whilst you develop the brief, whilst you seek planning permission, whilst you seek contractors, whilst the school or extension is being built, what happens to the education of the children? Whilst I am no expert (apart from being a Chartered Building Surveyor with several years' experience in planning and facilitating school refurbishments and extensions in Lancashire), but this process could take a in the region 18 months - 2 years if not longer should there be lack of suitable land, or planning issues for instance. What happens to our children whilst they sit in their over-subscribed schools during this period. They will not gain the benefit of this new extension or school, their time will have passed, their early education that will shape their future life affected for ever. In addition to this have you considered the environmental impact of building another school or extension not only due to increase road pollution, but also building materials and the additional infrastructure required?

It is with this in mind that I implore Gwynedd Council to think outside of the box and rather than do the easy thing or the expected thing, do the harder thing. Work with the school and promote their Beach School proposal, try and find alternate ways to promote the school and its excellent teaching staff and educational environment. Help the school promote the Welsh language and show ignorant people that the Welsh Language is not just a language that is spoken so that we can talk about others without being understood. Be an example to other counties that there are alternatives to closure, that by exploring alternatives, which have been proposed by the excellent Governing Body and Teaching Staff such as the beach school and Nursery programme. They have done the hard work for you, you just need to show some support. Please don't be known as the Council and Political Party that closes schools because you did not explore any other alternative, use this opportunity to be innovative and support your communities not put another nail in their coffin. Work together with the Housing Department, and forge new policies that will assist the growth of rural or seasonal communities and the Welsh Language. I will close this letter by quoting John F Kennedy, during a speech given about reaching the moon:

"We choose to go to the Moon," Kennedy said. "We choose to go to the Moon in this decade and do the other things, not because they are easy, but because they are hard, because that goal will serve to organize and measure the best of our energies and skills, because that challenge is one that we are willing to accept, one we are unwilling to postpone, and one which we intend to win"

Gwynedd Council has an opportunity here to show that they are a council who encourage diversity in education, and champion tailored learning based on the individual needs of a pupil and that closing a school is the last thing to do. Be a council that stands up to what is the expected outcome and help and assist Ysgol Abersoch with all the resources that are available to you to increase their pupil numbers and allow this school to continue its excellent education. Go on Gwynedd Council, do the 'Hard Thing'!!

Therefore, I do not agree to the proposed closure of Ysgol Abersoch, and I look forward to your responses to the many questions I have raised in my letter.

The proposed statutory consultation of Ysgol Abersoch

Anwyl Syr, Madam.

I am writing to express my concerns regarding this consultation, please note that I do not agree to the proposed closure of Ysgol Abersoch.

I am writing as a parent and as someone who has a keen interest in Education, I am very disappointed that Gwynedd Council have allowed this consultation to go ahead regardless of the current Covid Pandemic, whereby we are all trying to minimise contact as much as possible.

I have several questions that I hope you can answer as I myself cannot find any of the answers to these questions even after reading your report.

Why has Gwynedd Council not seriously considered allowing Ysgol Abersoch to host a year 4, putting them in line with other schools?

My child is currently [REDACTED] at Ysgol Abersoch and she has asked several times why she cannot stay until year four? I cannot answer this question and I can see absolutely no reason why this cannot be set in place. We as parents and Governors have also put forward and asked you this question. Whenever this has been put to you, your responses are always 'it will be detrimental to Ysgol Sarn Bach,' however at Ysgol Sarn Bach the years 3&4 are already taught together. It seemed to me when my son started in year 4 in Sarn Bach that he was going over old work he had previously done in year three at Ysgol Abersoch. The very detailed pupil report set out by Head Teacher Mrs Linda Jones would confirm this. Therefore I feel that the children of Ysgol Abersoch would benefit more, by going to Sarn Bach in Year 4. I also feel the children of Sarn Bach would benefit from this as well to avoid the strain of larger class sizes and the upheaval caused by children joining their teaching part way through the syllabus.

Would it be possible for Gwynedd Council to provide a detailed analysis of costs that you have mentioned briefly in your report. Everything else seems to have more emphasis and detail than this matter, please can you elaborate as I feel that you need to be more transparent on areas such as:

- Transport
- Staffing
- Redundancies
- Costs for the process of the consultation to date;
- First class stamps x 2 to all pupils of Sarn Bach, then the delivery of letters from Sarn Bach to yourselves?
- Mr Arwel Jones- interviewer
- Counseling for the children should they need it.
- Public Meetings that Gwynedd Council hosted
- Petrol and mileage expenses

- Translator for meetings
- Will the children be given a uniform Grant? (if they change schools, the uniforms bought will be redundant).

At this stage I feel that you need to elaborate more on the transport issues, I mentioned this to Gwern at the Zoom meeting on the 3rd February. In your report you have included a sum of £14,000 next to transport, I asked Gwern if this figure was realistic, I also asked if Gwynedd council had compiled a survey asking all parents of Ysgol Sarn Bach if they would be taking Gwynedd Council up on their free transport? Gwern said 'the school would need to do this in September', Is September not too late to be asking this question? Consequently I have taken it upon myself to ask some parents who currently drive their children to school as they cannot afford to pay for the bus. Of the parents that I have asked so far all said Yes they would then send them on the bus. Pre covid the bus to Sarn Bach was a public service bus, however, I feel this to be inappropriate and have concerns with young children getting on to a bus with members of the public.

I think the cost of the transport needs to be looked into further as I think the figure of £14,000 is unrealistic and would welcome to see the evidence of how you have reached this sum. Also if the projection figures are inaccurate or perhaps pupil numbers fluctuate, or if the bus is full, or for instance two more children join Ysgol Sarn Bach, will you provide another bus? These situations need to be accounted for and the public have a right to know the costs involved.

I also feel that a more detailed report on your staffing levels would be very welcomed, I was disappointed not to see such details in your report. I think this needs to be more transparent and is relevant with the costs of a school. A table showing pupil numbers in each school with information such as contact teaching hours for:

- Teaching Assistants working alongside Teachers,
- Teaching assistants teaching alone
- Fully qualified Teachers working alone

It would be fair to show how many days children are taught by teaching assistants as opposed to fully qualified teachers, this may influence a parents choice when choosing a school, however many parents who I have spoken to are unaware that their children are not always taught by a Fully Qualified Teacher. Transparency about this allows parents to make an informed choice.

With regards to the questionnaire that you issued to the pupils I feel that I need to address some of your statements and issues that myself and other parents have raised.

My daughter read your pamphlet before reading the questionnaire and she at 8 years old said that it was misleading, 'pupils will have the option to move to Sarn Bach'. The definition of the word 'option' is thus; 'it is a thing that is or may be chosen' my daughter said therefore she does not choose to leave Ysgol Abersoch.

Another quote is that 'there will be More Teachers at'- please check if that is factual as currently my daughter is taught by Fully Qualified Teachers, I do not believe this to be the case at Ysgol Sarn Bach therefore I would be grateful if you could elaborate further.

'Better use of resources e.g. IT', - Please could you also check if that is factual, every learner at Ysgol Abersoch has excellent IT and I myself have found it difficult to operate more than one device at any one time, however, if more is needed The Parents association provides this for the children at no cost to the council.

'An Opportunity to meet and play with friends'- Are you suggesting the children of Ysgol Abersoch do not have friends already? My children have friends all over Gwynedd, however, we chose Ysgol Abersoch for its educational merits, are you suggesting that making friends is more important? The majority of my children's friends attend Ysgol Llanbedrog therefore if I wanted them to choose friends over education I would have moved them to Ysgol Llanbedrog.

Can you explain to me why the Council believes it will strengthen future education for the area? What evidence do you have that will support this claim? I am also interested in what the Teaching Unions think about such statements, are you therefore suggesting that my child will get a better education taught by a Teaching Assistant as opposed to a Fully Qualified Teacher? I have no doubts about the Merits of Teaching Assistants, however it seems that you are undermining the importance of someone with a level 8 as opposed to a level 4 certificate.

My Son received a questionnaire sent through the post on February the 8th requiring it to be posted back by February the 12th asking him the same questions that you asked the children of Ysgol Abersoch. I cannot see the relevance of this questionnaire, the questions were not very clear, on Q4, which school are you referring to? Was this a one size fits all questionnaire not really tailored towards the individuals? I also found it very strange that the questionnaires were sent back to Ysgol Sarn Bach and not directly to yourselves. My son said that he did not feel he could be open to expressing his thoughts and feelings in case his Head teacher recognised his handwriting, I also believe this to be the case of other children as well. Can you please tell me why the letters were not sent back directly to Gwynedd Council? Can you also tell me how many responses have you received from Ysgol Sarn Bach? The reason I ask this is because I know of some families who did not get a questionnaire, therefore was this a pointless exercise and not a true representation of figures?

With regards to Educational benefits, the children of Ysgol Abersoch won £1,000 in a competition hosted by Llaeth y Llan, only 8 children in Ysgol Abersoch put their creative minds together with their inspirational Teachers and they won. The teachers encourage learners to adapt using natural resources and encourage development through learning, encompassing all children reach their potential and all the differentiation and individual learning styles are met. The children were happy just to take part in this challenge however they worked collaboratively and won, thus reinforcing my opinion that a small school can provide excellent education and inspire confidence. The majority of the schools in Gwynedd took part in this competition, often whole schools entering, my son said at Ysgol Sarn Bach years 4,5, and 6 entered, however Ysgol Abersoch won. This school needs to be celebrated

and held up as a beacon of hope. The resilience of the staff and the children has been fantastic, even when faced with losing their beloved Head Teacher, the excellent teachers made it look effortless. Other schools under the threat of closure lost pupils at this stage, however despite this, Ysgol Abersoch gained 5 new children, as parents who viewed the school saw something different and an inspirational teaching environment.


The innovative proposal of a Beach school should be championed by Gwynedd Council, especially in a time of uncertainty such as covid pandemics, parents will welcome the idea of outdoor teaching and learning. I have seen examples of this type of school all over the world and I was lucky enough to spend 8 years in the French Alps whereby I was able to watch a Forestry school flourish and go from strength to strength. By Ysgol Abersoch adapting to its surroundings this would surely qualify as a beacon of Educational Excellence, using this school as a pioneering model would surely set Gwynedd Council apart and help the Education department plough ahead into the future.

We as a family moved to Wales five years earlier than planned just to ensure that our children could attend Ysgol Abersoch, we lived in a static caravan whilst we built our home, and rented a house in Abersoch instead of remaining in our own Cottage in Lancashire. The sacrifices we made were worth it as the education my children received at Ysgol Abersoch was and still is excellent. I have a Teaching degree and it was important to me to get it right choosing the school that best fits my children's educational needs and one that offers a wide range of educational experiences. I particularly like the Montessori model developed by Italian Physician Maria Montessori 'emphasizing Independence' this is clear to see when the children take their weekly bus and travel to Swimming, they ask and pay the driver with their own money, every child can swim by the time they leave Ysgol Abersoch at 8 years old. The children independently telephone and order school meals, they also telephoned the R.S.P.C.A to report a hurt bird that was later caught and had to be put to sleep. The man was so impressed that these young children showed such maturity and compassion asking questions that showed intelligence and empathy. I feel that Gwynedd Council can boast hosting a school offering these exacting high standards.

We chose Ysgol Abersoch because we felt it had a familial feel it had a lovely sense of belonging. My children were very anxious leaving friends and family to relocate to Wales. We felt it was very important to get this right, my daughter had terrible issues with separation anxiety this was due to some health issues and she was under the hospital at the time of starting Ysgol Abersoch. The Teachers nurtured her and gave her the confidence to become an independent thinker and learner. Both my children did not speak Welsh when we moved to wales and spoke in English with all of their friends from other schools. The children soon thrived and picked up the welsh language and alongside their teachers they encouraged me to take up Welsh classes in the village Hall.

Another example of excellence from Head teacher Linda Jones and the merits of having a school whereby children are dropped off and picked up by parents, who are then able to have face to face conversations. Mrs Jones asked me one evening if she could have five minutes of my time, she then explained to me that [redacted] was struggling with his reading and this was impacting on his other work, myself, [redacted] and Mrs Jones worked together to improve this situation, it came to light that he needed to read with an overlay and this vastly improved his reading. [redacted] is awaiting as is my daughter to have an Irlen syndrome test to

help rule out the possibility that they may both have this. Since the five minute talk with Mrs Jones [redacted] work excelled and then he took his final tests he had exceeded all our expectations. This is more than any ordinary school. This is somewhere that parents and children are able to approach the teachers and the door is always open, I have not found this at any other school.



During that meeting I was also surprised as its main content appeared to be about Federalisation. One of the schools suggested by the Council to federalise with; could be

Ysgol Lanbedrog. I asked Garem Jackson at that meeting about the pupil numbers and the current capacity at Ysgol Llanbedrog, however, Mr Jackson stated that he did not have those numbers to hand. I suggest Mr Jackson that you do not come to a meeting that you were hosting to discuss Federalisation options and not have these important details and figures to hand; it gives the illusion of a smoke screen.

My daughter has asked why you have allowed 20% over capacity to attend a school only 2 miles away, allowing children from the village of Abersoch to move from their catchment area to attend a school that is already over capacity, whilst you knew Ysgol Abersoch had surplus spaces. This seems to contravene your own policies, so please can you answer my 8 year old child and explain how this has happened?

At that meeting you said that you would look into the capacity of Ysgol Llanbedrog, however since that meeting the numbers grew larger, allowing one school to flourish whilst allowing another to drown seems unethical and more to the point it should not come as a surprise to the Council, the council was aware of this ongoing situation as we brought it to your attention. We looked to you for guidance and help to create solutions not simply appear to opt to close the doors on the school. Whilst at this meeting we also posed the question 'are all the children who are under eight and live in Abersoch but attend Ysgol Sarn Bach paying for their bus pass?' You said that you would look into this and get back to us on this point. I am still unaware of the answer, therefore, as your tables throughout your consultation process revert back to 2017, please can you provide me with the following information:

If all bus passes from 2017 until the present day have been paid in full for each pupil under 8years old using the bus service?

We also highlighted that if this was indeed the case that some children might not have paid for bus passes that should have and therefore we needed to be made aware of this with immediate effect as this facilitates children to bypass the catchment area policy and go against your own policies.

I would also like to draw your attention to a comment with regards that the closure of Ysgol Abersoch would have no detrimental effect on the Welsh Language in the community as taken from Section 7.9 of the consultation document "It is concluded...that no negative impact on the Welsh Language is anticipated, should the proposal be realised." Therefore does this contradict and suggest that your 'Welsh Language Charter' has no impact in a community? I do hope you are not merely suggesting that this decision was made purely on a tick box exercise, please could you provide evidence to support your claims in more detail.

Whilst discussing the Community throughout your proposals you focused on highlighting positive attributes towards Ysgol Sarn Bach therefore I would like to have more of Ysgol Abersoch represented in these findings to ensure that no biased has been used, allowing the public to base their decisions on accuracy rather than misrepresentation. You may have observed that Ysgol Abersoch and Ysgol Foel Gron were representing the local area on the Pwllheli Rotary Christmas show, the absence of Ysgol Sarn Bach and Ysgol Llanbedrog further cemented Ysgol Abersoch's continued support within the community. Ysgol Abersoch also accompanied The Rotary's christmas float around the Village of Abersoch again with the noticeable absence of Ysgol Sarn Bach. These are the things that I do not see in your

evidence to support that the children of Ysgol Abersoch will have a more enriched Education in other schools. My Children were very proud when The Reverend Andrew Jones closed the Pwllheli Rotary show with his story mentioning that a pupil from Ysgol Abersoch had made him look at things in a different way, the child had questioned and made The Reverend see things from an alternative viewpoint, he only mentioned Ysgol Abersoch in his closing speech, no other school was mentioned, my little girl said 'we have really made a difference, someone as important as Reverend Andrew talking about my school'.

I would also like to highlight the after school activities that have taken place that you failed to mention in your detailed report:

- 6 week Hitt class and sports, paid for by the Parents Association
- 6 week Rugby class, paid for by the parents Association
- 6 week Parents and child yoga class, paid for by the Parents Association
- 6 week Gardening Club- Paid for by the Parents Association
- 6 week yoga course during school hours Paid for by the Parents Association
- Alongside the other after school activities that take place throughout the year, the Parents Association had made enquiries about a 6 week Life-Guarding course, however this has been put on hold due to the current Covid 19 pandemic.

I would like to urge you to reconsider your position on a proposed statutory closure and to take onboard, we as parents, teachers and Governors eagerly listened and made remedies and tried to improve the current situation of low pupil numbers through no fault of the school. Thus highlighting our plight when we discovered that some schools have been enabled to thrive contravening your own policies regarding schools at over capacity whilst spaces are available and at the detriment to another school. This is a slight nod to double standards as when we as Parents, Teachers, Pupils and Governors ask why we cannot continue with an added year Four, your reply is "it would be at the detriment of Ysgol Sarn Bach". Therefore I question where is the detriment to Ysgol Abersoch considered and included within your findings? I also want it to be noted that we have repeatedly asked you to consider a Year 4, in the time we have waited for you to give us a direct answer other children have moved out of year 3 to start in year 4 at Ysgol Sarn Bach. Had the two children been allowed to stay that would have taken our numbers up to 12 children this year, would this have not taken us out of the dangerous position we find ourselves in whereby we have 10 children?

The School has set up a Cylch Meithrin and this has proven to be very successful in a very short period and even though the school is under threat of closure. The Cylch Meithrin has also has the added benefit of acting as a feeder for attending Ysgol Abersoch from reception year onwards, just as this would also benefit Ysgol Sarn Bach as the children tend to move onto this school at the end of Year 3. In the village we have approximately 12 children all under three who would benefit from using the Cylch and eventually the school. It is within walking distance of the village and perfectly located and convenient for those who work in the village of Abersoch.

I found it alarming in my Zoom meeting when I asked what provisions you had put in place regarding children aged 3 to 5 who would attend school for two hours? These children learn vital skills and promote learning through play using the Medium of Welsh (which for some is the first time they have heard or used the language), to be able to get to school, if their

parents have no means of transport. Gwern said that it is not a statutory requirement, just because that is the case does not make it acceptable. I see no mention of this in your report and I feel this needs to be made transparent, some families may lose this lifeline and I feel it is more important during this time of uncertainty for children to go to school, this may have a very negative impact on the mental health of the parents and children. Has the Council looked into this matter and addressed parents whose children should require the two hours of school and explained the issues surrounding this? Please can you provide further information and advice as to how you will achieve this?

There is no mention in your report of the 150 jobs which will be provided when a hotel will be built and opened in Abersoch, thus encouraging local families to stay in the area and creating an opportunity for new families to come to the area. Penrhos has also been earmarked for development thus creating houses for families, where will these children go to school? It has also been mentioned that some families are opting to move to the Village on a permanent basis as they have realised during the Covid pandemic they can successfully work from home. We need amenities to remain in place to accommodate the needs of the community, as we see too often villages losing chapels, banks, doctors surgeries and other facilities that communities hold dear ensuring places thrive throughout the year not just as a Holiday destination.

I also could not find anything in the report regarding the current Covid Pandemic, looking at things such as; pupil attendance throughout this period. I know of several children from other schools in the area who did not attend school, because parents were concerned with larger class sizes. Ysgol Abersoch benefitted from smaller class sizes as parents felt confident to send them to school as the R rate would be significantly lower. Do you have figures of absenteeism during September to December 2020? I also noted that Ysgol Llanbedrog had to have two pick up times for children as the public footpath where parents wait to greet their children was too congested, this is not mentioned anywhere either. However the benefit of Ysgol Abersoch includes its location next to a large Car Park enabling parents to collect children in a safe manner and I feel that this should also be noted when drawing up your assessment.

A true testament to the school is that the 6 pupils who have moved up to Ysgol Sarn Bach in the last two years would give anything to be back in Ysgol Abersoch. They are not saying they do not like Ysgol Sarn Bach, but what they are really saying is Ysgol Abersoch is the best school in the world to them. How many other children can say that about a school and also love the education, the trips, the teachers, the building itself, the place it holds within the community, the experience of forging relationships with the older generation..... The list is endless and I have not got a negative word to say about this school and the education it has provided to my children and others.

I look forward to hearing from you regarding the responses I have requested, please look at the positives for keeping this school open. I would hate to find ourselves in a similar situation to Tryweryn, whereby 40 years later an apology was issued. Let's continue working together providing and promoting Educational Excellence, whereby solutions are found to forge forward and form long lasting flexible relationships rather than detrimental irrevocable closures.

Cynigir profiadau unigryw i'r disgylion megis defnyddio'r bws cyhoeddus i fynd i nofio (deall arian a thalu am eu ticedi), chwaraeon ar lan y mor gan gerdded yno ac oddi yno (gan ddefnyddio Rheolau'r Groes Werdd), cael triplau i Ganolfan Addysg Awyr agored a chael gwneud pethau megis rhaffau uchel a lein- zip. (profiadau unigryw i blant mor ifanc a hyn).

Adnoddau technoleg gwych. Plant yn cael chromebook / Ipad bob un lle ddim yn gorfol rhannu fel mewn ysgolion mwy o ran nifer, felly'n cael sylw 1-1 o ran sgiliau technolegol hefyd.

Mae lleoliad yr ysgol yng nghanol y pentref ac mae o fewn cyrraedd i lefydd ar droed. Gwneir llawer o waith gyda busnesau lleol drwy gydo! y flwyddyn, ac mae'r busnesau yn dda iawn am gefnogi'r ysgol erioed. Mae un siop wedi newid arwydd eu siop i fod yn ddwy - ieithog yn sgil y plant yn ymweld a nhw ac rydym wedi cynnal cystadlaethau cymunedol megis cystadlaethau addurno ffenestri siopau(Nadolig a Gwyl Dewi). Byddai'n braff cael Blwyddyn ychwanegol yn yr ysgol hon (1 fyny i Bl 4 yn lle 3) fel nad yw'r plant yn symud i fyny i ysgol newydd i ganol dosbarth dieithr megis ysgolion gyda Bl.3 a 4 yn un dosbarth. Deall fod 3, 4,5 a 6 gyda'u gilydd mewn rhai ysgolion- disgylion ddim yn cael yr un sylw wedyn yn sicr.

I thought the council was supposed to support and work for and on behalf of the community it represents, if Ysgol Abersoch was to be closed, how would this benefit the people of the village, the Welsh language and the Welsh culture? The school has always been at the heart of the local community, interacting throughout the year, acknowledging and celebrating many different occasions with all the varying age groups, young and old alike. The fifty plus pension group particularly enjoy the engagements with the children. The Christmas concert in the village Hall is always well attended with a reasonable percentage of the audience having no direct

relationship to the pupils and they are there to enjoy the performance.

To encourage young families to live in the village, the school is a vital facility and asset, not having one will erode the foundations for the future survival of a Welsh speaking community.

I would like to know if the council have considered the feelings, thoughts and opinions of the families who were responsible for providing the land and school for the children of Abersoch, have their descendants, still with connections in the village been told of the proposals? The history of how this school was established makes it even more deserved of an extra special effort in keeping it open for future generations to benefit from.

We are writing, as local residents who also work in the village, in support of the campaign to maintain Ysgol Abersoch for the benefit of Abersoch village and its immediate surroundings.

Abersoch is a unique village. It is immensely popular with visitors and tourists which, whilst bringing lots of benefits to the area, also brings unique pressures to the fabric of the village and the sustainability of the community.

With exceptionally high house prices and an almost entirely seasonal economy, that sustainability is exceedingly fragile. The village is in need of a Strategic Plan to secure its future but in the meantime it is vital that the school in the heart of the village is retained if the village is to retain its character as a true community with a village life that has a realistic future.

At present the school provides an opportunity for local families to see their children schooled in the village where they grew up, cementing local bonds with their class-mates and helping to define the future character of the village as a place where local families grow and develop, and have a chance to contribute to village life and the local community and economy, rather than simply a seasonal place with no roots and no sustainable fabric.

I know from my role as Executive Editor as Abersoch Life magazine just how important the school is to the future, as well as the history, of the village and the local community. It's also clear how the unique opportunities the location of the school present are able to further add to the sustainability of the village, as the pupils are able to immerse themselves in the environmental issues that affect the village as well as enjoy the unique outdoor learning opportunities the adjacent beach and harbour offer. It is also clear how very important the existence of the school is to the seasonal economy. I'm able to see from my role that, whilst tourists and visitors may not be here all year, they truly appreciate the community nature of Abersoch that contributes to its value as a destination. Despite the pressures on the village it is still a 'real' place, so just as the local community are passionate about the importance of it staying that way, visitors equally want to know that the place they love to visit has a future as a sustainable community, a true village with its fabric intact. The role of the school in that future and fabric cannot be over-stated.

Sally is a former Early Years teacher of over 40 years experience and equally from her perspective in many different schools and roles in many different locations, from urban to rural, understands just how crucial a role a local school plays in the life and sustainability of that community. Family members follow family members to the same school, generations follow generations. There is a timeless link created in that way which, once broken, can never be rebuilt.

It is for others to determine the precise future role of the school, but it is our belief that the village would be best served if the school functioned by strengthening its Nursery provision for all local families in order to secure a future flow of pupils into the Reception class and above, and retaining provision up to Year 3. This strengthened Nursery provision is crucial - it provides continuity of education for parents and children at

the most important early years of their school life. The added benefit of this is that by starting more local children in their local nursery, the school can help to secure its sustainable future and thus the sustainability of the village.

My experience:

I chose Ysgol Abersoch, bypassing other schools, for numerous reasons, including the outstanding teaching and unique learning approaches, small class numbers, the connections it has with local businesses, as well as the opportunities it provides for my English speaking child, to learn Welsh & integrate with the local community and pave his future here in the Pen Llyn.

I genuinely believe he would not have been fluent in Welsh by 5 years old, had he attended Lanbedrog or Cymerau, amongst other schools with high class numbers in the area.

The Community:

As a local business manager, I understand the fine balance of costs. However, I feel passionate about the importance of creating a Community that continues to sustain itself throughout the year, not just six weeks of summer.

Closing the school will discourage the growing number of local people who are either already present or choosing to return to Abersoch and the surrounding area in order to build businesses, careers & families in our successful Village.

I rely on employing local, Welsh speakers for staffing purposes as well relying on locals to support my businesses in Winter. Therefore, the closure of the school could impact on this & the ability to stay open throughout the year.

I believe there are schemes in place to create new local housing and feel it would be very short sited to close the school now - especially following Covid.

The Future:

How refreshing it would be, for a council to think out of the box and see the potential this small school has for both the local and wider community in the years to come.

Having a school in the village not only entices families to buy into the area, especially following the Covid pandemic and the interest that has created in moving to areas such as Abersoch, but it could also pave the way for new innovative techniques of teaching - such as becoming a beach school - which other councils may wish to use as a template in the future.

I am writing to ask the Authority to reconsider the closure of the school in Abersoch, which is a vital hub for the Community and its children.

Having helped develop 'Forest schools' in Leicestershire and in partnership with the Scouts run a scouting group in a school for children with severe learning difficulties, I have seen the benefit first hand of outdoor schooling. I have wondered many times, since we moved to the LLyn, why there are no equivalent 'beach schools' to reflect the nature of the landscape in this County.

Children growing up in the area need to learn about their local nature and environment and hopefully go on to consider both working in the area, whether that be in tourism, or as part of local business's/conservation etc and. broad breath knowledge of all the things that make an area like Abersoch tick would be invaluable to that.

I do hope the Council can consider a proposal to breathe life into such a proposal for the future of the school and maybe for a change of emphasis across more schools in future years.

4. TREFNIADAU PRESENNOL YN ARDAL ABER-SOCH

- Ymatebodd cymuned/llywodraethwyr yr ysgol i'r niferoedd isel drwy sefydlu Ti a Fi a Chylch Meithrin yn yr ysgol, gan y profodd sefydlu rhai mewn pentrefi eraill lwyddiant trwy ddenu'n naturiol ddisgyblion newydd i'r ysgol leol.

- Mae cymharu nifer y siaradwyr Cymraeg (Cyfrifiad 2011) yn sicr o fod yn wahanol oherwydd prinder tai fforddiadwy i deuluoedd yn Aber-soch a daw mwyafrif plant Ysgol Sarn Bach o deuluoedd amaethyddol cynhenid.
- Pam na nodwyd canran siaradwyr Cymraeg Ysgol Aber-soch (PLASC 2020) fel tair ysgol arall y dalgylch?
- Ni leolir Ysgol Sarn Bach yng nghanol y pentref – mae ar ei gyrrion.
- Nid oes yr un plentyn yn byw ym mhentref Sarn Bach ei hun. Mae nifer o ddisgyblion Ysgol Sarn Bach yn all-ddalgylch hefyd, heb gynnwys y rhai a drosglwyddodd yn wyth oed o Ysgol Aber-soch.
- Pam na soniwyd am nifer y plant all-ddalgylch sydd yn Ysgol Llanbedrog? Aiff nifer ohonynt yno o Aber-soch.
- Yn yr un modd, pam na nodwyd canrannau siaradwyr Cymraeg (Cyfrifiad 2011) Ysgolion Llanbedrog a Foel Gron?

5. ACHOS DROS NEWID

Wynebodd Ysgol Aber-soch heriau tu hwnt i'w rheolaeth yn ystod y ddwy flynedd ddiwethaf, yn arbennig o golli disgyblion heb unrhyw fai arni hi ac, yn anffodus, brofedigaethau'r Pennaeth.

- Ysgol o fynd a dod erioed o ran niferoedd yw Ysgol Aber-soch, hyd yn oed pan fynychais i hi. Yn naturiol llai o deuluoedd rŵan oherwydd tai haf, diffyg tai fforddiadwy.
- A gyfrifwyd niferoedd mynychwyr Ti a Fi a'r Cylch Meithrin yn y rhagamcanion?
- Er yn cydnabod bod canran uchel o blant y pentref yn mynychu ysgolion all-ddalgylch, anghytunir â'r farn "*nad yw'r ddarpariaeth bresennol yn opsiwn hyfyw ar gyfer y dyfodol*" – pam na roddir cyfle i'r mentrau o sefydlu Ti a Fi a'r Cylch Meithrin gyfle i wreiddio a ffynnu? Hefyd, effeithiwyd ar hynny gan y pandemig.
- Anghytunir â'r sylw "*yr effeithia'r dosbarthiadau bychain iawn a niferoedd isel ar brofiadau'r plant o gymdeithasu a chydweithio'n ddyddiol â chyfoedion*" – maent yn aelodau o wahanol glybiau megis Clwb Syrffio Llŷn a phêl-droed/rygbi un ai yma yn Aber-soch neu ym Mhwllheli a chynhelir gwersi/gweithgareddau nofio/hwylio ar ôl ysgol fel disgyblion ysgolion eraill.
- Nodir bod y rhagamcanion yn parhau'n isel dros y pum mlynedd nesaf. Dywed Noda Comisiynydd Cenedlaethau'r Dyfodol y dylid edrych 25 – 50 mlynedd i'r dyfodol ac, o astudio'r dangosyddion, dylai Aber-soch ffynnu yn ystod y cyfnod yma.

6. GWERTHUSO OPSIYNAU

- Teimlir nad ystyriwyd y rhain yn ddigon manwl, yn arbennig o ran y bygythiadau i'r gymuned a'r Gymraeg.
- Eto, ni chafodd lleoli Ti a Fi a'r Cylch Meithrin yn yr ysgol gyfle i wreiddio na ffynnu oherwydd sefyllfa'r pandemig yn ystod y flwyddyn ddiwethaf a dylai gael effaith gadarnhaol yn lleol. Er mai ond am gyfnod byr y bu ar agor oherwydd y cyfnod clo, enwebwyd y Cylch am Wobr Dewin a Doti yng Ngwobrau Blynnyddol y Mudiad Meithrin a dyfarnwyd y drydedd wobr iddo.

- Ni fuasai'r tro cyntaf i blant Ysgol Aber-soch drosglwyddo i Sarn Bach yn naw oed wrth newid yr ystod oedran o 3 – 8 i 3 – 9 oed, gan y gwneid hynny hyd at ddechrau/canol y pumdegau. (Ar nodyn personol – deg oed oedd fy Nhad [94 oed] pan drosglwyddodd o i Ysgol Sarn Bach.) Ni fuasai'n amharu ar niferoedd Sarn Bach dim ond oedi'r trosglwyddo.
- **Pam cadw at y status quo?** Buasai'n gyfle i Gyngor Gwynedd allu bod yn wahanol ac arloesol wrth nodi, "*Ni fyddai'r ystod oed yn gyson â mwyafrif ysgolion cynradd y sir. Byddai'r opsiwn hefyd yn cysoni'r ystod oed â gweddill ysgolion cynradd y sir ac yn golygu bod yr ysgol yn cynnig darpariaeth CA2 cyflawn*".
- Anghytunir â'r awgrym "...y byddai unrhyw gynnydd yn y niferoedd yn Ysgol Aber-soch o ganlyniad i ymestyn yr ystod oed, yn arwain at leihad yn niferoedd Ysgol Sarn Bach ac, o bosib, yn yr ysgolion cyfagos"; credir mai oedi'r trosglwyddiad a fyddai.

ni amharodd llefydd gweigion ar addysg neb hyd yma. Teimlir y poenir mwy am y rheiny nag am y plant eu hunain. Gadawa pob plentyn Ysgol Aber-soch yn gwybod sut i ddarllen ac ysgrifennu, canu, cymdeithasu ac, yn sicr, siarad Cymraeg yn rhugl. Gellir dweud, hyd yn oed, y gadawant yr ysgol ag acen Pen Llŷn. Teimlir, hefyd, nad ystyri'r cyfraniad ysgol at iaith yr ardal wrth ystyried ei dyfodol. Mae ysgolion bychain yn fwy llwyddiannus o safbwyt y Gymraeg, gan y trochir y disgyblion yn ddi'n ddyddiol.
- c) **addysgu'r plant mewn dosbarthiadau o faint mwy addas**
nodir fod cyfartaledd maint dosbarthiadau Ysgol Sarn Bach ym mis Medi 2020 yn 24. Os felly, fe'u cynyddir â disgyblion Ysgol Aber-soch ac, o ganlyniad, buasai hyn yn groes i'r hyn a nodir ym mhwynt 4.1.3 Addysg Gynradd o'r Ansawdd Gorau i Blant Gwynedd pan nodir, "*Anelu at sicrhau nad oes gan unrhyw ddosbarth oed cymysg mwy nag 20 disgybl na llai na 12 disgybl*".

Gall presenoldeb plant o wahanol oedrannau yn yr un dosbarth fod yn adlewyrchiad cywirach o fywyd y gymdeithas a'r cartref na'r grwpiau mawr a geir mewn ysgolion mwy. Yn ogystal, gall fod o fantais addysgol iddynt gael eu haddysgu ochr yn ochr.

- e) (d i fod o ddefnyddio'r Wyddor Gymraeg)
Sicrhau bod plant yn trosglwyddo unwaith yn ystod eu haddysg gynradd ac uwchradd yn hytrach na dwywaith
bu trosglwyddo o Aber-soch i Sarn Bach o fantais i'r disgylion ar hyd y blynnyddoedd, gan ei fod yn eu paratoi at newid ysgol o'r cynradd i'r uwchradd.
- Teimlir y dirmygir yr addysg a geir yn Ysgol Aber-soch yn 'Llesiant ac Agweddau Dysgu' Tabl Pum Maes Arolygu Estyn wrth ddweud "...deuir i'r casgliad y byddai addysgu'r plant yn YSB yn cael effaith bositif". Pwysleisir y gall plant Aber-soch "addysgu'n annibynnol" hefyd.
- Nid oes sôn am Bennaeth na Llywodraethwyr Aber-soch dan Reolaeth ac Arweinyddiaeth; ac mae Pennaeth Mewn Gofal yn bresennol oherwydd sefyllfa anghyffredin oherwydd rhesymau trist.
- Dim ond swm pitw iawn yw'r arbediad ariannol.
- Syndod yw darllen y cwbllaodd y Cyngor asesiad o **effaith cymunedol** ar yr opsiynau – sut a holi pwy? Nodir o gau Ysgol Aber-soch y bydd rhai elfennau o ddigwyddiadau cymunedol yn cael eu heffeithio. Noda casgliad yr asesiad na ragwelir y byddai unrhyw un o'r opsiynau yn cael effaith **negyddol sylwedol** ar y gymuned.
- Mae'r ysgol yn greiddiol i fywyd cymdeithasol Aber-soch a defnyddir y neuadd – a roddwyd at ddefnydd y pentrefwyr i gymdeithasu a chynnal gweithgareddau. Gwahoddir y disgylion i ddiddanu gwahanol grwpiau'n rheolaidd – ni ellid gwneud hynny o Ysgol Sarn Bach oherwydd yr angen i gludo a chostau llogi bws. Erbyn hyn, mae'n rhaid i Ysgol Sarn Bach ddod i gynnal ei chyngherddau yn y neuadd hefyd oherwydd nad yw ei ystafell fwyta/neuadd yn ddigon mawr. O ganlyniad, buasa'r cynnydd o blant Ysgol Aber-soch yn ychwanegu at y diffyg lle.
- Tablau'n anghywir o ran defnydd cymunedol.
- Adrannau nid Aelwydydd yr Urdd. Nid oes Adran yn Ysgol Sarn Bach – hyfforddir y disgylion ar gyfer yr Eisteddfod yno ond, yng Nghanolfan Gymdeithasol Llanengan gyda'r nos y cynhelir Adran yr Urdd Llanengan. Cynhelir Adran Tudwal yn syth ar ôl yr ysgol yn Aber-soch ac fe'i mynchyir gan gyn-ddisgyblion yn ogystal. [Er gwybodaeth – ffurfiwyd Adran ac Aelwyd yr Urdd yn Abersoch yn wreiddiol yn y 1920'au, yn fuan ar ôl sefydlu'r Urdd ei hun yn 1922.]
- **Gweithgareddau/Grwpiau** – anghywir o ran Ysgol Sarn Bach. Ni chynhaliwyd Cylch Meithrin yn yr ysgol – yng Nghanolfan Gymdeithasol Llanengan y gwnaed hynny a daeth i ben yn 2019 oherwydd na ellid ffurfio pwylgor.
- Anogir "cydweithio cymunedol rhwng yr ysgol amgen a chymuned Abersoch lle bo'n briodol". Sut? Nid oes dim yn gyffredin, dim cysylltiad yn sicr o ran yr ochr fusnesion. Byddai'r pentref yn collî'r gweithgareddau sydd yn gwneud cyfraniad mor sylwedol at gadw'r Gymraeg ym mhentref Aber-soch. O gau'r ysgol, dieithrir y plant o'u pentref, Seisnigir y gymuned a byddid yn gyfrifol am

atgyfnerthu'r darlun stereoteipio parhaus a wna ddrwg i'r pentref fel rifieria y di-gymraeg.

- Miliwn o Siaradwyr Cymraeg 2050 – buasai ei chadw ar agar yn hwb sylweddol at hynny trwy godi ymwybyddiaeth mewnfudwyr ac ymwelwyr o fodolaeth yr iaith.
- **Y gymuned sy'n colli allan** – “*Deuir i gasgliad yn yr asesiad hwn na ragwelir effaith negyddol ar yr iaith Gymraeg pe byddai'r cynnig yn cael ei weithredu*”.
- Pryder beth sydd am ddigwydd gan mai rhodd i'r gymuned oedd y tir a'r adeilad ac am y Cylch/Ti a Fi.
- Y Gymuned – colli presenoldeb ysgol ym mhentref Abersoch
- Ystyriaethau Eraill – buddiannau ac adnoddau'r ysgol. Cynnig profiadau i ddisgyblion gymdeithasu a chydweithio â chyfoedion; cael hynny rŵan trwy ac ar ôl yr ysgol pan ymgasbla'r plant a rhieni un ai yng nghae chwarae'r pentref neu ar y traeth, ynghyd â bod yn aelodau o glybiau eraill tu allan i'r ardal fel sawl disgybl ysgol arall ym Mhen Llŷn. Mae'n dalcen caled o ran yr iaith oherwydd diffyg tai fforddiadwy – fi yw'r unig un o'm cyd-ddisgyblion/cyfoedion sy'n byw yn y pentref – a diffyg cyflogaeth ar wahân i'r un dwristiaeth a thymhorol ydi hwnnw.

Addysg benigamp - nid arbed y geiniog yw popeth. Mae'n gyfle i Gyngor Gwynedd fynd tu hwnt i'r *status quo* a chefnogi syniad arloesol o Ysgol Draeth a rhoi cyfle i'r mentrau o westeio Ti a Fi a'r Cylch Meithrin gael eu gwireddu - anffodus o ran sefyllfa bersonol y Pennaeth a Chovid. Elwodd cenedlaethau o blant yr ysgol o droeon natur - gwyliau a dysgu enwau adar megis glas y dorlan yn nythu ar lan yr afon; teithiau i'r traeth i gasglu cregyn.

Amrywiol Ddyfyniadau i Gefnogi PEIDIO Â CHAU YSGOL ABER-SOCH

- Mae ysgol yng nghanol pentref a'i chymuned o fudd i'r disgyblion, yn arbennig pan fo pwyslais yn y Cwricwlwm newydd o ddysgu am yr amgylchedd, awyr agored.
- Mae ysgol fach i gyd yn ymwneud â'r synnwyd o berthyn. Yn naturiol, mae unrhyw un yn costio mwy i'w chynnal ond, edrychwn ar hyn fel iawndal.
- Gall cau ysgol effeithio ar y gymuned – nid yn unig nad yw'r Gymraeg yn iaith y plant ar y stryd ond, nid oes plant ar y stryd.

Mae pob ysgol fach yn ei chymuned ei hun yn endid unigryw – â'i gwerthoedd a'i dyheadau mae'n awyddus i'w gwarchod a'i datblygu i'r dyfodol.
- Ymysg y gwerthoedd yma mae'r rhai sy'n gysylltiedig â'r iaith Gymraeg a'i diwylliant – gwerthoedd sydd angen eu gwarchod yn ofalus.
- Ni all gwarchodaeth o'r fath ffynnu heb i'r ysgol leol fod yn siâp i'r cyfan.
- Os credwch mewn pentref fel uned bwysig, gwnewch bopeth i amddiffyn yr uned honno. Os caewch uned fel hon, rydach chi'n arbed arian, ydach, ond rydych chi'n colli deinameg y lle, colli'r bwrlwm, ymlyniad cryf sydd gan rieni at sefydliad. Collir un peth allweddol – cysylltiad â'r gymuned ac ymraddiad y gymuned honno i'r ysgol.
- Cymuned naturiol yn marw – colli etifeddiaeth a'r iaith a thro'i'r pentref yn ddim ond cyrchfan gwyliau'n llawn tai haf, dim teuluoedd.

Gall ysgol fach gael effaith bositif ar y gymuned ehangach o'i chwmpas.

A oes synnwyr cyffredin o gau ysgol sydd â llefydd gweigion tra, ar yr un pryd, llenwi un arall ychydig dan filltir a hanner i ffwrdd tra gallai ymbellhau cymdeithasol fod yn rhan o'n bywydau am beth amser eto er gwaethaf llwyddiant y brechu?

Gobeithir y bydd Cyngor Gwynedd yn ailfeddwl ac ystyried ei benderfyniad eto ac nad yw barn y cyhoedd yn mynd i darfu ar hynny ac na fydd yn rhan o'r ystadegau am ymgynghoriadau cyhoeddus o faint ohonynt sy'n diweddu â buddugoliaeth i'r cyhoedd? Hyderir yr ailystyria Aelodau'r Cabinet y chwalfa a wnânt o'r gymuned fel y gall 'Ysgol Bach' ddathlu ei chanmlwyddiant ymhen tair blynedd yn 2024.

Dyfynnaf o gerdyn dymuno'n dda i Ysgol Abersoch ar ddathlu ei phen-blwydd yn 90 oed yn 1914 oddi wrth gyn-ddisgybl (diweddar erbyn hyn yn anffodus) na allai fod yn bresennol yn y dathliadau,

"Wrth feddwl am fy nghyfnod fel disgybl yn yr ysgol, mae gennyf lawer o atgofion: dathlu'r Nadolig, tripp ysgol i fynwentydd Eifionydd!, Miss Thomas, y brifathrawes, a'r ffaith mai ond y fi oedd o gartref Cymraeg ei iaith yn fy mlwyddyn i hyd yn oed yn y '50'au!

Mi rôf 2024 yn fy nyddiadur a gobeithiaf y gallaf fod yn bresennol bryd hynny (i ddathlu canmlwyddiant yr ysgol)."

My name is Kate Ransom, and I have holidayed in Abersoch for over 60 years. I consider Abersoch to be my homebase in an ever changing world. Whilst (sadly) I don't live in the village, I appreciate the opportunity to add a few words to those of residents who are campaigning to keep the school open.

I have read with interest documentation on the proposed closure of the school in Abersoch.

My Maternal Grandfather, F C Minoprio, was one of the Liverpool businessmen who invested in Abersoch, and in this case the school, in its inception in its current building. I have been fortunate to be able to continue my connections with Abersoch being able to enjoy its magic, but with an understanding of the underlying complications associated with being an 'Holiday destination'.

My Paternal Grandfather, Sam Aston also maintained long term connections with Abersoch, eventually being able to spend his later years living there. Aged 70plus, he decided that to be better involved with life in Abersoch he would learn to speak Welsh, taking an 'O'Level' in the language.

Abersoch School offers so much to the local residents of Abersoch, with the educational needs of its young being wrapped up in village life, and the language centre being an established element of the Abersoch culture. Maintaining village life for locals who live in these challenging environments is a hard won balance, in this case made even more difficult this year by the closures and home schooling necessary as a result of the Covid Pandemic. Children have been so badly unsettled by the last months that anything we as adults can do to minimise further their disruption seems to me to be a giant win. Also, the possibilities for families to move out of towns to the villages, and still be able to work, with remote working being a positive in the pandemic, would appear to offer the potential of a further pool of prospective pupils to this highly successful village school.

I also live in a 'holiday hotspot', in the Cotswolds, and for us too the dynamics of rural life are on a knife edge, with second homes, holiday cottages, 'staff accommodation', etc undermining the fabric of village life. Those of us who have experienced small community benefits have a duty to try to protect that for future generations.







I am writing to you as I was a pupil at Ysgol Abersoch and you have not asked us our thoughts about our school time, it was a very important time for me.

I loved my old school, I liked the teachers so much they were very helpful all the time, they helped me to improve my thinking skills and to use my imagination in a creative way.

We went swimming once a week and this was ace, i learned how to swim because of the school, we do not swim very much at Ysgol Sarn Bach. Ysgol Abersoch was asked to compete in a competition and normally you had to be older but the swimming teacher at the baths said we were good enough to enter. A kind lady called Melissa sponsored our school by buying us matching hooded jumpers with the school logo on it.

I loved singing for the older people in the village, we have lots of friends in Abersoch and I liked seeing them smile when we sang, I think it brought them joy, they used to join in with us. Afterwards we was allowed a biscuit and a drink as they had a panad to celebrate the singing. We talked to them and it was nice to help them with their Welsh and it was good for me to speak to some of the older Welsh people in 'chi' instead of 'Ti'.

At Ysgol Abersoch there was no bullying, we were all friends, me and my four friends from the school are still best friends now. I have lots of friends at different schools but I wanted to go to Ysgol Abersoch. When I went there I did not know anyone but after a few days I became friends with everyone. My friends are the kindest people we all stick up for each other, we are like more than best friends we are a family. We saw each others mums and dads everyday outside the school gate. We were able to go to each others houses for a play date, our mums and dads would arrange it there and then. We can't do that at Sarn Bach as we don't see any parents and we all go on different buses. It has to be arranged beforehand and it is not spontaneous.

At Abersoch most nights even in the winter we would all take a snack, picnic or bbq to the beach and the playing fields, it was great fun, we played and we swam and other children would come and play with us, we would share our food.

The school day in Abersoch was always exciting, we did lots of hands on experiments and we learned from our own mistakes, I like that kind of learning, we would walk to the harbour and we could do experiments like dropping eggs with parachutes that we had made to learn about gravity. Ysgol Abersoch won £1000 prize from Llaeth Y Llan for a competition, they was the only school in our area to win. this shows how good the teachers and the school is.I had left and there was only about 8 kids and they won, look at what they achieved.

I loved doing sports on the beach, this was my favourite thing to do, we often did class work on the beach it was the best. I liked walking round the village it used to make me giggle because people did not know we spoke Welsh and when we went inside the shops to speak, people used to stare at us and say how good we were.

Ysgol Abersoch gave me confidence and they taught me to ask questions and think for myself. I did not speak Welsh when I started and after a few weeks I was very good, I even helped my mum with her Welsh homework from her class.

We sang in Spa Abersoch and it was nice to see so many people come just to see us sing, I love that my mum was able to come to lots of our school events and performances, she works in Abersoch and was able to come to everything as it was only a minutes walk away.

If you asked me to stay at Abersoch until Botwnnog I would say yes, I would like to go back to the school, I am very sad that I have left the school. I don't like going to school on a bus, sometimes older kids are mean to the little ones and I feel sad about this, I tell the teachers and the bus driver. Once the driver had to stop the bus and wait for the kids to calm down as it was too dangerous for him to drive because of the distraction.

I have written to ask Kirsty Williams 'Why cant [REDACTED] stay at Ygol Abersoch until Year four she said "I don't know why you [REDACTED] can't stay in the school until Year 4 but the local authority should be able to tell you" So I am asking you WHY CANT MY SISTER STAY AT THE SCHOOL FOR ONE MORE YEAR UNTIL YEAR 4?

You need to give this school a chance to succeed, all the good things the school does in the village, you can't give up on it.

I want you to know how much *me and my sister love Ysgol Abersoch, it is more than a school to us, it is like another home where we feel safe and happy. When I pass the school it makes me smile when I look at it. This Christmas it made everyone happy as its Christmas lights were so beautiful.*

Ysgol Abersoch's teachers are like Roahl Dahl they put themselves into the mind of a child, if we had to dress up in fancy dress then so did they.

Even though I am just [REDACTED] years old, I think it is wrong to try to close a school during a Covid pandemic my sister feels anxious already, maybe you should think more like Roah Dahl and ask what is best for the kids?

Please answer my question and take my thoughts into account, from little acorns grow mighty oaks.
